### Dear Parishioners,

May and October are Marian months dedicated to Mary. The Church has long set aside the entire month of May to honor Mary. As for October, it has been dedicated to the Rosary – a set of prayers said in honor of the Blessed Mother. Back in the fifteenth century, the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, also celebrated as Our Lady of Victory was established by Pope St. Pius V in 1571 to celebrate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7 of that year. St. John Paul II called the rosary his favorite prayer, "in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a Mother meditated on in her heart." Let us make time to pray this prayer in honor of Mary and give thanks to almighty God.

Thirty-six of us went on the pilgrimage to Poland, Austria, and Italy recently. Thank you for your prayers and support and for allowing me to do this. We had a wonderful and grace-filled time. Unlike previous pilgrimages, I was able to visit the place where Saint Pope John Paul II was born, raised, and served for many years before he was elected Pope. We visited various magnificent basilicas and cathedrals, following in the footsteps of many saints, and celebrated Holy Mass every day. The most touching moment was when I was able to celebrate Mass in the Vatican at one of the private chapels next to St. Peter's tomb. Another great moment was participating in Wednesday's audience with the Holy Father, Pope Francis with thousands of pilgrims around the world. The Pope greeted us in person on his mobile, welcomed us with his words, and finally bestowed the pontifical blessings upon us, our family members, and our parishioners. What a wonderful blessing to have that experience!

Our RCIA program, Faith Formation, Youth Ministry, and Confirmation classes will begin this month. I encourage you to register your children in these programs if you have not already done so and I invite you to deepen your faith by being involved in these ministries.

We have had our first Partners in the Gospel listening session with two more sessions to follow. Please check your calendar and participate in these sessions, share your thoughts, concerns, and hopes for our proposed parish family. Your input is important as we journey together in the Archdiocese of Seattle.

Ping Pong will resume twice a week at the beginning of this month. There will be a daily Mass at Immaculate Conception Mission on October 21st at 9:00am. Women of the Well have already begun collecting items for Thanksgiving baskets. Please see the bulletin, Facebook, or our bulletin boards for items needed. There are not enough words to express how grateful we are, and how blessed my ministry has been, because of Terri Nelson. Are you an adult interested in learning about becoming Catholic or in need of completing initiation sacraments?

All people who are open to discerning their personal experience of faith and to learning more about the Catholic Church are welcome to begin the RCIA process. Many people come to an awareness of their desire to learn about membership in the Catholic Church in various and different ways. Often it may be a personal faith experience, overcoming personal difficulty and tragedy, or a relationship or discussion with a person of faith which leads one to begin this exciting journey. All that is truly required is a sincere desire to learn, to grow, and to develop one's relationship with God.

The RCIA process can be applied to the following 3 groups:

- \* Unbaptized: persons (age of discretion: 7+ years) who have never been baptized and who need a process to help them grow in awareness to God's call to conversion as well as ways to respond to that call. They are considered catechumens.
- \* Baptized in Another Christian Church: Those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. They are considered candidates. For baptized Christians interested in possibly joining the Catholic Church, the process will vary depending upon the depth on one's religious and spiritual readiness.
- \* Baptized (but uncatechized) Catholic Adults: persons who were baptized as infants and not given any religious instruction in the Catholic faith. These adults will be prepared to celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation, and Eucharist. They are also considered candidates.


Celebrate Mass with Fr. Thomas every last Wednesday of the month. The anointing of the sick will be offered every other month.

## SUPPORT INITIATIVE 2081 I-2081

Join the bishops of Washington and sign I-2081



### Why Support I-2081?

The Washington State Catholic Conference (WSCC), the public policy voice of the five bishops of Washington state, supports Initiative 2081 (I-2081), which would establish a parents' bill of rights for parents of children in public schools. In the tradition of Catholic Social Teaching, families are a central social institution that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. I-2081 strengthens family rights.

### **I-2081 Specifics**

I-2081 names parents as the primary stakeholders in their children's upbringing. It also reiterates or establishes numerous parents' rights within the public school system, including:

- the right to receive reassurance that a child's public school will not discriminate against a child based upon sincerely held religious beliefs,
- the right to receive notification if a child is taken or removed from a public school campus without parental permission, including to stay at a youth shelter or host home.
- the right to receive prior notification when medical services are being offered to their child (except when emergency medical treatment is required),
- the right to review medical records and health records, and
- the right to receive written notice and the option to opt their child out of any surveys, assignments, questionnaires, role-playing activities, recordings of their child, or other student engagements that include questions about any of the following: (i) The child's sexual experiences or attractions; (ii) The child's family beliefs, morality, religion, or political affiliations; (iii) Any mental health or psychological problems of the child or a family member.
- I-2081 also calls for parents to receive notification and the ability to opt their children out of activities that include questions about a child's sexual experiences or are on the topic of sexual activity.

### The Initiative Process

The WSCC recommends that you sign an I-2081 petition by mid-December. Campaign organizers must process and turn in completed petitions to the Secretary of State by December 29, 2023. To qualify for legislative action, 324,516 valid signatures must be collected.

I-2081 is an initiative to the Legislature. If the initiative qualifies by the December 29 deadline, it will take precedence over all other measures in the 2024 session, except for budget bills. The Legislature may adopt the initiative, reject it, refuse to act on it, or provide an alternative on the same subject. If the Legislature rejects it or refuses to act, the initiative will then be on the general election ballot in 2024. If the Legislature provides an alternative, both versions of the initiative will be on the 2024 ballot.
