Keeping In Touch With Fr. Larry

Fathers are among the least praised and most important people in the world. They are often taken for granted and, like most necessities of a good life, fathers are only conspicuous when absent. Volumes of praise have been dedicated to motherhood's beauty and warmth. But how can one put into words all the feelings, the unspoken love, the quiet strength of fatherhood? What can be said to a good father?

A good Dad is different from a good Mother in many important ways. Between mother and child there is that unbreakable code which nearly guarantees love. No matter what a child may do or become, a mother's love is always there. A Father's love, though, asks something of the child. Certainly we expect some "just-because" love from our father, but beyond this he is the first person whose love and approval we can actually earn. A mother's love is a comfort because it cannot be lost, father's love is a treasure because it can be won.

What does a good father ask of his children? No more than they can give. He asks that they be themselves. He teaches them to do so by his own example. He asks them to respect others and shows them how by recognizing the worth of each person. He shows them how to be honest and kind, fair and gracious. He shows them how to be strong enough to cry, brave enough to take as well as to give.

A good father challenges his children to develop their unique gifts and not to be anyone's shadow. A good father sees his children as a gift of life to be cherished and nurtured but never possessed, to be loved and enjoyed but never used, to be gently sculpted and guided but never manipulated or broken. He joyfully returns them to life when adulthood comes. A good father does not see his child's youthful vigor as a threat to his own mellowing energies. Rather, he encourages, supports and comforts at every stage of life. He disciplines only in the name of teaching and with the firm gentleness of love.

What can one say to such a man, to be a father who is good, strong, loving and wise?

All the common expressions of words and gifts can never contain the feelings of a child for a dad. Sometimes silent ways are the most powerful: in our meeting eyes, our wrestling together, our quiet moments together.

Perhaps the best way to show a Dad how dear, how good, how irreplaceable he is, would be to live out the goodness and values he taught us and make them our own. This is your day. Enjoy it!





Saints of the Week

June 22: St. Paulinus of Nola

Bishop (c. 353-431)



Born a noble in France, he married and was baptized and then moved to Spain. He became a priest, and they moved to Nola, where they lived a semi-monastic lifestyle and used their riches to help pilgrims and the poor. Paulinus was then named bishop of Nola. He was a friend and correspondent with other saints of his time: Ambrose, Augustine, Martin of Tours, and Jerome. May we also use our riches to help others and learn that "not riches, but our use of them, is what is blameworthy or acceptable to God."

June 22: St. John Fisher

Bishop & Martyr (c. 1469-1535)

A brilliant theologian, John was ordained, taught theology at Cambridge, and became bishop of Rochester. When King Henry VIII wanted to annul his marriage to Catherine of Aragon, John defended the queen. When John refused to sign the Act of Succession recognizing the king's divorce in opposition to Papal authority, the king imprisoned John for treason. When the pope made John a cardinal, the angry king had John beheaded. John's friend Thomas More said about him: "In this realm no one man, in wisdom, learning, and long approved virtue together, meet to be matched and compared with him."



June 22: St. Thomas More

Martyr (c. 1478-1535)



Thomas was a lawyer, a member of Parliament, a scholar, and a public official. He became Lord Chancellor but resigned after opposing the king's desire for a divorce. He retired from public life, but when he refused to accept Henry VIII's Act of Succession (see above), he was imprisoned. There he wrote letters of consolation to his family and other spiritual works. He was beheaded fourteen days after John Fisher. Like Thomas, may we learn to be "the king's good servant, but God's first."

June 24: The Nativity of St. John the Baptist

This is one of the earliest feasts to be celebrated on a particular day; June 24 was chosen to remind us that John was six months older than Jesus (Luke 1:26). Luke relates the various events surrounding his birth (Luke 1:5-80). Like John, may we learn that "he (Jesus) must increase, I must decrease."



June 27: St. Cyril of Alexandria

Bishop and Doctor of the Church (c. 376-444)



The archbishop of Alexandria, Cyril presided at the Council of Ephesus. He argued against Nestorius that the divine and human in Christ were so closely united that Mary was the mother of Jesus and the mother of God (Theotokos). The condemnation of Nestorius led to a schism that engaged Cyril until his death. May we recognize that "all of us are united with Christ inasmuch as we have received him who is one and indivisible in our bodies. Therefore we owe our service to him rather than to ourselves."

What are Prayer Requests?

Every Monday, at 2PM, everyone is welcome to pray the rosary. During the warmer months the rosary is prayed in the Rosary Garden, otherwise we meet in the church.

When praying the rosary, the participants pray for any special prayer request one may have. Examples of requests are: strength in finding a job, marital issues, guidance for children, etc.

The Prayer Intention Box is located by the tabernacle in the church. Forms are there to be filled out, then placed in the box.

All of us have a need for prayer on a regular basis and as Jesus said: "Where two or more are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst."

Matthew 18:20

This gives each of us the spiritual strength we need in the crossroads of our lives.

What is the Prayer List?

Each week, we publish names in the bulletin for those in our parish who have a variety of health issues and would like to be prayed for. We also publish those who are serving our country by adding them to our military list.

To have a name entered on either list is a very simple process. In the Gathering Space is a table with forms to submit the names. Simply fill the form out and place it in the brown box. Each week the names will be collected and placed on the list. After three months, the name will be removed. If there is a need for the name to remain on, please fill out another form.

<u>Please note</u>: You <u>MUST</u> have permission from the individual you are placing in the paper. That is not the case for the military list. However, it is important that you include the branch of service.




He Calls Each One of Us...
