

On this Sunday within the Octave of Christmas, we are celebrating the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The Feast of the Holy Family is not just about the Holy Family, but about our own families too. The main purpose of the Feast is to present the Holy Family as the model for all Christian families. This feast reminds us that, as the basic unit of the universal Church, each family is called to holiness.

As we read in today's passage of the Gospel, Mary and Joseph taught Jesus to love God and God's Law. They taught him how to be faithful to God by going to the Temple to worship him in love. These are lessons for us, too, my dear brothers and sisters. We have to take our children to church! We have to pray with them and talk to them all the time about Jesus and his teachings. We have to make the beautiful truths of our faith and the habits of our devotions a natural and ordinary part of everyday family life. As Mary and Joseph taught Jesus — we also have to teach our children how to listen for God's calling in their lives. A parent's duty as "first and best teachers of their children in the faith" is to be an example of lived faith for their children (Rite of Baptism for Children).

On the Feast of the only perfect Family that ever lived on this earth, all parents might examine themselves and see how well they are fulfilling the grave responsibility which God has placed on them. Fr. Antony in his reflection said; as they heard during their marriage ceremony: "children are a gift from God to you." Children serve as the joy of their parents' young years and the help and comfort of their old age, but above and beyond that, they are a gift for which their parents are accountable before God, as they must, in the end, return these, His children, to Him. Let us pray for the grace of caring for one another in our own families, for each member of the parish family, and for all families of the universal Church. May God bless all our families in the New Year.


