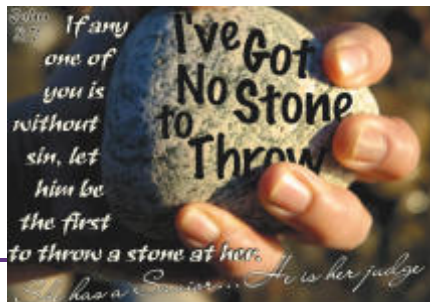

Everything Else Is Rubbish

“Everything else is rubbish compared to the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord.” Paul said this in his letter to the Philippians. Can you imagine saying this about your car that it is rubbish, or your nice clothing, or about the money you have saved, or about the valuable time you spent? Nevertheless, Paul meant what he said. “For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him,” Paul said. The statement is reminiscent of what many of us heard Fr. Anthony Bozeman say during our recent Lenten Revival. Fr. Bozeman made a compelling argument for seeing our lives in Christ as “living our best lives.” If indeed we are living our best lives by living in Jesus Christ, then so many other aspects of our lives count as insignificant. They are like rubbish.

I am certainly not suggesting that we are all at that place yet in our life in Christ. There are many of us who are unable to see our life in Jesus as our best lives. But many of us have thrown ourselves into the experience of Lent by giving up things we have valued or giving our time to charitable things in imitation of Christ. Even as we struggle to maintain our Lenten promises, we also become more and more aware how relatively unimportant or insignificant are the things we have given up or the time we have given over. As we come nearer to the completion of Lent, we can grow in awareness that our life in Christ is so much more important than what we have given up. Some of us may even think about extending our Lenten discipline so that our focus on Christ may be even less obscured by the rubbish.
