

HOLY EASTER GREETINGS to EVERYONE!

Christ isn't in the tomb, He now lives in your **heart**, and becomes the love that will protect life's sanctity and defend human dignity.

Christ isn't in the tomb, He's now the **candle** in your hands, to light other's journey and yours towards the Kingdom of God.

THE EASTER OCTAVE

Easter time lasts fifty days: seven weeks of seven days (seven equals Biblical perfection) plus one day: perfection plus! Like an eight-day Jewish wedding, or a child who can't bear to let go of Christmas, birthdays, and school vacation, the Church celebrates the Easter Octave: "the marriage of heaven and earth," as the Vigil calls Jesus' resurrection; our new members' baptismal rebirth; our renewal of baptismal vows; our hearts' "divine vacation" (Latin *vacare*, "to be empty"), newfound time and space for love of God and neighbor. Make home an Easter garden! Adorn the dining table with a pillar candle (your "paschal candle"), a bowl full of water a vase of flowers or bowl of sprouting grain with Easter eggs. Even non-singers can handle the three-fold Gospel Alleluia! Let that be your grace before meals, perhaps with a prayer recalling Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35): "Be known to us, Risen Lord Jesus, as you were to the first disciples, in your word, in the breaking of bread, and in everyone we meet."

RE: Diocese of San Bernardino Corona Virus Response

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

After much prayer to Our Lord Jesus and reflection with the People of God, and in light of new developments, Bishop Barnes has provided us with the following authoritative guidance and protocols on our Diocesan response to the ongoing public health crisis. Please review these points carefully. All of these points go into effect in the Diocese of San Bernardino IMMEDIATELY and UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

I. PARISH LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS:

A. THE HOLY EUCHARIST/MASS:

- Effective immediately, all Masses in the Diocese of San Bernardino are suspended as to public celebrations. This means ALL daily and weekend Masses at all parishes, missions, chapels, hospitals and any and all outdoor Masses anywhere in the Diocese, including the Diocesan Pastoral Center. This suspension is effective immediately and will continue until further notice.

- The priests of the Diocese are asked to celebrate and offer daily Mass in private according to liturgical and canonical norms. Mass intentions accepted at the parish are to be offered by priests of the Diocese. We shall keep our Diocese alive through our daily Eucharistic practice as priests.
- PARISH CHURCHES, CHAPELS, AND MISSIONS are to be closed to the public immediately and until further notice. You may not open your parish church, chapel, or mission for whatever reason, except as noted below under the norm for Weddings.
- Our Diocese will be increasing the use of digital media to assist our people to remain engaged in their Catholic Faith. This will include a regular livestreamed Mass and other opportunities for collective prayer. Many additional spiritual resources will be posted regularly on our Diocesan website. Please consult our website in these days.

B. RECONCILIATION/CONFESSiON:

- Individual Confessions and Communal Penance Services are suspended immediately. You should not have any Confessions at all at your parishes.
- The only Confessions allowed are those to be heard for penitents in danger of death.

C. ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

- Priests are permitted to administer the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion to parishioners who are ill in their homes. However, such sick calls must be in accordance with any health department directives in place.
- Priests may visit hospitals and convalescent homes to administer the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion, but only with the permission of such hospitals and convalescent homes and in accordance with any health department directives in place.

- You may ask Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to assist in taking Holy Communion only to those parishioners who are already on your sick call list or who are legitimately added to your sick call list.
- D. BAPTISMS: Any and all Baptisms are suspended, only with the exception of cases of persons who are in danger of death.
- E. WEDDINGS: All scheduled weddings must be postponed to a later date if possible. If postponement is not possible, the Order of Celebrating Matrimony without Mass (Chapter II of The Order of Celebrating Matrimony) may take place at a parish but only in the presence of the priest/deacon, the bride and the groom, the 2 witnesses, the parents of bride/groom, and others not to exceed 10 persons (inclusive of the priest or deacon).
- F. FUNERALS: There are to be NO funeral Vigils or Masses. The only funeral rite permitted is the Rite of Committal (graveside); no more than 10 persons may attend the Rite of Committal (inclusive of the priest or deacon).
- G. FIRST HOLY COMMUNIONS: All of these must be put on hold and a decision will be evaluated on April 5th.
- H. CONFIRMATIONS: All of these are on hold and a decision will be evaluated on April 5th.
- I. HOLY WEEK AND TRIDUUM SERVICES: A decision will be made on April 1st on whether these services will be celebrated by parishes.
- J. CHRISM MASS: A decision will be made on April 1st regarding the Chrism Mass. The Ecclesial Dinner is cancelled.

II. PARISH OPERATIONS:

- A. All parish offices must be and will be *closed to the public*, but you should still keep the parish office open to answer telephone calls and to review emails, as well as to process parish mail.

- B. Pastors, Administrators, and Pastoral Coordinators are to determine which parish staff members are essential for daily parish operations. These essential staff members must continue to work at the parish office. Other parish staff members are to be allowed to work from home.
- C. All parish staff members are to continue to receive their hourly pay or salary. Please consult with the Office of Human Resources and the Office of Payroll regarding details on payroll and employment issues. Please consult with the Office of Human Resources if any essential staff members object to working at the parish.
- D. **PLEASE NOTE:** All parish religious education classes, Stations of the Cross, formation classes, prayer groups, Eucharistic adoration, retreats of any kind, Quinceañeras, and all festivals, fiestas, carnivals and all parish activities must be suspended effective immediately and until further notice, whether these activities take place at the parish or take place off site. There will be no exceptions.
- E. Food pantries and food banks must be kept open to distribute food supplies to persons. All soup kitchens or sit-down meals of any kind must be closed immediately. Only take-out meals may be served to our needy brothers and sisters.

III. DIOCESAN PASTORAL CENTER (DPC) OPERATIONS:

- Diocesan staff will be available by email or telephone
- ALL meetings, seminars, conferences, and gatherings scheduled at the DPC site and the Rezek Centre site are cancelled effective immediately
- NO ministry events will take place at the DPC or the Rezek Centre site until further notice
- Diocesan staff may hold meetings by telephone conference
- Bishops are not available for any parish events, commitments, or meetings until further notice
- DPC staff over 65 years of age or DPC staff with underlying health issues will be asked to work from home

Please note that this comprehensive Diocesan Response is intended to be our Church's contribution in our local community response to the ongoing Corona Virus crisis. As an important member of the Inland Empire community, we must take effective and dedicated steps in dealing with this crisis, while keeping our Catholic Faith alive here in the Diocese of San Bernardino.

As developments rapidly change, please contact the Office of the Bishop if new regulations are issued for your city or locality by local government agencies. We are aware that we will need to adapt to the regulations of both the County of Riverside and the County of San Bernardino and their localities.

On behalf of both Bishop Barnes and Bishop Rojas, thank you for your dedicated ministry and heroic service in support of the spiritual well being of our 1.7 million Catholics. If you have any question or concern, please contact me or Reverend Erik L. Esparza, Director of the Office of Priest Personnel.

May Our Lord Jesus bless you with strength and good health. May Our Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Guadalupe, and Saint Bernardine of Siena intercede for us from Heaven.

"SEEDS OF FAITH"


There is a brevity, a certain terseness, in the scripture readings for Easter Sunday. Peter's speech in Acts is built of direct, pointed sentences. Paul's letters are based on straightforward creed-like statements. Even the Gospel story only briefly recounts what will turn out to be one of the most remarkable events in human history—the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Advertising agents call these encapsulated points of information “bullet points.” Scripture scholars call them *kerygmata*, or “kernels” of our faith. Actually, “kernels” or “seeds” are good terms for these statements, since throughout the Easter season, we will hear in the Acts of the Apostles, the Letters of Paul, and the Gospel accounts of the days following the Resurrection exactly how these *kerygmata* began to flower, how they continued to grow through the life of the early church. May these Easter “seeds” of faith serve a similar purpose for us, too, so that the life of the Risen Christ will flourish in us and through our witness in the coming days.

HE is RISEN!

On the first Easter, it seems as if practically everyone but the enemies of Jesus had forgotten that he said he would rise on the third day.

In the Gospel accounts, only those who opposed Jesus are reported as remembering that he predicted his death and resurrection. They assumed that his followers would also remember and attempt to steal his body as “proof” that he had risen from the dead, so they asked the Romans to post a guard at the tomb. They need not have bothered since the disciples had apparently forgotten—or completely misunderstood—what Jesus had told them over and over. Instead, the fearful Apostles were in hiding, and the women were planning to anoint a dead body.

However, just as the failure of those closest to Jesus to believe in his Resurrection led to the proclamation of the Jesus's living presence throughout the world, so can we grow in faith and trust in his living presence as well. Though the mysteries of the Faith are not readily understood, we should ask for the grace to believe--to grow in the virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity. With these gifts, we have the power to



recognize the importance of the Resurrection, and how it can transform our lives. Alleluia, he is risen. He is risen indeed.

Sometimes we say that we believe Jesus rose from the dead without really thinking about what we are saying. Take some time to prayerfully consider what it means to you in your daily life that Jesus has truly conquered death and is alive.

DIGGING DEEPER FOR DISCUSSION

Reflect on these following questions with a friend or family:

- Who forgot that Jesus said he would rise again? Who remembered?
- How did the presenter define **faith**? How did he define **hope**?
- Who does the presenter suggest was the first person to see the Risen Lord? Why might that person have been the first?

PRAYER: Picture yourself in a room with the other disciples early on that first Easter Sunday. Suddenly Mary Magdalene bursts through the door and announces that someone has taken Jesus’s body out of the tomb. What is your first thought? Would you remember that Jesus said he would rise again on the third day? What would you do in response to this announcement?

RESOLUTION: Sometimes we say that we believe Jesus rose from the dead without really thinking about what we are saying. Take some time to prayerfully consider what it means to you in your daily life that Jesus has truly conquered death and is alive.



I Cristo resucitó! ¡En verdad resucitó! Este saludo pascual es tradicional en la Iglesia católica oriental y ortodoxa y el Domingo de Pascua. Luego está la aclamación jubilosa de san Agustín: ¡Somos personas pascuales y el aleluya es nuestro canto! De la manera que lo expreses, la pascua es un tiempo para alegrarse porque Jesucristo, nuestro amigo y hermano, resucitó de la muerte. Y aun así las Escrituras de hoy son menos jubilosas de lo que uno esperaría para la celebración más importante en el calendario cristiano. Quizás se nos pide mirar más profundamente al misterio de la Resurrección, así como Pedro fue al sepulcro a ver más profundamente el misterio del sepulcro vacío.

María Magdalena, quien amaba mucho al Señor hasta arriesgar todo posiblemente su propia vida, para ir al sepulcro antes del amanecer, encontrando la piedra removida y asumir que alguien había robado el cuerpo de Jesús. Temerosa y triste, ella corre a decirle a Pedro y a Juan. Luego ellos corren hacia el sepulcro, ¿pero, que era lo que ellos esperaban ver? Pedro entra a la tumba y ve. Juan entra, ve y cree. Pero, ¿qué es lo que él cree? Las

Escrituras lo dicen: "Y es que hasta entonces, los discípulos no habían entendido la Escritura, según la cual Jesús tenía que resucitar de entre los muertos". Fueron a casa, sin realmente saber lo que había pasado. Pero Juan "creyó" algo.

ALGO PASÓ

¿Qué creemos nosotros? En algún lugar entre esa mañana de Pascua y la enseñanza convencida de Pedro de la lectura del libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, algo (Cristo resucitado) pasó. Pedro maduró de su desconcierto hacia hacerse un testigo de la Resurrección.

¿Quiénes somos nosotros en la tumba vacía? Quizá la lectura a los colosenses tenga una respuesta. Al entrar a la tumba vacía de nuestras vidas y buscar al Señor, vemos, creemos, morimos, para resucitar con Cristo. "Han muerto, y su vida está escondida con Cristo en Dios" (Colosenses 3:3) Y resucitaremos en la gloria con él.




