Advent and Month of the Immaculate Conception



With the beginning of December, we enter the season of Advent. Advent is a season of preparation; we are preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus. We prepare for this joyous occasion by making Advent a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving so that we

may intentionally prepare our hearts for the birth of our Savior at Christmas. This year, let's be intentional about celebrating Advent during the Advent season and celebrating Christmas during the Christmas season, which begins on December 25 and ends the evening before the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord which is commonly January 6, or the Sunday after January 1.


A very important celebration that takes place this week of Advent is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Celebrated on December 8, this special day celebrates the uniqueness of Mary's conception. This day is so important in the Church that it is elevated to the rank of a solemnity. Contrary to what it sounds like, a solemnity is not meant to be a somber occasion. Rather, solemnities commemorate very joyous occasions. The "solemn" part refers to how the Mass is celebrated. For solemnities, Masses have a few extra special aspects that help make it even more a celebration than it already is.

The Immaculate Conception is often misunderstood to reference Jesus' conception instead of Mary's conception. From the very first moment of Mary's conception, she was given the grace and privilege from God to be kept free of every stain of original sin. Original sin provokes disorderliness in our behavior and thoughts, especially upsetting our view of the importance of God's presence in our life. In declaring that Mary was immaculately conceived, the Church affirms that she never denied God the smallest sign of love, making her exceptionally holy and in eternal union with the sanctifying grace from the Holy Spirit, making her the most fitting mother for Our Savior.
