

#### PARAGRAPH ELEMENTS

- 1. Topic sentence: What's the paragraph about? (genre, title, author, idea)
- 2. Summary: Keep the summary brief. Write only the most important events. This should be no more than 3-5 sentences. An effective summary doesn't include opinion.
- **3. First example:** Explain how Jack is developing as a character.
- 4. Cite textual evidence: Provide a quote that illustrates the character development and cite it in MLA format. A quote cannot stand alone: it needs to be introduced.
- 5. Explain: How does the quote shows this?
- 6. Second example: Provide another example of development.
- 7. Cite textual evidence: Provide a quote that illustrates Jack's character development and cite it in MLA format.
- 8. Concluding statement: provide a final thought on Jack.
