A SUMMARY OF MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.'S PRINCIPLES OF NONVIOLENCE BY FR RICHARD ROHR [09/23/2025]

1. Nonviolence is a way of strength and not a way for cowards. It is a choice, not a resignation. A spirituality, not just a tactic.
2. The goal of nonviolence is always winning the friendship and the understanding of the supposed opponent, not their humiliation or personal defeat. It must be done to eventually facilitate the process of reconciliation, and we ourselves must be willing to pay the price for that reconciliation. King based this on Jesus' lifestyle and death and on Ephesians 2:13–22 and Romans 12:1–2.
3. The opponent must be seen not so much as an evil person, but as a symbol of a much greater systemic evil—of which they also are a victim! We must aim our efforts at that greater evil, which is harming all of us, rather than at the opponent.
4. There is a moral power in voluntarily suffering for the sake of others. Christians call it the “myth of redemptive suffering,” whereas almost all of history is based on the opposite, the “myth of redemptive violence.” The lie that almost everybody believes is that suffering can be stopped by increasing the opponent's suffering. It works only in the short run. In the long run, that suffering is still out there and will somehow have to work its way out in the next generation or through the lives of the victims. A willingness to bear the pain has the power to transform and absorb the evil in the opponent, the nonviolent resister, and even the spectator. This is precisely what Jesus was doing on the cross. It changes all involved and at least forces the powers that be to “show their true colors” publicly. And yes, the nonviolent resister is also changed through the action. It is called resurrection or enlightenment.
5. This love ethic must be at the center of our whole life, or it cannot be effective or real in the crucial moments of conflict.
6. Nonviolence relies on a kind of cosmic optimism which trusts that the universe/reality/God is finally and fully on the side of justice and truth. History does have a direction, meaning, and purpose. God/good is more fundamental than evil. Resurrection will have the final word, which is the very promise of the Jesus event. The eternal wind of the Spirit is with us. However, we should not be naïve; and we must understand that most people's loyalties are with security, public image, and the comforts of the status quo.

UN RESUMEN DE LOS PRINCIPIOS DE LA NO VIOLENCIA DE MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. POR EL PADRE RICHARD ROHR [23/09/2025]

1. La no violencia es una forma de construir fuerza y no de cobardes. Es una elección, no una renuncia. Una espiritualidad, no solo una táctica.
2. El objetivo de la no violencia es siempre ganar la amistad y la comprensión del supuesto oponente, no su humillación o derrota personal. Debe hacerse para facilitar eventualmente el proceso de reconciliación, y nosotros mismos debemos estar dispuestos a pagar el precio de esa reconciliación. Rey basó esto en el estilo de vida y la muerte de Jesús y en Efesios 2:13–22 y Romanos 12:1–2.
3. El oponente debe verse no tanto como una persona malvada, sino como un símbolo de un mal sistémico mucho mayor—¡del que también es víctima! Debemos dirigir nuestros esfuerzos hacia ese mal mayor, que nos está perjudicando a todos, en lugar de hacia el oponente.
4. Hay un poder moral en sufrir voluntariamente por el bien de los demás. Los cristianos lo llaman el “mito del sufrimiento redentor”, mientras que casi toda la historia se basa en lo contrario, el “mito de la violencia redentora”. La mentira que casi todo el mundo cree es que el sufrimiento puede detenerse aumentando el sufrimiento del oponente. Solo funciona a corto plazo. A largo plazo, ese sufrimiento sigue ahí fuera y de alguna manera tendrá que salir adelante en la próxima generación o a través de la vida de las víctimas. La disposición a soportar el dolor tiene el poder de transformar y absorber el mal en el oponente, en el resistente no violento e incluso en el espectador. Esto es precisamente lo que Jesús estaba haciendo en la cruz. Cambia a todos los implicados y al menos obliga a los que mandan a “mostrar su verdadera cara” públicamente. Y sí, el resistente no violento también cambia a través de la acción. Se llama resurrección o iluminación.
5. Esta ética del amor debe estar en el centro de toda nuestra vida, o no puede ser eficaz ni real en los momentos cruciales del conflicto.
6. La no violencia se basa en una especie de optimismo cósmico que confía en que el universo/la realidad/Dios está finalmente y plenamente del lado de la justicia y la verdad. La historia tiene una dirección, un significado y un propósito. Dios/el bien es más fundamental que el mal. La resurrección tendrá la palabra final, que es la promesa misma del evento de Jesús. El viento eterno del Espíritu está con nosotros. Sin embargo, no deberíamos ser ingenuos; y debemos entender que la lealtad de la mayoría de la gente está en la seguridad, la imagen pública y las comodidades del statu quo.

trabajan por restaurar la vida y la dignidad.


Oramos especialmente por los cristianos perseguidos en
