Walking Into Advent: Pilgrim Wisdom Inspired by Doris Wooten

During this holy season of Advent, we call to mind the loving guidance of Doris Wooten, who spent years helping people prepare for sacred journeys. Her “Six Commandments for Pilgrims,” first written for travelers visiting holy places, beautifully describe what it means to walk toward Advent with purpose. Rooted this year in Isaiah’s vision of all nations flowing toward the mountain of the Lord (Isaiah 2:1–5), her wisdom becomes a parish guide for the spiritual pilgrimage we make together.

1. Do not expect to find things exactly as you have them at home.

Isaiah tells us that God is drawing us toward a new world—one where swords become plowshares and fear gives way to peace. To step toward that mountain, we must be willing to let God unsettle us, broaden us, and reshape us. Advent asks us to release our tight grip on routine and welcome the holy differences God places along our path. Grace often comes disguised as unfamiliar ground.

2. Remember that this is a group journey.

In Isaiah’s vision, many peoples walk together toward the Lord’s house. Advent is not a private walk but a communal pilgrimage. This season, we especially remember to keep our **OCIA catechumens and candidates in prayer**. They walk with us toward Christ as they prepare for the sacraments of initiation. Their journey strengthens ours, and our prayers strengthen theirs. No one climbs God’s mountain alone.

3. Do not let fellow pilgrims get on your nerves.

The path can feel crowded. Schedules tighten, emotions rise, and patience wears thin. But Isaiah reminds us that God is teaching all of us His ways. Advent is a time to pause before reacting, to offer extra grace, and to walk gently with one another. When we choose kindness—especially in stressful moments—we help build the peace the prophet foretold.

4. Do not worry.

Worry shrinks the heart, but Advent expands it. Isaiah envisions a world where nations “beat their swords into plowshares”—a world without fear. Let this season teach us that God is already bringing forth His peace. When anxiety surfaces, let it become an invitation to prayer: “Come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.” Christ, the Prince of Peace, is near.

5. Remember that flexibility is virtue.

Life rarely unfolds exactly as planned—and neither does the spiritual life. Yet Isaiah’s pilgrimage imagery tells us that God teaches us as we walk. Flexibility allows us to recognize God’s presence even in detours, delays, or unexpected changes. When we loosen our need for control, we make room for the Spirit to lead us toward God’s mountain of peace.

6. Enjoy the journey and make it memorable.

Isaiah’s vision is joyful: nations streaming toward light, toward instruction, toward peace. Advent is meant to be savored with the same spirit of hopeful anticipation. Take in the prayer, the music, the quiet moments, the small kindnesses. Let this journey shape you. Joy is not a distraction from Advent—it is the fruit of walking faithfully toward Christ.

Caminando hacia el Adviento: Sabiduría peregrina inspirada en Doris Wooten

Durante esta temporada sagrada del Adviento, recordamos la guía amorosa de Doris Wooten, quien pasó años ayudando a la gente a prepararse para viajes sagrados. Sus “Seis Mandamientos para los Peregrinos”, escritos inicialmente para viajeros que visitan lugares santos, describen de forma hermosa lo que significa caminar por el Adviento con propósito. Arraigada este año en la visión de Isaías de que todas las naciones fluyen hacia el monte del Señor (Isaías 2:1–5), su sabiduría se convierte en una guía parroquial para la peregrinación espiritual que hacemos juntos.

1. No esperes encontrar las cosas exactamente como las tienes en casa.

Isaías nos dice que Dios nos está atrayendo hacia un mundo nuevo—uno donde las espadas se convierten en arados y el miedo da paso a la paz. Para acercarnos a esa montaña, debemos estar dispuestos a dejar que Dios nos inquiete, nos ensanche y nos remodele. El Adviento nos pide que sueltemos nuestro firme agarre a la rutina y que demos la bienvenida a las diferencias sagradas que Dios pone en nuestro camino. La gracia a menudo viene disfrazada de terreno desconocido.

2. Recuerda que esto es un viaje en grupo.

En la visión de Isaías, muchas personas caminan juntas hacia la casa del Señor. El Adviento no es un paseo privado, sino una peregrinación comunitaria. Esta temporada, especialmente recordamos mantener a nuestros catecúmenos y candidatos de OCIA en oración. Caminan con nosotros hacia Cristo mientras se preparan para los sacramentos de la iniciación. Su camino fortalece el nuestro, y nuestras oraciones fortalecen el de ellos. Nadie escala solo la montaña de Dios.

3. No dejes que otros peregrinos te saquen de quicio.

El camino puede parecer lleno de gente. Los horarios se ajustan, las emociones se elevan y la paciencia se agota. Pero Isaías nos recuerda que Dios nos está enseñando a todos Sus caminos. El Adviento es un momento para hacer una pausa antes de reaccionar, para ofrecer gracia extra y para caminar suavemente juntos. Cuando elegimos la bondad—especialmente en momentos de estrés—ayudamos a construir la paz que el profeta predijo.

4. No te preocupes.

La preocupación reduce el corazón, pero el Adviento lo amplía. Isaías imagina un mundo donde las naciones “transforman sus espadas en arados”—un mundo sin miedo. Que esta temporada nos enseñe a confiar en que Dios ya está trayendo Su paz. Cuando surja la ansiedad, que se convierta en una invitación a la oración: “Venid, caminemos en la luz del Señor.” Cristo, el Príncipe de la Paz, está cerca.

5. Recuerda que la flexibilidad es virtud.

La vida rara vez se desarrolla exactamente como está planeada, y tampoco la vida espiritual. Sin embargo, la imaginación de la peregrinación de Isaías nos dice que Dios nos enseña mientras caminamos. La flexibilidad nos permite reconocer la presencia de Dios incluso en desvíos, retrasos o cambios inesperados. Cuando aflojamos nuestra necesidad de control, hacemos espacio para que el Espíritu nos guíe hacia la montaña de paz de Dios.

6. Disfruta del viaje y haz que sea memorable.

La visión de Isaías es alegre: naciones fluyendo hacia la luz, hacia la instrucción, hacia la paz. El Adviento está pensado para ser saboreado con el mismo espíritu de esperanza anticipada. Disfruta de la oración, la música, los momentos tranquilos, las pequeñas muestras de bondad. Deja que este viaje te molde. La alegría no es una distracción del Adviento: es el fruto de caminar fielmente hacia Cristo.
