Dear Parishioners,

Father Thomas asked that I assist him in composing this month's pastoral letter. As many of you are aware he suffered a fall on October 19th resulting in a head injury to include a traumatic subarachnoid hemorrhage and a skull fracture. He was hospitalized for three days and he has since been recovering at the rectory with 24/7 assistance from numerous compassionate parishioners. We expect his recovery will be complete with no permanent cognitive impairment and his return to full duties, excluding roof maintenance, will be soon. We pray for his speedy and full recovery and we are grateful his injuries were not more serious. He thanks you for your prayers and support.

On November 1st we celebrated the Solemnity of All Saints and their communion with the multitudes who are in heaven enjoying the joy and happiness of perfect salvation while seeing God face-to-face. On All Souls Day (November 2nd) and continuing through the following week we pray for those souls in purgatory awaiting their call to heaven. We pray for our departed loved ones, both family and friends. We remember our family and friends who are deceased and we make an extra sacrifice for them.

As an invocation for the souls in purgatory you may pray:

My God, bestow Thy blessings and Thy mercies on all persons and on those souls in Purgatory for whom I am in charity, gratitude, or friendship bound and have the desire to pray. Amen

Father asked that I deliver to everyone his heartfelt thank you for your participation in Partners in the Gospel. St. John Bosco parishioners made a robust contribution to the process. The public input phase has concluded. In early 2024 the final parish family structures will be announced by the Archbishop. At some point after the parish families are announced a priest will be assigned to each family parish and his duties will commence in July 2024. Parish families will then journey together for three years to become one parish in 2027.

Thank you for reading this communication as we all hope and pray that Father will write December's pastoral letter himself.

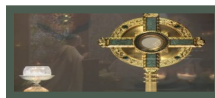

Are you an adult interested in learning about becoming Catholic or in need of completing initiation sacraments?

All people who are open to discerning their personal experience of faith and to learning more about the Catholic Church are welcome to begin the RCIA process. Many people come to an awareness of their desire to learn about membership in the Catholic Church in various and different ways. Often it may be a personal faith experience, overcoming personal difficulty and tragedy, or a relationship or discussion with a person of faith which leads one to begin this exciting journey. All that is truly required is a sincere desire to learn, to grow, and to develop one's relationship with God.

The RCIA process can be applied to the following 3 groups:

- * Unbaptized: persons (age of discretion: 7+ years) who have never been baptized and who need a process to help them grow in awareness to God's call to conversion as well as ways to respond to that call. They are considered catechumens.

- * Baptized in Another Christian Church: Those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. They are considered candidates. For baptized Christians interested in possibly joining the Catholic Church, the process will vary depending upon the depth on one's religious and spiritual readiness.

- * Baptized (but uncatechized) Catholic Adults: persons who were baptized as infants and not given any religious instruction in the Catholic faith. These adults will be prepared to celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation, and Eucharist. They are also considered candidates.
