Dear Holy People of God:

"There is an appointed time for everything...
... a time to be born... to build... to gather..."
(Ecclesiastes 3:1,2a,3b,5a)

And our **time** has come to **REOPEN** St. Paul the Apostle Church for public Masses last June 13th and June 14th. As we entered the Church's courtyard, **WELCOME** signs greeted us. Although limited in number (100 attendees), this was the call of the time to be "reborn, rebuild and regather." Opening slowly but surely, we have to abide with Diocesan Guidelines, State and County orders.

The "**Catholic-Comeback**" was a controlled environment. And it's strange to see covering of faces, practicing 6' distancing, digital sign up, stringent checking of who is attending, shorter Eucharistic Celebration, no songs, controlled gestures, leaving early so that the Church will be cleaned and sanitized for the next Mass, and no socializing after the Mass. In short, a "**dry Mass**," and yet a "**home-coming**."

Yet after almost three months of Eucharistic famine and drought, there was an underlying **blessing** that engages us as a Church – that **blessing** is the grace of "**coming-home**" and be sheltered into a sacred place described by God as: "**the place where you stand is a holy ground.**" (**Exodus 3:5**)

Let's take this time to extend our gratitude to Fr. Michael and members of the Liturgy Committee, in planning conscientiously for the REOPENING of the Church last weekend (June 13th and 14th). Almost three months of waiting. As the saying goes, "God has perfect timing: never early, never late. It takes little patience and a whole lot of faith. But it's worth the wait!"

But our work is just beginning! What follows is the planning for the reopening of the other **Sacraments** and **devotions** which are included in Bishop Barnes' **DECREE**; they are:

Directives on **Funeral Mass; Weddings; Reconciliation** (Confession);
on **keeping the Church open for private devotion**; and **the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament**.

And in that **DECREE**, the other **Sacraments** that will be open in a later date are: **Baptism, Confirmation** and **Anointing of the Sick**. These **Sacraments** need a further review. Please be patient. They will come soon!

Our gratitude goes also to those who, even though hit financially due to COVID-19, consistently extended their generosity through online-giving and continues mailing of their envelopes to the Church, plus those who unequivocally supported the DDF Campaign. Because of your generous hearts, our Church is still in good financial standing in the midst of this critical and challenging times. For all that has been, thanks! For all that will be, yes!



On April 24, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom announced the launch of a first-in-the-nation **Great Plates Delivered program**. The program is designed to support adults 65 and older and adults 60-64 who are at high-risk from COVID-19, in staying home and staying healthy by delivering three (3) nutritious meals a day, and also provide essential economic stimulus to local businesses and workers struggling to stay afloat during the COVID crisis. The following **Frequently Asked Questions** provide guidance to any individual or local community impacted by this program and choosing to participate.

Program Overview

How does the program work?

Aging and Adult Services will work with multiple local food providers to deliver three (3) nutritious daily meals to qualified individuals enrolled in the program. Each community conducts outreach to senior centers and senior populations to enroll qualified individuals in need. The program is locally managed to ensure the needs of diverse communities within California are addressed individually.

Who qualifies for enrollment into the program?

- Individuals who are 65 or older, or 60-64 and at high-risk as defined by the CDC, including:
 - Individuals who are COVID-19 positive (as documented by a state/local public health official or medical health professional),
 - Individuals who have been exposed to COVID-19 (as documented by a state/local public health official or medical health professional), or
 - Individuals with an underlying condition.
- Individuals must live alone or with one other program-eligible adult
- Participants must not be currently receiving assistance from other state or federal nutrition assistance programs
- Participants must earn no more than 600% of the federal poverty limit
- Individuals must affirm an inability to prepare or obtain meals

How long will the program run?

The program runs until June 10, 2020, which is the timeframe currently approved by FEMA. The state intends on requesting an extension for the Great Plates Delivered program.

Enrollment

How can I enroll into the program if I believe I qualify?

Aging and Adult Services will establish a streamlined process to enter into the program and will conduct a screening process to ensure individuals meet program criteria.

Meal Delivery

Will I be charged for meals delivered?

No, meals are delivered free of charge through this program.

How many meals may be delivered per day?

Each individual is allowed a maximum of three (3) nutritious meals per day.

How are meals selected and delivered?

Aging and Adult Services determines how meals are selected and delivered. Meals meet specific nutritional requirements. Individuals delivering meals are subject to background checks.

Do Not Be AFRAID

Jesus was very clear about the cost of discipleship. It might entail family division, persecution, and even death.

He didn't mince words when he talked about the hardships his followers would face. And yet, at the same time he says, "Do not be afraid."

Isn't this a bit of a contradiction? Does it seem odd that Jesus warns us about future difficulties but then tells us not to worry? However, the key to understanding this Sunday's Gospel reading lies in what Jesus means by "fear." First, Jesus is telling us that we should not fear our enemies in this world. We needn't have the kind of stomach churning, heart-pounding fear that comes from being terrified of the persecutions we may face. God the Father knows us even down to the hairs on our head, and he will be with us to help us face whatever sufferings we might encounter.

In today's Gospel, the Lord encourages us, instead of fearing persecution, to have instead a healthy fear of the Lord—which is the fear or awe that a person might have in the presence of a good, noble, and magnificent king. That kind of fear empowers us to live out the Christian life in a heroic, unfearful manner. By trusting in such a good God who will be with us in whatever obstacles we might face, we are

free to be bold in our witness to the Gospel. Now while it's true that some Christians may be asked to give up their lives as a result of following Jesus, for most of us our call to heroism will consist of the daily sacrifices that ordinary life calls for. The sacrifice of forgoing gossip, of enduring insults, of being misunderstood, of holding our tongues and our tempers.

While today's Gospel might seem foreboding, we have nothing to fear. Even the worst thing that could happen--death--has been conquered by Christ's Resurrection.

Reflect on these following questions with a friend or family:

- Why does the presenter in the video say that we shouldn't have fear when faced with difficulties, or even death?
 - In the video, Patrick gives some examples of how we can deny Jesus without putting up a billboard or writing an editorial. What are some of the ways he mentions? What are some others you can think of?



PRAYER: Normally we think of a sparrow falling to the ground as meaning it has died, but the word used here can also be translated to mean "light upon" the ground. Jesus may be saying that not only does the Father know when each sparrow dies, but he also knows each time that it lands upon the ground. Such an intimate knowledge of creation is intended to give us great comfort that God indeed is with us in every moment of our lives.

RESOLUTION: The word “cent” is the translation of a Greek word for a coin that was worth 1/16 of a denarius, the average laborer’s daily wage. In a parallel passage, Luke writes, “Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies?” (Luke 12:6-7; RSV: 2CE). One would assume that if two sparrows cost one cent, then four should cost two pennies, but sparrows were so worthless, a fifth was thrown in by the merchant if a person spent two cents.

En nuestro mundo actual, parece que hay muchas cosas que nos hacen temerosos. Podemos ponernos angustiados por nuestras finanzas personales, relaciones, decisiones medianas que nuestros hijos hacen, problemas en el trabajo, el cambio climático, la manera en que nuestra parroquia es administrada o un millón de otras cosas. Los problemas quizás ni siquiera son malos, sino que solo es la vida y todos sus cambios. Pero estas dificultades son auténticas y algunas veces buscamos soluciones malsanas. Muchas personas sufren problemas de ansiedad y depresión, y la angustia lleva a otras hacia la adicción como una forma de enfrentarlas. En el Evangelio de hoy, Dios amorosamente nos llama de la oscuridad profunda a la luz.

ERES MÁS VALIOSO QUE LOS PÁJAROS

Algunas veces buscamos respuestas complejas cuando una solución simple está frente a nosotros. Al estar escribiendo y viendo por la ventana, veo la mitad de una docena de pájaros pequeños parados en un arbusto. Su presencia nos recuerda al amor de Dios y su cuidado por cada uno de nosotros. Si algo que parece tan

insignificante o fortuito lo conoce Dios, ¡cuánto más nosotros somos amados y cuidados! Toma un momento, mira el mundo alrededor tuyo, respira, inhala y pide la ayuda de Dios en tus necesidades. Dale vuelta a ese asunto y pon tu confianza en un Dios amoroso.

Recuerda, sin embargo, Jesús pocas veces sana sin algún tipo de acción de nuestra parte. Cuando pongas tus preocupaciones en las manos de Dios, quizás pueden ser necesarios otros pasos. ¿Es tiempo de sacar una cita con un profesional? ¿Hora de ponerle nombre al problema? ¿O es el tiempo para confesarse en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación? La fuerza del mal surge por permanecer en la oscuridad. Cuando ya no nos cerramos o sufrimos solos, sino que compartimos nuestras preocupaciones con alguien, podemos empezar a crecer, sanar y empezar a superarlos. Rara vez es mágico o instantáneo. Es un proceso prolongado y difícil. Pero nos aferramos a un recordatorio sencillo, “¡tú eres más valioso que muchos pájaros!”


