Dear Holy Easter People of God!

LOVE is the crown jewel of today's gospel, Jesus said: **"Whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him."**

Jesus' love is our lifeline to his Father. Let's embrace his love and let it flourish in our hearts, because God's love is a promise, never forgotten and never fails!

Read this story about a love which is a total self-giving:

One day, a man - an electrician, was fixing traffic lights, made a mistake and cut the wrong wire. At once his entire body was burned. He fell to the ground and was rushed to the hospital. He survived but he would be badly disfigured for life, crippled and ugly to look at. When he realized his situation, he called his wife and said, **"Forget all about me. I'm no use to you now. You're free to leave me. I don't want to be a heavy burden to you."** With tears in her eyes, the wife replied: **"Honey, I didn't marry you for your appearance or for your money. I married you because I love you. Do you remember what we promised to each other: 'for better or for worse; for richer or for poorer, for sickness and in health, until death do us part.' I will never leave you. I love you now, more than ever."**

What would you do if you were the wife? I believe that there is a chance you will leave. You might even say, **"Thank you, good bye!"**

But the answer of the wife tells us more about her love-covenant with her husband. That is **LOVE**, true and faithful love springing from the words of Jesus: **"I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you... and I will love you..."**

And this love catches us wherever we are, whenever we need him, like: "When we are down, God's love lifts us up and inspires us; when we sin, God's love forgives us; when we betray each other, God's love reconciles us. It's a love that never gives up!

Our love for everyone must be the same, as God's love; because that love is still the love 2000 years ago – the same today and the same in heaven. It's a love with all your mind, soul, strength, and with all your heart.

Remember, **LOVING is a mission that never ends.**

SAINT RITA OF CASCIA (1381– 1457)

If you're ever in Philadelphia on May 22, forget parking anywhere near Saint Rita's shrine. Cars line streets and fill medians as throngs pack a candlelight vigil and six Masses, honoring this patroness of lost causes, hopeless situations, and—as her statue in countless churches built by twentieth-century immigrants testifies—difficult marriages, troubled homes and alienated children. Wise people warn, be careful what you pray for. "Divine Savior," Rita prayed, "let me suffer like you!" Obedient to parents who refused her wish to become a nun, Rita married a man who returned her devotion with twenty years of abuse. When enemies murdered him, Rita's two sons swore revenge. Paintings depict her pointing the angry boys toward Christ crucified, whom she begged to restrain them. Within the year, both sons died. Alone now, Rita went to the convent but was refused. The nuns feared violence, since one of them was related to the murderer. Rita arranged peace between the families, made vows, and became much sought after as a counselor and intercessor for forty years on earth—and ever since in heaven.

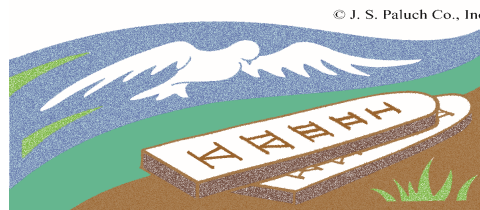

"What is the reason for your hope?" Imagine somebody coming up to you and asking you that question. Not "What are you hoping for?" or "What are you hoping to do?" No, this isn't about our desires for possessions or aspirations for life, it's "Why do you hope?" Peter today tells us that we ought to be ready to give an answer to this question. Truth be told, few of us spend much time thinking about why we hope. Luckily, the scriptures today give us our answers. We hope because Christ suffered for us, in order that we might come to God. We hope because we know that, in the Spirit, God grants us another Advocate through Christ to remain with us always. No matter what we might hope for, whatever we might hope to do, we must always first know and proclaim the reason for our hope: the presence of God in Christ, with us through the power of the Spirit.

On April 24, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom announced the launch of a first-in-the-nation **Great Plates Delivered** program. The program is designed to support adults 65 and older and adults 60-64 who are at high-risk from COVID-19, in staying home and staying healthy by delivering three (3) nutritious meals a day, and also provide essential economic stimulus to local businesses and workers struggling to stay afloat during the COVID crisis. The following **Frequently Asked Questions** provide guidance to any individual or local community impacted by this program and choosing to participate.

Program Overview

How does the program work?

Aging and Adult Services will work with multiple local food providers to deliver three (3) nutritious daily meals to qualified individuals enrolled in the program. Each community conducts outreach to senior centers and senior populations to enroll qualified individuals in need. The program is locally managed to ensure the needs of diverse communities within California are addressed individually.

Who qualifies for enrollment into the program?

- Individuals who are 65 or older, or 60-64 and at high-risk as defined by the CDC, including:
 - Individuals who are COVID-19 positive (as documented by a state/local public health official or medical health professional),
 - Individuals who have been exposed to COVID-19 (as documented by a state/local public health official or medical health professional), or
 - Individuals with an underlying condition.
- Individuals must live alone or with one other program-eligible adult
- Participants must not be currently receiving assistance from other state or federal nutrition assistance programs
- Participants must earn no more than 600% of the federal poverty limit
- Individuals must affirm an inability to prepare or obtain meals

How long will the program run?

The program runs until June 10, 2020, which is the timeframe currently approved by FEMA. The state intends on requesting an extension for the Great Plates Delivered program.

Enrollment

How can I enroll into the program if I believe I qualify?

Aging and Adult Services will establish a streamlined process to enter into the program and will conduct a screening process to ensure individuals meet program criteria.

Meal Delivery

Will I be charged for meals delivered?

No, meals are delivered free of charge through this program.

How many meals may be delivered per day?

Each individual is allowed a maximum of three (3) nutritious meals per day.

How are meals selected and delivered?

Aging and Adult Services determines how meals are selected and delivered. Meals meet specific nutritional requirements. Individuals delivering meals are subject to background checks.

The SPIRIT of TRUTH

While our salvation was won by Jesus's Death, our lives in Christ are not completely fulfilled until we receive the Advocate, the Spirit of truth, that Jesus promised to send us.

That Spirit of truth is the Third Person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit. It is only through the Spirit that we are able to enter into the fullness of communion with the Father and the Son and embrace the Good News of the Gospel in our daily lives.

Today's First Reading shows us how that works. Although Jesus himself had passed through Samaria, and even revealed himself as the Messiah to the woman at the well, it wasn't until after the Holy Spirit had come that the people in that region were able to fully accept Philip and his teachings about Jesus. Then, once they were able to accept Jesus through Baptism, Peter and John came, prayed, laid hands on the people, and the Holy Spirit descended upon them.

This reading may shed some light on the important distinction between the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Baptism brings us into the family of God, but Confirmation enables us to live out the Christian message with greater courage and conviction through the Holy Spirit.

Moreover, Jesus says that not only is the Spirit with us, but he also actually remains within us. This is why Jesus tells us that “I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you.” Through the action of the Spirit, we are united in an unprecedented way with God and can truly become his sons and daughters.

Por medio del Espíritu Santo, encontraremos la gracia para vivir con convicción como pueblo cristiano.

San Pedro nos exhorta a que "siempre estemos listos a dar razones de nuestra esperanza a quien nos la pida". Uno de los grandes dones de la fe en nuestras vidas es nuestra esperanza en Jesucristo.
