History also tells us that evil eventually succumbs to love and the will of God. So in this advent season hold fast to hope. PREPÁRATE PARA UN DÍA MEJOR

Imagina que nacieras hace 2025 años. Viviendo en Oriente Medio cuando César Augusto era emperador del Imperio Romano y Quirino gobernador de Siria y cuando el rey Herodes era rey de Judea.

La vida entonces, comparada con hoy, con nuestras sociedades, naciones y gobernanza avanzadas y alimentada por nuestras tecnologías contemporáneas, era bastante diferente. Sin embargo, "algunas cosas nunca cambian" y la historia tiende a repetirse. Si comparáramos las estructuras de gobierno de Roma con las nuestras aquí en Estados Unidos. El presidente de los Estados Unidos podría compararse con el equivalente al emperador César Augusto. La rareza sería el equivalente a nuestros gobernadores, el Senado como entonces sería el equivalente al nuestro hoy. El rey Herodes podría considerarse el alcalde de una gran ciudad.

En su venida, con el tiempo, la esperanza trascendió en la salvación y la libertad temporal del mal impuesto a las masas por gobiernos, gobernantes e instituciones defectuosas.

Hermanos y hermanas, en esta temporada de Adviento, mientras anticipamos y conmemoramos el nacimiento de nuestro Salvador, no seamos desesperanzados. Cada día nos recuerdan que el mal sigue existiendo. Puede que seas con razón escéptico respecto a que las cosas mejoren. Pero nuestra fe nos dice que "la esperanza no decepciona". Tenemos que ser pacientes, además de estar atentos. La historia también nos dice que el mal acaba sucumbiendo al amor y a la voluntad de Dios. Así que en esta temporada de adviento, mantente firme a la esperanza. Pon la mano en el arado y ponte a trabajar por la rectitud, porque los días mejores no llegarán sin nuestra participación activa.
