

The Kingdom of Heaven is like...

Matthew 13: 24-43



In today's Gospel Jesus teaches about the Kingdom of Heaven. He's showing to people what the Kingdom is about and how it may look. Many people talk about heaven today – they sometimes have different visions and concepts of eternal 'retirement'.

For Jesus Heavenly Kingdom is like a patient man who is sowing his seeds and not getting discouraged by the weeds; it's like a mustard seed that is quietly growing to give shade to the birds one day; it's like yeast that needs to be mixed until the batch of bread can be leavened.

God has time and He is teaching us how to take time. It's so easy to create a habit of rushing through things and moving faster and faster, but good things just require time and loving care. We must be open to change some of our habits and 'do things' a little slower and more carefully. Like today's patient sower, the mustard seed or the yeast. So many times we're having extremely high expectations and we're waiting for results immediately. God's logic is different – He likes to take his time.

May God let us learn how to be at peace, how to be patient and how to be thirsty for His Kingdom where He wants to spend eternity with us.

St. Paul by Pope Benedict XVI is about Saul of Tarsus who vigorously persecuted the Christians and even saw to the death of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. This book was written during the Pauline year dedicated to Saint Peters and Paul starting on their feast day of June 30, 2008 and ending on the same feast day in 2009. Pope St. Benedict XVI gives a total twenty Catechesis focusing on the Apostle Saint Paul. Here are just a few of his Catechesis: looking at the environment in which Paul lived and worked, his life before Damascus, his relationship with the historical Jesus, importance of pre-existence, the Incarnation, theology of the Cross, Resurrection, the expectation of the Parousia (the return of Jesus) and finally his death.

Pope Benedict XVI explores the legacy of Paul as he follows his missionary journeys, his relationship with the other apostles of Jesus and his martyrdom in Rome. Benedict also examines such questions as: What are we to make of Pauls' teaching about the end of the world?; What does Paul's teaching say about the difference between Catholic and Protestant Christians regarding salvation and the roles of faith and works in the Christian life?, and What does Paul have to say today about living a spiritual life? The Christian Paul, after the event that took place on the road to Damascus, owes its basic impact to faith in Jesus Christ and the figure of the Risen One. It changed his life, the church, and the world.

Paul never had the opportunity to meet Jesus during his public life. After being blinded, he consulted with Peter and stayed with him for fifteen days. For Paul, Jesus' words at the Last Supper are truly the center of the Church's life. The church is built on this center, becoming herself. In his letters to the Corinthians, Paul tells them, "For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures and that he appeared to Cephas and then to the Twelve." Paul also says the following in Corinthians, "For our sake He made Him to be sin, so that in Him we might become the righteous of God." "You know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that tho he was rich, yet for our sake he became poor, so that in his poverty you might become rich." Paul became the "Apostle to the Gentiles and the Teacher of Nations."

Pope Saint Benedict XVI, only one of the greatest spiritual teachers, could write such a highly readable book about St. Paul and his writings. I am sure you will enjoy it.
