PASTOR REPORT

Dear Parishioners-

Please welcome Fr. Lawrence Villone from Omaha, Nebraska and a member of the Missionaries of the Blessed Sacrament. In his bio, it states, "Rev. Fr. Lawrence Villone is a very dynamic preacher and missionary. He is highly successful in establishing Perpetual Adoration Chapels in various parishes and communities around the United States and in other countries. Personally, he has opened up over 200 Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapels over the last several years. In addition, Fr. Villone has given numerous missions on devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, Adoration, and Eucharistic spirituality as well as a variety of other inspirational topics. Please remember: Each and every Sacrament can be found in Scripture (Matthew 28, 1 Peter 3, Acts 22, -Baptism John 20:23-Reconciliation, John 6, 1 Cor. 11, -Eucharist, Acts 8-Confirmation, Ephesians 5-Marriage, 1 Timothy 4-Holy Orders, James 5:14-Anointing of the Sick) Second,, the bible does not claim to be the sole source of authority. (see 2 Thess. 2:15, John 21:25). Third, we have the Eucharist which is the Real Presence of Jesus. (John 6-Bread of Life Discourse) and many walked away from Jesus as he was telling them to 'eat his flesh and drink his blood.' (John 6:66). The early Christian Church were sent to the lions, crucified, or used as human torches for their belief in the Real Presence (The God Eaters). Fourth, even those from other Christian faith traditions will admit that we were the first Christian Church-as we can trace our history back to the apostles (Matthew 16) and early Church fathers (ie. St. Ignatius of Antioch who first coined the term 'Catholic' in 107 A.D. to the Church in Smyrna, St. Polycarp, St. Irenaeus, St. Augustine just to name a few) If you have any questions, regarding the letter, please do not hesitate to call me and make an appointment. Time for Medicare Part D Check-Up

The Social Concerns Committee is holding its annual Medicare Part D Check-Up on Saturday, November 16 from 8 a.m.- 4 p.m. and Sunday, November 17 from 8 a.m. – 3:15 p.m. During this time anyone on Medicare can get a comparison done of Medicare drug plans for 2020. Every year the plans can change the drugs they cover, their premiums, deductibles and co-payments. At last year's check-up the average savings was \$367 per person with total savings of \$8,454. The Committee is asking that you sign-up for a time to get your comparison done. They will be available after Masses on November 1 & 2 and 9 & 10 to take sign-up
