January 22: Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn

January 22 is the anniversary of the 1973 *Roe v. Wade* Supreme Court decision that struck down abortion restrictions in all fifty states. Our bishops call upon us to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting, and giving alms.

The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* designates this anniversary as the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children: "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion."

~*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, no. 373

The over 56 million abortions since the 1973 decision of *Roe v. Wade* reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." What kind of society can truly believe that the best future for a child is ending their precious life in a manner similar to throwing away a worn out object?

As a society, we can do so much better than this. Deep within each and every human heart is the innate knowledge that every person has infinite worth and dignity. A person's worth does not depend upon their health, financial position, or even our opinion of them. Our worth comes from our Heavenly Creator, not the circumstances, people, or convenience surrounding our birth.

Consider the Holy Family. The birth of Jesus was not a convenient birth or pregnancy by any means. A young and unwed girl was expecting a child that she could hardly explain and was forced to walk a hundred miles to give birth in the hay; King Herod feared being challenged for his power, so he sent his soldiers to track down an innocent child so he could get rid of him. To Joseph and Mary, none of this mattered or made Jesus a burden that wasn't worth protecting because they knew that Jesus was worth every single sacrifice and "inconvenience."

There are so many things that we can do to support families and unborn children. First, we can pray for them. We believe that God hears our prayers, so we should take comfort in the knowledge that our prayers for them are heard. Secondly, we can fast for an end to abortion and other offenses against the dignity of life. Skip your soda at lunch, spend time in prayer instead of binge-watching your favorite show or scrolling through social media at the end of the evening. You can also support families and unborn children by giving of your wealth. Many communities have local pregnancy centers and shelters that accept donations of clothing, blankets, food, and money to assist those families who are expecting a baby in less than ideal circumstances.

Some people feel a special call to protect unborn babies through foster care or adoption. This is a very special and selfless form of support. The process is often very long and challenging, and it is filled with many bumps along the way. If you know someone who is going through this process, consider how you can support them, whether it be financially or emotionally. Families who open their hearts to this path of support go through so much, and they need all the support that we can offer.


