#### WEEKLY REFLECTION

Today the Readings are about faith and prayer, but with a difference. That difference is persistence. We are all encouraged to pray, but many people give up after a few attempts. Others feel that God knows what they need and hears their prayers. Therefore, they need only to ask once. You will see in the following readings that persistence is an important aspect of prayer even to the point of getting others to pray with you for strength and encouragement just as Moses needed help




The Gospel Reading is taken from the Gospel of Luke (18:1-8). This short parable told by Jesus to His disciples is often misunderstood because of two statements that Jesus, makes. In the opening sentence, Luke says that Jesus encouraged His

disciples (and us) to "pray always." This does not mean that we must be on our knees 24/7. Rather, it means that we should always be in the "spirit" of prayer acknowledging our dependence upon God for all things.

Later, Jesus says: "Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says." Jesus is not condoning what the judge says. Rather He is holding it up as an example of persistence and of how the Divine Judge, God the Father, will listen to our persistent pleas if we remain faithful, particularly in times of need. People in our western culture have difficulty with being dependent upon others for their needs.

Most of us will go to any extreme to avoid asking for help, particularly long-term help. However, when it comes down to the nitty-gritty of our faith, we must acknowledge our dependence upon God for it is only through His love and Grace that we can survive and be saved. After reading, or listening to these scripture passages, we should ask ourselves: "Does my Prayer Life reflect patience and persistence?" Something to think about during your Prayer Time this week

11/3 – Sight & Sound Trip "David"

#### THE COST OF DISCIPLESHIP

Is Jesus being unreasonable? All this man wanted to do was say goodbye to his family before following Jesus. Didn't Elijah permit Elisha to say his goodbyes before leaving? To make matters worse, Jesus' response to the two other would-be disciples seems a little rigid, even unwelcoming. Was Jesus actually trying to discourage these people from following him? If you're suspecting that something deeper is going on here, you're probably right.



First, it helps to remember how this passage fits into Luke's timeline: we have just learned that Jesus is now "resolutely" traveling to Jerusalem. The hour of his passion is drawing near. Luke is showing us a new sense of urgency in Jesus' life and message. There just isn't time left for secondary things – even good, important things. For those individuals whom the Lord is calling, it's now or never.

Second, we don't know how they responded to Jesus' words. Maybe there was more to the conversation, we don't know that either. That's because Luke is actually more interested in encouraging us, his readers, to follow Jesus than in recounting the details of an event long past. As one commentator has put it, we may not know how they responded, but we do know what our own response ought to be. There's no doubt about it; this is a hard word to hear. But Jesus knows how challenging it can be. He knows that he is asking a lot of us. He also knows how much grace he has stored up to help you. He has already determined to forgive you when you fall and to encourage you when the going gets tough. He is

never one to issue a command and then wait for you to fail at it. No, he will do everything he can to help you accomplish it – short of overpowering your free will, of course!

WHY WE SING AT MASS

The idea of Catholics being expected to sing at Mass might remind us of the Happy Birthday song. Perhaps sometimes we feel awkward when we sing it, but we know it's we should join in. Do we wonder how people will tolerate (or not) our singing voices? Do we wonder to whom the song is addressed or for what purpose we sing?

The Second Vatican Council teaches in *Sacrosanctum Concilium* (The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy) that all who are present at Mass should fully and actively participate by rite of baptism. This participation makes Christ truly present in the celebration of the liturgy, in the same manner as he is present in the word, the sacraments (especially the Eucharist), and the celebrant. *For as the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops says in "Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship," when the church prays and sings, Christ is present.* 

In our participation in word and song, Christ is revealed and made present to us. Our singing serves as a crucial part of the greater mystery we are celebrating: Christ's sacrifice being united to the Father through the Holy Spirit. Why sing at Mass? To make this a reality!

We may not always be in the mood to sing. Perhaps our hearts are heavily burdened with fear and despair, especially in our current world, seemingly torn by strife, sickness, and racism. Again, in "Sing to the Lord," the U.S. bishops speak well of our participation and the occasional challenges we face when singing at Mass: "Sometimes, our voices do not correspond to the convictions of our hearts. At other times, we are distracted or preoccupied by the cares of the world. But Christ always invites us to enter into song, to rise above our own preoccupations, and to give our entire selves to the hymn of his Paschal Sacrifice for the honor and glory of the Most Blessed Trinity.
