Dear Parishioners,

As we welcome the New Year 2024, we ask for the intercession and guidance of Mary, the Holy Mother of God and we pray for peace in our parish, Archdiocese, and the world. Let me quote this ancient priestly blessing given by God to Moses be the opening words of our New Year. "The LORD bless you and keep you! The LORD let his face shine upon you and be gracious to you! The LORD look upon you kindly and give you peace!" (Nm 6:24-26). The Year 2024 is the Year of the Lord. As in all years, we are pilgrims of hope together. There will be challenges along the way, but always be assured that He walks with us as we begin our journey, with courage and faith.

First of all, I would like to thank everyone for your love, dedication, and support to our parish during the 2023 Christmas liturgy. We had a wonderful celebration of the Incarnation of the Lord, the Emmanuel this year. It was so good to see many people involved in different roles and ministries. People helped decorate the church with Christmas lights, setup the manger, sang carols, participated in our Nativity Pageant, served during Mass, and donated to our Christmas Giving Tree and the Nativity House providing gifts to those in need. In helping others and worshipping God together, it brought us all closer to Christ.

For some in-house items, there are a couple of heating issues at our facility. We will try to get them fixed as soon as possible. In the meantime, you may experience the cold in the parish hall and our daily chapel. Thank you for your patience. There is a dead tree next to the 10-commandment monument, close to gate 2. We will take it down after we receive the permit to do so from the City of Lakewood. We also had someone evaluate the skylight bubbles in front of the main entrance to the parish office. Once we hear from them, we will arrange to have them repaired.

Our patron Saint, St. John Bosco's Feast Day is coming at the end of this month and Bishop Frank Schuster, the Regional Bishop will be coming to celebrate with us this year on Wednesday, January 31st at 9:00 am. I cordially invite all of you to come to give thanks to almighty God, through the intercession of St. John Bosco, meet Bishop Schuster, and have a reception after mass.

We are grateful to have Paul Nguyen, the Seminarian Candidate for the Archdiocese of Seattle here with us. He will be with us until the end of June 2024. Please keep him in your prayers as he discerns his vocation and pray for an increased vocation within our Archdiocese.

We will host a confirmation retreat here on Saturday, January 20th with the combined candidates of St. Patrick and St. John Bosco parishes. We will offer a Bible Discussion Group starting this month. Please sign up with Carole White to deepen your faith by meditating on the word of God.

As you have heard, the Partners in the Gospel process has been delayed since we had the public input session in September and October 2023. There was a second listening session for over 20 parishes and due to this, Archbishop Etienne will promulgate the new parish families in early February 2024. I ask you to continue to pray for this process and be patient with it.

We are in the process of hiring for both a part-time Pastoral Assistant for Outreach and Parish Involvement position and a Maintenance Facility position. Please say a prayer asking the Lord to send us someone who has a heart for servicing Him and His people.

Lastly, thank you for all you do for these wonderful communities. I am blessed to be your pastor and thankful to each of you. Happy New Year to all of us. May God bless us in His mercy.

Are you an adult interested in learning about becoming Catholic or in need of completing initiation sacraments?

All people who are open to discerning their personal experience of faith and to learning more about the Catholic Church are welcome to begin the RCIA process. Many people come to an awareness of their desire to learn about membership in the Catholic Church in various and different ways. Often it may be a personal faith experience, overcoming personal difficulty and tragedy, or a relationship or discussion with a person of faith which leads one to begin this exciting journey. All that is truly required is a sincere desire to learn, to grow, and to develop one's relationship with God.

The RCIA process can be applied to the following 3 groups:

- * Unbaptized: persons (age of discretion: 7+ years) who have never been baptized and who need a process to help them grow in awareness to God's call to conversion as well as ways to respond to that call. They are considered catechumens.
- * Baptized in Another Christian Church: Those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. They are considered candidates. For baptized Christians interested in possibly joining the Catholic Church, the process will vary depending upon the depth on one's religious and spiritual readiness.
- * Baptized (but uncatechized) Catholic Adults: persons who were baptized as infants and not given any religious instruction in the Catholic faith. These adults will be prepared to celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation, and Eucharist. They are also considered candidates
