Fourth week of Advent: Be Still and Listen

The Virgin Mary exemplifies two essential aspects of the life of faith: the active and the contemplative. The Gospel reading for the Fourth Sunday of Advent finds the newly pregnant Mary in full active mode, traveling "in haste" to the hill country to visit her relative Elizabeth, who is pregnant with John the Baptist.

At the sound of Mary's greeting, the infant in Elizabeth's womb leaps for joy, and Elizabeth cries, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

Mary *believed* because she *heard*, and she heard because she *listened*. She made time to listen for the voice of God in silent, contemplative prayer, and she listened for him in the events of her life, "reflecting on them in her heart" (Luke 2:19).

Amid the bustle and excitement of these final days before Christmas, make time this week to sit in silence and listen for what God is saying to you.


