

Dear Parishioners,

Every three or four years, the Catholic Church holds its World Youth Day event which brings all the youths from around the world together with the Pope, bishops, priests, and religious brothers and sisters. This year, the 37th World Youth Day is being held in Lisbon, Portugal this week (August 1-6, 2023). The motto is "Mary arose and went with haste" (Lk 1:39). I have been following this event every day since it started through social media. I encourage you to do the same and pray for these young people who are the future of the Church. Please note, we will not have confession on this day. I hope to see you all there.

As you all know my parents are visiting me and they want to thank you for your warm welcome and generosity. Even though they cannot speak a lot due to the language barrier, they appreciate your kindness and prayers. They will be around until September 15th if you want to say "Hi".

Baptism & Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you or someone you know who...has expressed interest in becoming a Catholic? Has a child over 7 who has not been Baptized? Was Baptized Catholic as a child, but has not celebrated the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist? Is a Baptized Catholic but would like to return to the Church after a long time away? St. John Bosco Parish community offers an opportunity to come together (online for now) in a small group to learn about our beliefs and explore our journey of faith to God. Sessions focus on our Christian roots revealed in the Bible and the teachings and experience of the Church. For those who choose, we also prepare individuals to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist during the Easter season. You are welcome to participate in this process with your questions, your insights, and your faith story in a warm accepting setting.
