

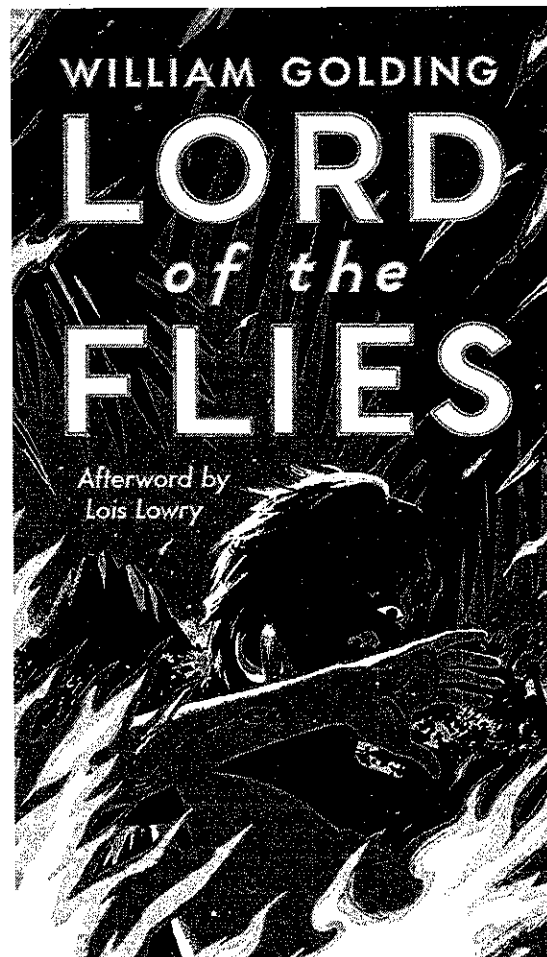

All work is due on the first day of school. Students should write in complete sentences.

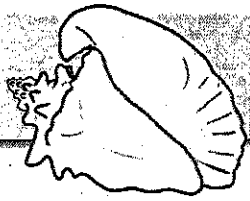

In a 1-2 paragraph response, briefly summarize the events from chapters 3-4 and identify two examples of how Jack is developing into an antagonist.



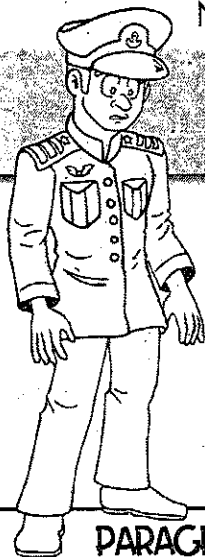
### PARAGRAPH TITLE

4. **Cite textual evidence:** Provide a quote that illustrates the character development and cite it in MLA format. A quote cannot stand alone; it needs to be introduced.
5. **Explain:** How does the quote shows this?
6. **Second example:** Provide another example of development.
7. **Cite textual evidence:** Provide a quote that illustrates Jack's character development and cite it in MLA format.
8. **Concluding statement:** provide a final thought on Jack.

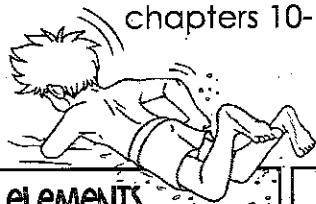

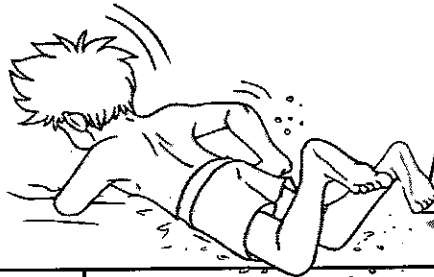
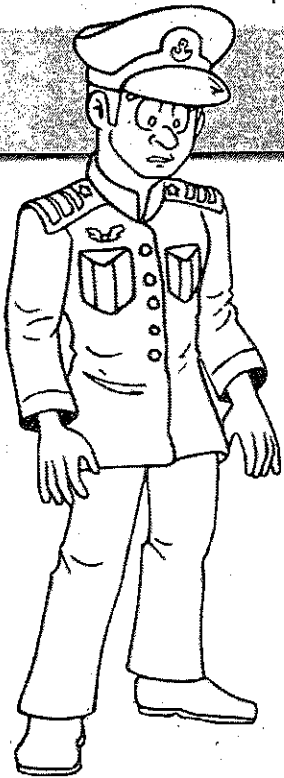
