PASTOR REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

Happy Independence Day Weekend! The last time we had this happen was five years ago-2015. I found out some interesting tidbits about the History of our own Independence Day taken from history.com. "When the Revolutionary War broke out in April 1775, very few colonists wanted complete independence from Great Britain and those that did were considered quite radical. However, by June, more and more colonists had come to favor independence from England, thanks to the growing hostility and spread of the revolutionary sentiments, particularly by Thomas Paine with his bestselling pamphlet, Common Sense, put out in early 1776. By June 7, Richard Henry Lee, the Virginia delegate introduced a motion calling for the colony's independence. His resolution was postponed after much heated debate, but then, a five-man committee was appointed (Thomas Jefferson of Virginia, John Adams of Massachusetts, Roger Sherman of Connecticut, Benjamin Franklin of Pennsylvania, and Robert R. Livingston of New York) to draft a statement justifying the break with England."

"On July 2, the Continental Congress voted in favor of Lee's resolution for independence in a near unanimous vote (New York abstained but later voted in the affirmative). On July 4, the Continental Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence which was largely written by Thomas Jefferson. Ironically, John Adams believed the correct date should have been July 2, yet, both he and Jefferson would die on the 50th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1826. " "The Earliest celebrations of the 4th of July began with some colonists holding mock funerals for King George III as a way of symbolizing the end of the monarchy's hold on America and the triumph of liberty during the summer of 1776. Festivities which included concerts, bonfires, parades and firing of cannons and muskets usually accompanied the first public readings of the Declaration of Independence beginning immediately after its adoption. Philadelphia held its first annual commemoration of Independence Day on July 4, 1777. In 1870, the U.S. Congress made July 4th a federal holiday; in 1941, the provision was expanded to grant a paid holiday to all federal employees." 
