

From Your Librarian

The modern pro-life movement started organizing in the mid-1960s in response to state-level efforts to liberalize abortions laws, primarily driven by Catholic groups, and then exploded into a national force after the January 22, 1973 Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision drawing evangelicals to form key organizations like the National Right to Life Committee. On June 24, 2022, the Roe v. Wade decision was overruled in the U.S. Supreme Court.

This week we will take a look at some Pro-Life Patron Saints.

Mary, the Mother of God is an ideal patroness of the pro-life movement. Her “fiat” (saying yes to God) at the Annunciation is the perfect example for mothers of unborn babies.

St. Gianna Molla was a wife, mother, and pediatrician. When she was pregnant with her fourth child, she discovered she had a fibroma on her uterus. While an abortion would have saved her, she refused the procedure. She died at the age of 39, a few days after a baby girl was born. This child later on became a geriatric doctor and now tours the world speaking about her mother’s legacy.

Our Lady of Guadalupe is a special pro-life patron because she is shown to be pregnant. In 1531, she appeared to Juan Diego, an indigenous Indian living near what is now Mexico City. She appeared as an indigenous woman herself and spoke his native language. She wore a black sash around her waist which was a symbol that indicated pregnancy in that culture.

St. Mother Teresa was a champion of the poor and unwanted and founded missions to care for the destitute, including opening orphanages for unwanted children.

St. Margaret of Castello was born with dwarfism and blind. Her parents imprisoned her in a single room for 15 years with access only to food and a priest. Finally, they took her to a church in town where people experienced miraculous healings. However, Margaret was not cured but became a third order Dominican. She spent her life serving the friars, catechizing poor children, visiting local prisoners, and brought lapsed Catholics to repentance and confession. She died at the age of 33.


St. Maximilian Kolbe was a Polish Priest who established the Militia Immaculate and a Franciscan monastery in Japan to spread the word of God. He was arrested by the Nazis and sent to Auschwitz. There he gave his life in exchange for a prisoner who had a wife and children. He was starved to death and finally died after two weeks.

St. Pope John Paul II had a powerful voice for the “culture of life” and not the “culture of death.” He was the author of *Evangelium Vitae* which addressed the sanctity of life motivated a new generation to stand up for the most vulnerable.

Blessed Marianna Biernacka was a Polish woman who took the place of her pregnant daughter-in-law to save her from execution from the Nazis during WWII.

The Catholic Church teaches a “seamless garment” ethic, meaning life is sacred from conception to natural death, opposing abortion, euthanasia, unjust war, and the death penalty, viewing all as attacks on human dignity, with a strong focus on protecting the unborn as the “first right of the human person.”
