

The Annunciation of the Lord



We celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord (also called Lady Day) on March 25. On this day, we recall the exchange between our Blessed Mother and the archangel Gabriel, telling us of Jesus' conception within Mary's womb. In Luke 1:26-38, we read that the angel Gabriel

appeared to Mary, saying: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" Mary was very troubled by this, and Gabriel reassured her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus...The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God...For with God nothing will be impossible." Mary responded, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word."

A beautiful prayer that reflects on the conversation between Mary and Gabriel is the Angelus. The Angelus is a prayer that dates back to at least the thirteenth century. The prayer is traditionally prayed at 6am, 12pm, and 6pm. Church bells often rang to remind the faithful to stop and pray at these specific times. The above painting, *The Annunciation* by Jean-Francois Millet, illustrates this practice. In the middle of the field, two peasants stopped their work at the sound of the bells to pray for the poor departed.

We, too, can take up this pious practice in our own life. While it may not be feasible, or even possible, to pray this prayer together as a family at 6am, 12pm, and 6pm, you could start your day off with this prayer once everyone is awake. In this way, you can entrust your day to Our Lady.

If you want to really celebrate this feast this year but don't have a lot of time to plan something, you can adopt a Swedish tradition of eating waffles on this day. The tradition is a result of the fact that the Swedish words for "Lady Day" (another name for this solemnity) sound very much like "Waffle Day": Våffeldagen. This is a very simple way to celebrate this beautiful solemnity in your home in a very simple way, and if you want to start praying the Angelus daily as family, this would be a wonderful way to begin and ignite excitement in young children.

The Angelus

Leader: The Angel of the Lord declared to Mary.

All: And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.

Leader: Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.

All: Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Leader: Behold the handmaid of the Lord.

All: Be it done unto me according to Thy word.

Leader/All: Hail Mary...

Leader: And the Word was made Flesh

All: And dwelt among us.

Leader/All: Hail Mary...

Leader: Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God,

All: That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Leader: Let us pray:

All: Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy grace into our hearts; that we, to whom the incarnation of Christ, Thy Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may by His Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of His Resurrection, through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen.

Take a break from the fast-paced society and your meticulous schedule. Go ahead and rest. Pray. Love your family. Just be with one another and Me. By loving one another and remembering Me, you will bring light to the world.

What am I supposed to do with all this time at home with my family?

Your time together as a family is such a rare gift, and I've given you a gift by halting the rush of daily life. Play games, bake cookies, snuggle, and work on projects that you haven't had time to do. Teach your family kindness, patience, and how to endure challenging circumstances in a way that brings them closer to Me.

How can I be sure that You're really going to take care of everything? I feel like I should do something, like worrying.



Lenten Opportunities & Guidelines for Fasting & Abstinence

Daily Mass	Monday at 8am Tuesday at 12:10pm Wednesday - Saturday at 8am
Eucharistic Adoration	Thursday from 8:30am-5:30pm
Confessions	Wednesday—Saturday from 7:30am-7:50am Saturday from 3pm-4pm
Stations of the Cross	Friday at 5:30pm
Evening Prayer	Immediately following Stations

Abstinence—Every person 14 years of age or older must abstain from meat (and items made with meat) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting—Every person between the ages of 18 and 60 must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. A fast consists of three meals—two small meals and one main meal with nothing to eat in between the meals.

**Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill, including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.*
