

#### Dear Parishioners,

Father Thomas asked that I assist him in composing this month's pastoral letter. As many of you are aware he suffered a fall on October 19<sup>th</sup> resulting in a head injury to include a traumatic subarachnoid hemorrhage and a skull fracture. He was hospitalized for three days and he has since been recovering at the rectory with 24/7 assistance from numerous compassionate parishioners. We expect his recovery will be complete with no permanent cognitive impairment and his return to full duties, excluding roof maintenance, will be soon. We pray for his speedy and full recovery and we are grateful his injuries were not more serious. He thanks you for your prayers and support.

On November 1<sup>st</sup> we celebrated the Solemnity of All Saints and their communion with the multitudes who are in heaven enjoying the joy and happiness of perfect salvation while seeing God face-to-face. On All Souls Day (November 2<sup>nd</sup>) and continuing through the following week we pray for those souls in purgatory awaiting their call to heaven. We pray for our departed loved ones, both family and friends. We remember our family and friends who are deceased and we make an extra sacrifice for them.

#### As an invocation for the souls in purgatory you may pray:

My God, bestow Thy blessings and Thy mercies on all persons and on those souls in Purgatory for whom I am in charity, gratitude, or friendship bound and have the desire to pray. Amen


Father asked that I deliver to everyone his heartfelt thank you for your participation in Partners in the Gospel. St. John Bosco parishioners made a robust contribution to the process. The public input phase has concluded. In early 2024 the final parish family structures will be announced by the Archbishop. At some point after the parish families are announced a priest will be assigned to each family parish and his duties will commence in July 2024. Parish families will then journey together for three years to become one parish in 2027.

Thank you for reading this communication as we all hope and pray that Father will write December's pastoral letter himself.

#### The Journey to Vibrancy



#### Update—Fall 2023

Partners in the Gospel is the next stage of the strategic pastoral planning effort taking place across the Archdiocese of Seattle to re-invigorate and renew our local Catholic Church.

Today we face many realities that are impacting parish life and making it difficult to fully live out our mission. We face an urgent — yet exciting — opportunity to transform parish life — and the faith of all those who live here.

The draft of parish families was publicly released on 9/23/2023, opening up a public input phase that was completed on 10/14/2023. The final parish family structures will be announced early 2024.

Here is a timeline of key milestones for Partners in the Gospel to come:

January 2023: Public launch

Spring 2023: Current Reality Report and video released

Summer 2023: Consultation with clergy and lay leaders on parish families
 Fall 2023: Consultation with all Catholics on the draft parish families

Early 2024: Final parish family structures announced

July 2024: Parish families go into effect with one pastor

2024–2027: Parish families journey together to become one parish

The public consultation process is completed, the final parish family configurations will be announced in early 2024, and the announcement of priest pastoral assignments will follow in spring 2024 along with vicar assignments. The families will become a reality on July 1, 2024. The pastor, the parish staff, parish leadership and parishioners will then work together over about three years to discern how to become one faith family, given their own unique situations, needs, challenges and gifts. This process will take time — and we will not rush it. In the first year, the focus will be on getting to know the people and the cultures of each parish community, finding opportunities to meet each other, and coming to understand the unique gifts we bring to the family.

Thank you to all of our parishioners here at St. John Bosco and Immaculate Conception for their input. All comments have been sent to the Archdiocese and have been reviewed by at least two members of the oversight committee. Your voices have been heard and noted. Please continue to pray for this ongoing process.

#### (NO RCIA CLASS 11/26/23 & 12/24/2023)

Are you an adult interested in learning about becoming Catholic or in need of completing initiation sacraments?

All people who are open to discerning their personal experience of faith and to learning more about the Catholic Church are welcome to begin the RCIA process. Many people come to an awareness of their desire to learn about membership in the Catholic Church in various and different ways. Often it may be a personal faith experience, overcoming personal difficulty and tragedy, or a relationship or discussion with a person of faith which leads one to begin this exciting journey. All that is truly required is a sincere desire to learn, to grow, and to develop one's relationship with God.

The RCIA process can be applied to the following 3 groups:

- \* Unbaptized: persons (age of discretion: 7+ years) who have never been baptized and who need a process to help them grow in awareness to God's call to conversion as well as ways to respond to that call. They are considered catechumens.
- \* Baptized in Another Christian Church: Those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. They are considered candidates. For baptized Christians interested in possibly joining the Catholic Church, the process will vary depending upon the depth on one's religious and spiritual readiness.
- \* Baptized (but uncatechized) Catholic Adults: persons who were baptized as infants and not given any religious instruction in the Catholic faith. These adults will be prepared to celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation, and Eucharist. They are also considered candidates.


