

God wants us to "pray without ceasing." (1 Thessalonians 5:17) But sometimes it's difficult to pray, especially in our weakness and anxiety. In these times of need, the Spirit comes to our aid.

When I was learning how to swim, everyone had to jump off the big diving board at least once. The instructor challenged us to get past our reluctance so that we could feel how safe it was to land in the water when we knew how to swim.

As parents, one of our most important jobs is to encourage our children to pray and deepen their intimacy with God. Like a good swimming instructor, the Holy Spirit will be there to make sure that prayer is rewarding. The first step is getting past that initial reluctance.

Sometimes parents feel reluctant to pray with their children. The good news is the Spirit will intercede for us, too. We just have to dive in.
