Keeping In Touch With Fr. Larry

This weekend at the 9:45 Mass, we will honor all of our 2015 Graduates. While most of them will be completing high school, we congratulate all of our students completing their studies from the youngest to the oldest. Whether you are continuing your education or beginning a career, we ask God to bless you all the days of your life. Whatever you do, wherever you go, may God be with you and may you always be with God.

As the Parish Council and Commissions will take a short break during the summer, I wish to thank all of them who work so hard all year long. Some are ending their term, some are beginning, others are in the middle somewhere. All of us bring our gifts and talents to work together and make St. Therese of Lisieux Parish the best that it can be. We need a few new members. If you are interested, please give me a call.

June 14 is Flag Day. Two thousand fifteen is the 238th birthday of the U.S. Flag. In 1777, the Continental Congress adopted the stars and stripes pattern for the national flag. It was not until 1949 that President Harry Truman signed legislation making Flag Day a day of national observance. A flag is more than a piece of cloth. It reminds us of the government, the principles, the truths, the history which belong to the nation. The American flag deserves our attention and respect.

One of the great heroes of the early days of our country was John Paul Jones. He was a naval officer and to him went the honor of displaying on his ship, for the first time, the national flag of the United States.

Some people may not realize that Francis Scott Key, the author of "The Star-Spangled Banner," composed four stanzas for what became our national anthem. The last stanza is as follows:

*O, thus be it ever when freemen shall stand,
Between their loved home and the war's desolation,
Blest with victory and peace, may the heaven rescued land,
Praise the Power that hath made and preserved us a nation.
Then conquer we must, when our cause it is just,
And this be our motto – "In God is our trust."
And the star-spangled banner in triumph shall wave,
O'er the land of the free, and the home of the brave.*

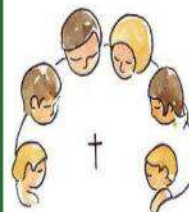

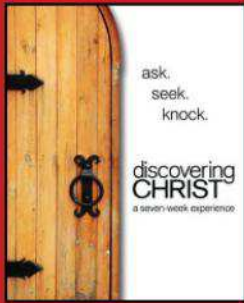

Starting This Fall

St Therese of Lisieux Presents:

Discovering Christ;

a program of ChristLife



What is "Discovering Christ?"

A joyful seven week experience where participants explore the meaning of life and consider how and where Jesus Christ fits into their life. The experience includes a faith encounter with the Holy Spirit.

Who should attend?

Anyone with an open mind and heart who wishes to explore, revitalize or deepen their faith. Whether certain, uncertain, struggling with faith, or wishing to grow as a disciple of Christ – this program is for you.

Where did this program come from and why is our parish doing this?

"Discovering Christ," was developed by the ChristLife Catholic Ministry in the Archdiocese of Baltimore, Maryland and has been used throughout the United States. As we at St. Therese seek to become an "Evangelizing Parish," it is our desire to share the 'Good News' with all people.

What should I expect?

Expect a friendly and supportive atmosphere where everyone is made comfortable and nurtured to explore their relationship with Jesus. A typical session includes a social meal, fellowship, video teaching and small group discussion.

Music and prayer are an important part of the experience, as well. The program is comprised of seven sessions with an onsite retreat scheduled on **Saturday, October 24th**.

When is it being held?

The program will be offered **Thursday evenings** from **6:45PM to 9:15PM**, beginning September 17th.

What if I miss a session, can I still attend?

Yes. While each session explores important themes, we realize sickness or vacations might result in missing a session. We still encourage you to participate. We can help you "catch-up" at a subsequent session.

Is there a cost?

No. The program is being offered at no cost.

How do I register?
