

Fourth Graders, keep your math skills sharp!



Our third graders have been busy all year learning new math skills. Mastery of all these skills is extremely important to develop a solid math foundation. Research shows that for skills to be permanently mastered that they must be continually practiced. To prevent the summertime “skill slump”, students are going to use the IXL math program. This site allows students to continue to practice their math skills with feedback and instructional guidelines.

Students must sign into their IXL account. Once they are in, they should be brought right to the “MY IXL” tab. On the right-hand side, they should see a box with a picture of an arena and “keep your levels up to date” underneath. They then need to click on “see your action plan”. Once this opens, it’ll show exactly what skills under which standard they need to complete. They simply click on a skill and get to work. It is expected that all students complete at least 2 skills per week over the course of the summer. Students should work until they achieve at least an 80% on each skill before moving on to the next one.
