

#### Holy Season of Lent

#### Dear Parishioners,

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday when we mark ourselves with the cross on our foreheads reminding us that, "we are dust, and to dust, we shall return." Lent is marked by two important themes: baptism and penance. This season focuses on recalling and preparing for baptism. Alongside with the catechumens, who are in an intense season of discernment and preparation during Lent, the entire church recalls baptism. Repentance is a turning away from the sins and mistakes of the past and a turning toward God. Lent is a time of prayer, fasting, abstaining, and almsgiving. It is a preparation for Easter when we celebrate the Paschal Mystery which is Christ's death and resurrection. Lent is an opportunity for the community of faith to pause and reawaken to the bounty of God's love. It also challenges us to look beyond ourselves to the communal good of the Church and the world. In our church, we have the stations of the cross every Friday during Lent at 6:00 pm, followed by a soup and bread supper. We also have Holy Hour on Fridays after our 9:00 am Mass and a Lenten penance service on Friday, March 31st, 2023 at *6:00 pm*. I encourage you to use this time to pray for the conversion of hearts, and the needs of the world so those living in suffering today may experience hope, love, and the mercy of God. This is also a time to fast on social media, and TV and spend time meditating on the word of God, praying the Rosary; Divine Chaplets; and helping others in need. Participating in the Rice Bowl program is a good example to observe the Lenten practice.

Congratulations to our newly elects and candidates for the sacraments on Easter Vigil, our prayers and support are with you as we journey together in this path of faith. Deacon Jeff and I were so proud of you as we presented your names to Bishop Frank Schuster on Saturday, February 25, 2023. May God who has begun the good works in you bring you completion and fulfillment. Congratulations to Patrick and Desiree Mendiola; Doug Vaskey and Monica McInnis who will be married during this season in the church.

Thank you, Cassie and the volunteers who did a marvelous job organizing the Hunger Retreat for the youths of our Piece Deanery. It was a privilege for us to host this event and I was thrilled to be able to help them with Mass and confessions. They are the future of the church. Thank you to all the volunteer groups who make the Sunday breakfast and Friday soup supper possible. Thank you all who come to help clean up around the rectory, Meditation Park, Grotto, and Community Garden.

May our Lenten observances unite us to the life of Christ, his passion, death, and resurrection; and bring hope, love, joy, and peace to those who are in need. May God, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint John Bosco, and all the Saints bless you, and your families during these 40 days. #### **Baptism & Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**

Are you or someone you know who...has expressed interest in becoming a Catholic? Has a child over 7 who has not been Baptized? Was Baptized Catholic as a child, but has not celebrated the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist? Is a Baptized Catholic but would like to return to the Church after a long time away? Catholic Daughters Local Historian



Partners in Gospel is a strategic pastoral planning effort taking place across the Archdiocese of Seattle to re-invigorate and renew our local Catholic Church. Today we face many realities that impact parish life and make it difficult to fully live out our mission. This archdiocesan-wide renewal effort, led by the Holy Spirit and grounded in prayer, will help us better support vibrant, sustainable, mission-focused parish communities across the entire Archdiocese of Seattle. Today the archdiocese has 80 diocesan pastors for 174 locations, by 2036, we estimate we will only have 66 diocesan pastors, an 18% decrease. (We also have fewer seminarians and fewer lay ministry leaders).

While the overall population of the Archdiocese of Seattle is growing, registered households are declining, along with Mass attendance, baptisms, first communions, marriages in the Church and parish giving:

From 2010 to 2019, Mass attendance as a percentage of total registered parishioners decline from 40.7% to 35.5%. Between 2010 and 2019, baptisms declined 30% and weddings declined nearly 19%.

Currently, 67% of parishes operate with a financial deficit (excluding extraordinary income, which is income apart from Sundays and Holy Days).
