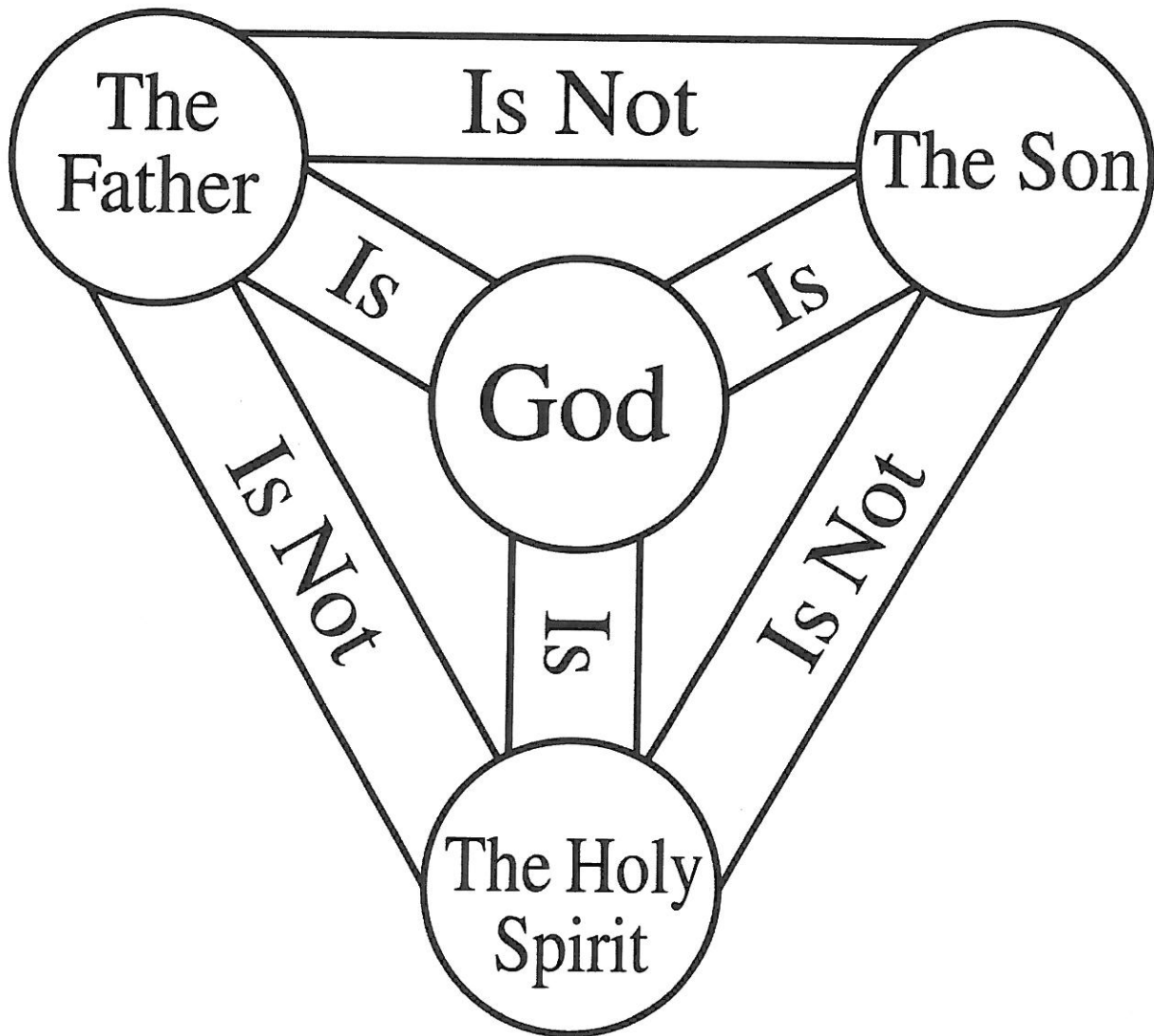


7th Grade Religion

(25 pts)

Each student may **choose one of the following options:**

- (A) Choose a large symbol of the Trinity and decorate/color it carefully. Then NEATLY write out (print or cursive) the definition of Trinity below the symbol. Neatly write your name on the front lower right corner. (*Shamrock symbol should have **special prayer**(found below symbol) written by student (print or cursive) below decorated shamrock.)*)
- (B) Choose **one** of the different symbols of the Trinity to draw yourself. After drawing and decorating the symbol, write out (print or cursive) the definition of Trinity below the symbol.
Neatly write your name on the front lower right corner.
- (C) Choose **one piece of lined paper** with decoration of 3 intertwined symbols of the Trinity. Pick up the piece of paper with 3 Trinity prayers on it. Choose one prayer to **neatly** write out (print or cursive) on the lines. Neatly write your name on the front lower right corner.

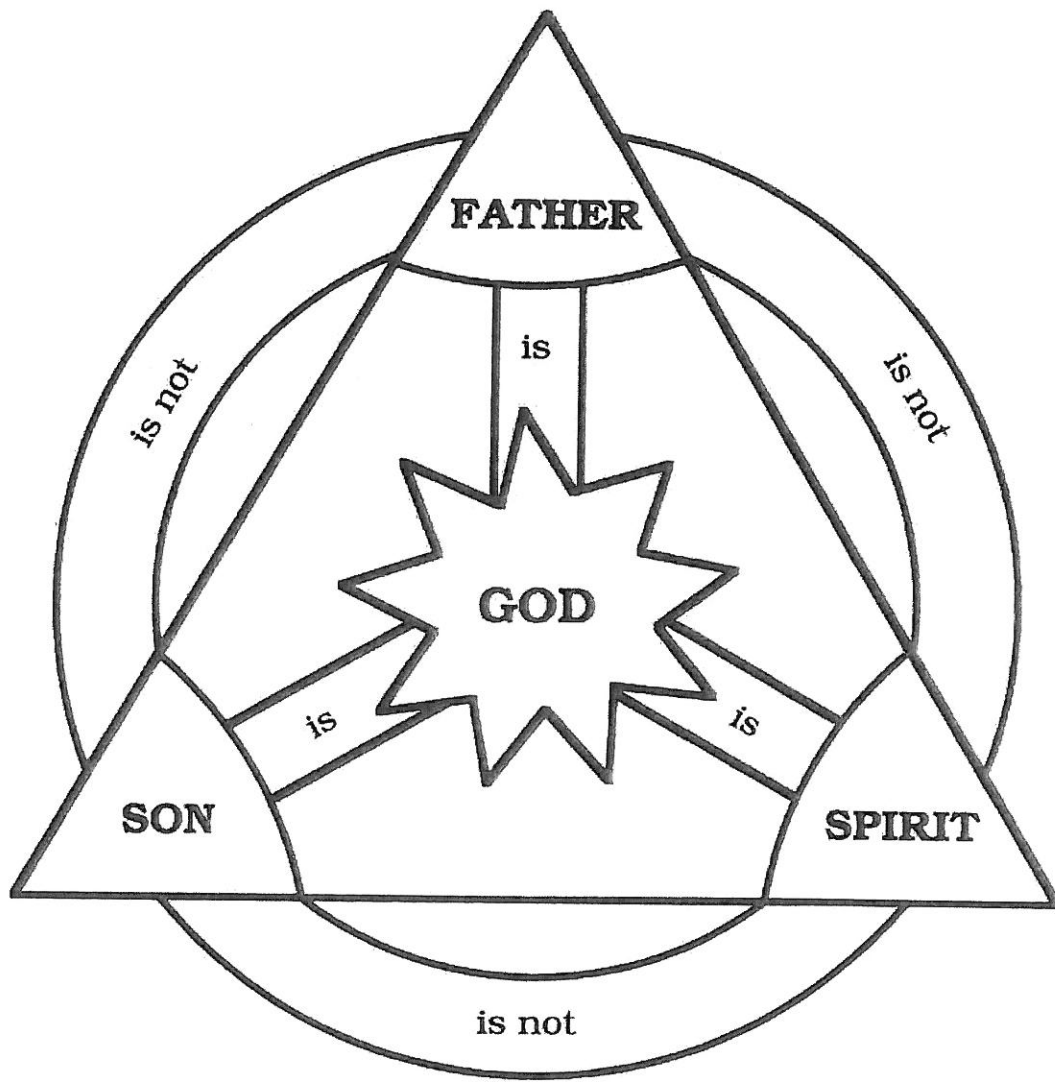

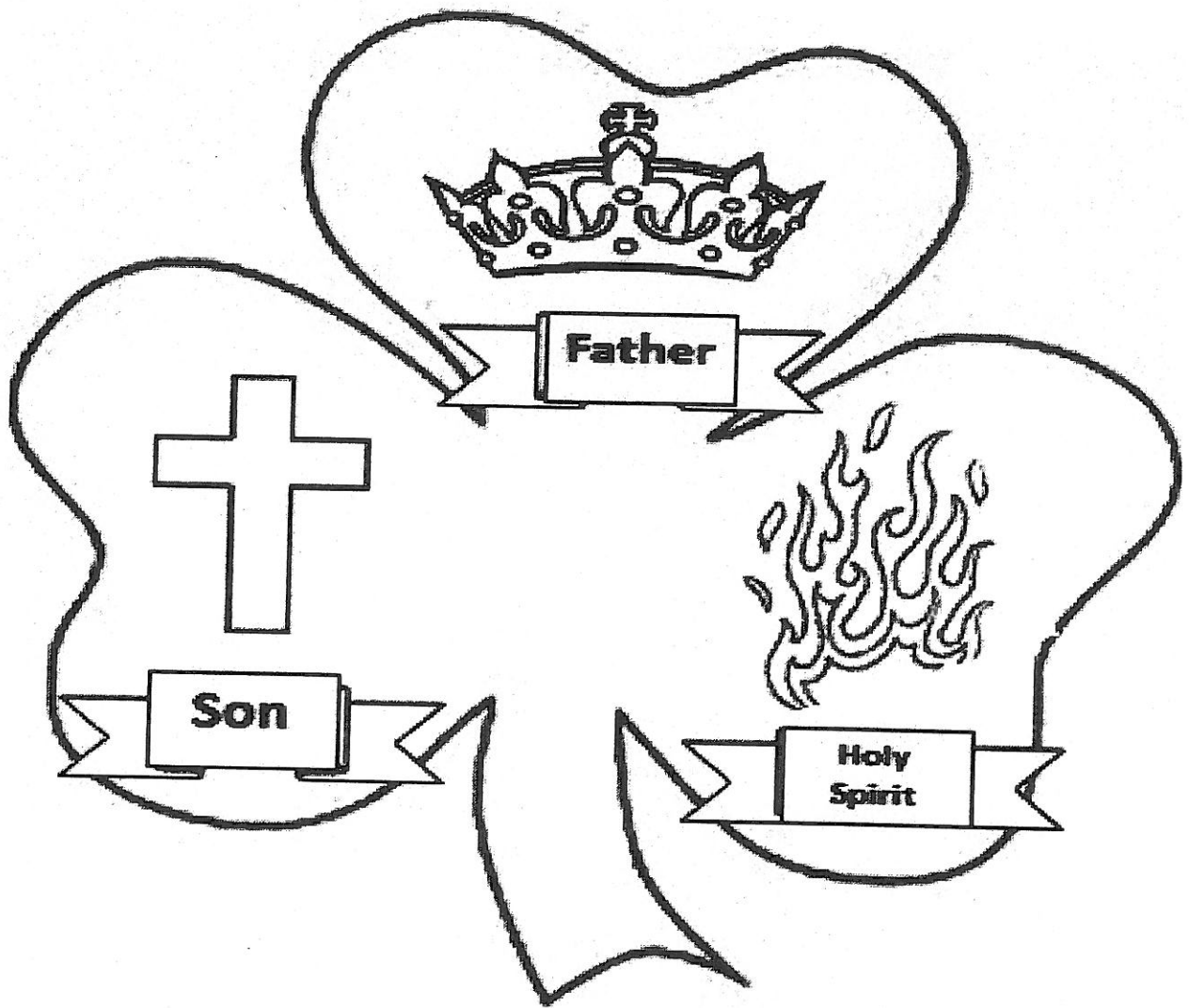

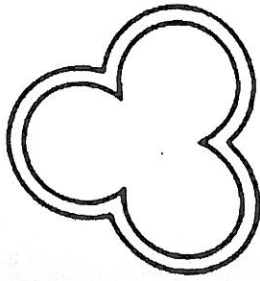

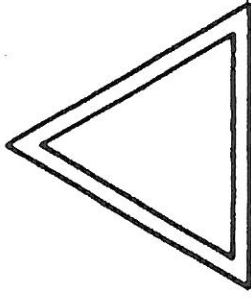
Option A Shamrock

Just like the leaves on each shamrock I see, there are three parts to the Trinity.

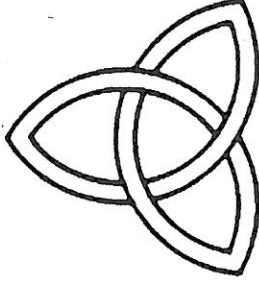
First is God the Father, then Jesus His only Son with the Holy Spirit; together they are Three in One.



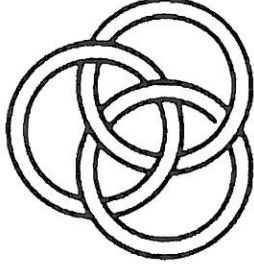
Trefoil



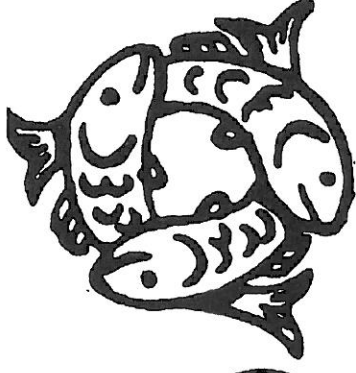
Equilateral triangle
