

Dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel reminds us that a very important part of our life is forgiveness: we learn that we need to be forgiven and we need to forgive (ourselves or others). It is the only way to find healing, peace and joy. Forgiveness is always an act of love and kindness and opens us up for the future.

In our life, every day we make a lot of decisions and choices – smaller or bigger. So do others. Sometimes we make good ones and sometimes poor ones. We may feel hurt or rejected, guilty or ashamed. God is always willing to help us to find peace and healing, because we are always his children.

Peter asked today an honest question: *How many times do we need to forgive?* It is not an inappropriate question. Peter is trying to understand and he wants to know what to do and how far he needs to go. We can get tired or discouraged, can't we. We struggle at times in life with very strong emotions and feelings that are stealing our peace.

Forgiveness is a very intimate, very delicate and very personal moment. Our heart may be in pain, in darkness, in doubt. Usually, it is not easy for us. We need to find strength to be patient with ourselves and others, and forgive and move on.

In the Catholic Church, whenever we choose to go to sacramental confession, we can experience a personal encounter with Jesus Christ and receive his mercy and forgiveness. God is trying to make us whole again and restore our wounded life.

In the introduction to the book <u>7 Secrets of the Eucharist</u> by Vinny Flynn, Father Mitch Pacwa, S.J. says the following: "part of the genius of this book is its ability to summon all Catholics to this deeper relationship with Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We are drawn into a growing awareness and insight of the amazing discovery of Christ's hidden presence in the Eucharist. Flynn integrates St. Faustina's Diary into the theme of the Eucharist and her personal union with Jesus Christ. He applies the saint's insights to contemporary concerns for meeting the Lord Jesus who is veiled in the Eucharist. We all need books like this to help us grow spiritually, to remind us of what we are doing in the Mass, and to summon us to receive Jesus Christ in the Eucharist with fuller awareness & participation in the infinite mystery that remains always beyond the total grasp of our minds and hearts."

The number 7 is not a magic number for there are a number of truths of the Eucharist. These are just the basic ones that lead us to first explore beyond the veil. Flynn uses the word SECRET to imply for some reason that the heart of the church doesn't seem to have been passed on to the average lay person in a way that would enable us to really understand them and incorporate them into our daily lives.

Secret 1, The Eucharist is alive! Jesus tells St. Faustina in her Diary (1385), "When I come to a human heart in Holy Communion, my hands are full of all kinds of graces which I want to give to the soul, but souls do not even pay attention to me. They leave me to myself! and busy themselves with other things...They treat me as a dead object." The Eucharist is alive! When you and I approach the Eucharist, does it look like we believe we are about to take into our bodies the living person, Jesus Christ, true God and true man? As we wait in line to receive Jesus, do we think about how much we want to unite with Him, do we see His hands filled with graces that He want to give us, and are we filled with gratitude that He loves me so much that we actually want to come to Him in this intimate way? The Host we receive is not a thing, it is not a wafer, it is not bread, and it is not dead. It is a person, HE IS ALIVE! Saint Pope John Paul II says, "we need to cultivate a lively awareness of Christ's real presence and we should take care to show that awareness through tone of voice, gestures, posture, and bearing."

Secret 2, Christ is not alone! St. Faustina tells Jesus in her Diary (486), "Jesus...You come to me in Holy Communion, you together with the Father and the Holy Spirit have deigned to dwell in the little heaven of my heart..." In the CCC #650, "Jesus Christ is one divine person with two distinct natures – one totally human, one totally divine. These two natures are so inseparable that the divine person of Christ remained united to his soul and body, even when these were separated from each! by death" CCC #648, "...and when the Father raised Christ up, He perfectly introduced His son's humanity, including His body, into the Trinity." In the CCC #1377, "Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ." We don't have to receive Communion under both species. If we receive under EITHER form, we receive the whole Christ. Christ is never alone. When He becomes present in the Eucharist as He is in heaven, without leaving heaven, that means all of heaven is present with Him.

Dear Parishioners,

We want to give you an update on the status of our Adoration Chapel project and the other capital projects in our parish.

ADORATION CHAPEL

When the project was presented to the parish, the cost estimate was \$350,000. When the project went out for bids, the low bid was almost double that amount. This was primarily due to an inaccurate initial estimate and to significant construction cost increases over the last couple of years. The building committee and the construction companies have recommended some changes in the design of the chapel. They are in the process of getting updated bids on the revised project. To date the capital campaign has raised \$214,000 for the chapel. We will provide updated information on the revised cost and timing of the project when we have it.

POLLARD BUILDING

The parish has acquired the Pollard Building which is located between the school and the rectory. It was the only part of our two-block campus that the parish did not own. The building and lot were purchased for \$550,000. A parish family donated \$100,000 to be used for the purchase. The net cost to the parish was \$450,000. The parish attempted to acquire the property in the past but the asking price was always much higher. We are currently evaluating potential uses for the building and lot. We know this purchase has reduced our parish cash reserves significantly, but we thought it was in the parish's long-term interest to acquire the property.

SOCIAL CENTER RENOVATION

Our Social Center has been updated and renovated. We were in the process of updating the restrooms when we had vandals break in and damage the building. Using money we received from our insurance, and the \$150,000 that was donated by a couple of parish families, we were able to completely renovate the rest of the building. The entire Social Center has new flooring, ceilings, lighting, doors, front glass entrance and painting. Please check out the improvements when you get a chance.

Please, refer to the attached spreadsheet for a detailed list of all the major capital projects that our parish has accomplished in the last four years.

We are thankful for the donors involved in these projects and we are grateful for everyone that provides financial support for our parish. We want to acknowledge and thank our parish facilities manager, Mark Ince, and his assistant Raymundo Campos along with the many volunteers that have assisted in these projects.

Estimados Feligreses,

Queremos brindarles una actualización sobre el estado de nuestro proyecto de la Capilla de Adoración y los otros proyectos capitales en nuestra parroquia.

CAPILLA DE ADORACIÓN

Cuando el proyecto se presentó a la parroquia, el costo estimado era de \$350,000. Cuando el proyecto salió a licitación, la oferta más baja fue casi el doble de esa cantidad. Esto se debió principalmente a una estimación inicial inexacta y a importantes aumentos en los costos de construcción en los últimos años. El comité de construcción y las empresas constructoras han recomendado algunos cambios en el diseño de la capilla. Están en el proceso de recibir ofertas actualizadas sobre el proyecto revisado. Hasta la fecha, la campaña capital ha recaudado \$214,000 para la capilla. Proporcionaremos información actualizada sobre el costo revisado y el calendario del Proyecto cuando la tengamos.

EDIFICIO POLLARD

La parroquia ha adquirido el Edificio Pollard que está ubicado entre la escuela y la rectoría. Era la única parte de nuestro campus de dos cuadras

que no era propiedad de la parroquia. El edificio y el lote se compraron por \$550,000. Una familia parroquial donó \$100,000 para la compra. El costo neto para la parroquia fue de \$450,000. La parroquia intentó adquirir la propiedad en el pasado, pero el precio de venta siempre fue mucho más alto. Actualmente estamos evaluando usos potenciales para el edificio y el lote. Sabemos que esta compra ha reducido significativamente las reservas de efectivo de nuestra parroquia, pero pensamos que sería de interés a largo plazo para la parroquia adquirir la propiedad.

RENOVACIÓN DEL CENTRO SOCIAL

Nuestro Centro Social ha sido actualizado y renovado. Estábamos en el proceso de actualizar los baños cuando unos vándalos entraron y dañaron el edificio. Usando el dinero que recibimos de nuestro seguro y los \$150,000 que fueron donados por un par de familias parroquiales, pudimos renovar completamente el resto del edificio. Todo el Centro Social cuenta con pisos, techos, iluminación, puertas, entrada frontal de vidrio y pintura nuevos. Por favor compruebe las mejoras cuando tenga la oportunidad.

Estamos agradecidos por los donantes involucrados en estos proyectos y estamos agradecidos por todos los que brindan apoyo financiero a nuestra parroquia. Queremos reconocer y agradecer a nuestro administrador de instalaciones parroquial, Mark Ince, y su asistente Raymundo Campos junto con los muchos voluntarios que han ayudado en estos proyectos.
