Independence Day and Gay Pride: 2019

Our country is known among the nations of the world for its history and its democratic systems. Our independence was established because men and women fought against what was perceived as British tyranny in the 18th Century. Our subsequent history has been marked by distinct periods where the fight against American tyranny has led to freedom in the United States for African slaves, Native people, women and immigrants. In each fight those seeking freedom from oppression have stood on the principles of freedom enshrined in the United States constitution. Often these domestic conflicts have occasioned even adaptations to the Constitution. Even though fighting against our own countrymen is difficult and painful, the results have often ensured a more perfect union of our citizens.

Today we acknowledge the efforts in more recent times of Americans who do not conform in their sexual behavior and gender identity to achieve a measure of freedom. This is the 50th Anniversary of the riots at the Stonewall Inn in New York's Greenwich Village which sparked a long and protracted fight for gay recognition and legal acceptance. Even though the doctrines of our Catholic faith do not permit non-conforming sexual acts, the fact remains that Gay men and women are here in our Parish expressing faith in Jesus Christ Sunday after Sunday. We welcome them, as we welcome all seeking Our Lord and Savior.

Baptisms and Funerals At St. Charles Borromeo and Resurrection Chapel

All registered members of the Parish of St. Charles Borromeo, Resurrection and All Saints are welcomed to have their children baptized in the Parish. If you are recently registered, you may be asked to wait for at least 6 months before your child is baptized. During the period of waiting you are asked to be regular in your attendance at Sunday Mass. Grandparents, who are the legal guardians of children, are permitted to have children baptized. If they are not legal guardians of children, they cannot request that children be baptized in the Parish. If children are seven years old or older, they may be baptized only after attending Religious Education classes. If you desire baptism for your children, please contact the Parish Secretary.

All registered members of the Parish of St. Charles Borromeo, Resurrection and All Saints are welcomed to have Funerals held on their behalf in the Parish. The funeral will be conducted by a Catholic priest and will include a Mass. If the member's family desires, the member's remains may be viewed prior to the Funeral at the Church in a side chapel. We extend the right to a Catholic funeral with a priest to the immediate family of a registered member of the parish, including the member's parents, siblings and children. We do not extend the right to a Catholic funeral to any unregistered person outside the immediate family defined above. Our Church is not available for non-Catholic funerals.

Nuestro país es conocido entre las naciones del mundo por su historia y sus sistemas democrático. Nuestra independencia fue establecida por hombres y mujeres que pelearon contra lo que fue percibido como la tiranía británica en el siglo 18. Nuestra historia anterior ha estado marcada por distintos períodos donde la lucha contra la tiranía americana ha llevado a la libertad en los Estados Unidos para los esclavos africanos, los nativos americanos, mujeres, e inmigrantes. El funeral será conducido por un sacerdote católico e incluirá la misa. Si los miembros de la familia desean que los restos puedan ser observados antes de la misa del funeral, serán observados en la capilla del lado de la iglesia. Nosotros extendemos el derecho de un funeral católico con un sacerdote a los familiares directos miembros registrados de nuestra parroquia, incluyendo padres, hermanos(as), e hijos(as). Nosotros no extendemos el derecho de un funeral a cualquier persona no registrada fuera de la familia directa definida anteriormente arriba. 
