





For a Eucharistic life

#### INDEPENDENCE DAY

Father, we give you thanks that you formed the good earth and that part of it we call our country. Those who first came here, the Indian tribes and nations, lived in harmony with this land and praised you as Father of us all.



Those who crossed the oceans and struggled to be free gave us our inheritance. We are their children – Many races and one nation. We thank you for the good things in our heritage and the chance to correct the bad.

We love this country, the United States of America, and we pledge again to guard its freedoms and confer them equally on all.

Help us in the struggle to replace tyranny with law and bondage with freedom. For our blessings as a nation, we praise you, Father of us all.

#### St. Maria Goretti, Virgin and Martyr. JULY 6th

Born on October 16 1890 in Corinaldo, in the Ancona Province in Italy, her farmworker father moved his family to Ferrier di Conca, near Anzio. When he died of malaria, Maria's mother had to struggle to feed her children. Maria's mother, brothers, and sisters worked in the fields while she cooked, sewed, kept the house clean, and watched her youngest sister Teresa. Though the family's circumstances were extremely difficult, they were very close and loved God.



On July 5, 1902, Maria was sitting outside the steps of her home sewing her 18-year-old brother or neighbor -it is unclear which - Alessandro's shirt while he threshed beans in the barnyard. As she concentrated on her sewing, Alessandro surprised her and grabbed her from her steps. When he tried to rape her, Maria cried that it was a mortal sin and warned he would go to hell.

When Alessandro persisted, she fought him and screamed, "No! It is a sin! God does not want it!" At her words, Alessandro began to choke her and she said she would rather die than submit. Upon hearing her words, Alexander pulled out a knife and stabbed her eleven times. When she attempted to reach the door, he stabbed her three more times then fled.

Teresa woke to the sounds of her sister's cries and began to cry. Maria's family returned home and found her bleeding on the floor. They quickly took her to the nearest hospital in Nettuno, where she underwent surgery without anesthesia. Unfortunately, her wounds were beyond the surgeon's ability to help. Halfway through the surgery, the man asked her, "Maria, think of me in Paradise."

As she lay on the table, she looked up at him and said, "Well, who knows which of us is going to be there first?" She did not realize how terrible her situation was, and the surgeon replied, "You, Maria." She said, "Then I will think gladly of you." She also mentioned concerns for her mother. The next day, Maria forgave Alessandro and said she wanted to see him in Heaven with her. She died that day while looking upon an image of the Virgin Mary and holding a cross to her chest.

<u>ANOINTING AND BLESSING OF THE SICK – July 8</u> Every Second Weekend of the Month after the Saturday 5:30 pm SCB Mass and after the Sunday 12:00 noon RES Spanish Mass.

By the sacred Anointing of the Sick and the prayer of the priests, the whole Church commends those who are ill to the suffering and glorified Lord, that He may raise them up and save them. And, indeed, He exhorts them to contribute to the good of the People of God by freely uniting themselves to the Passion and death of Christ.

#### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

(Richard Leonard, S.J; "Hatch Match & Dispatch")
Strictly, the church has always understood the sacrament of the anointing of the sick as a continuation of Jesus's healing ministry. It was always meant to be about getting better. In every Gospel, Jesus is always moved to compassion by the person in front of him and tries to restore them physically, socially, and spiritually (see Mark 1: 40-45; 9: 14-29). Some miracles are associated with the person's great faith or the forgiveness of his sins (Matt 9: 2-8).

On other occasions, a healing is a sign of the Kingdom of God. It is clear from the Letter of James that Jesus's healing ministry was institutionalized and ritualized very early in the life of the Christian community: "Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven" (Jas 5: 14-15). The special grace of the anointing of the sick is in how it links our human suffering to Jesus on Good Friday, who went through pain and death ahead of us. In it, Christ gives us strength, peace, and courage to carry the cross of illness, old age, or preparing for death. In this sacrament we are forgiven of anything that stops us from fully embracing Christ's life, and for the first time in centuries, we are encouraged to hope that we could be restored to health. "It is in the liturgy of the anointing of the sick that we learn what is of real value in life in the sense that those anointed become sacramental signs to the rest of the church and to the world that productivity, prowess, and performance are of little value compared with identification with God in suffering, in allowing suffering to teach us reliance on God and that the notion of 'human frailty' is really both redundant and eminently hope-filled. Those anointed remind us about who we really are – those who experience divine life here and now are destined for the fullness of this divine life in eternity with God forever"

## sunday morning Health Corner

#### How to Identify Sleep Apnea

Are you having restless nights? An estimated 70 million Americans live with a sleep disorder like sleep apnea, and African Americans are disproportionately affected. Sleep apnea causes breathing to repeatedly stop and start while sleeping. Sleep apnea is common in children and adults, yet is most prevalent and often undiagnosed in men. Learn more about the types, symptoms, and risks of sleep apnea below:

#### Types of sleep apnea:



**Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA)** occurs when the airway becomes physically blocked causing lapses in breathing.



Central Sleep Apnea (CSA) occurs when the brain does not send proper signals to the muscles controlling breathing, which leads to slower and shallower breathing.



Complex Sleep Apnea is a combination of obstructive and central sleep apnea. It is also referred to as Mixed Sleep Apnea.

#### What are the symptoms?

Commons symptoms of sleep apnea are:

- · Loud snoring
- Morning headache
- · Gasping for air while sleeping
- · Awakening with dry mouth
- Trouble falling asleep or remaining asleep
- · Difficulty remaining awake during the day

#### What are the risk factors?

Factors that increase your risk of sleep apnea are:

- Age
- Obesity
- · Family History
- Smoking
- Nasal Congestion
- Use of sedatives, like alcohol
