DEAR HOLY PEOPLE OF GOD:

In today's gospel, Jesus uses the **parable of the talents** on how we can multiply the gifts of God in our lives. There are varied talents/gifts that God had enshrined in our hearts for our personal consumption. Let's center our reflection in one outstanding gift that we can surely multiply in making our world a "heaven-like" sanctuary: for us to live in and for the next generation to enjoy. That gift is the talent of LOVE! Let our food for the journey be the wisdom of the **first reading** as it tells us how love works in our lives:

"When one finds a worthy wife, her value is far beyond pearls. Her husband, entrusting his heart to her, has an unfailing prize. She brings him good, and not evil, all the days of her life. She... works with loving hands. She reaches out her hands to the poor, and extends her arms to the needy."

We're the husband to whom Jesus entrusted his love with trust. We're the wife who will bring "good to humanity and not evil." And we multiply this love by "reaching out our hands to the poor, and extending our arms to the needy." We become the two servants who multiply their talents to the maximum. We make the talent of love transfigures everyone to become "visible signs of God's love."

We should avoid being the servant who prevented his talent of love to grow. Because if we follow him, we will fall into the trap of the saying, "For evil to triumph is for a good man to do nothing!"

What the world needs now is LOVE! This LOVE must emanate in our hearts, start firing up in every home, then expanding into a community, and continuously multiplying in the world. Then hearts are saying one language – the language of LOVE. At the end, LOVE envelopes the whole of humanity.

Today, in a divided society and challenged by COVID-19, LOVE is what we need to rebuild the earth becomes heaven. COVID-19 cannot lockdown LOVE. Although there is "social distancing," LOVE is visibly connecting every heart; although there is "stay home" guideline, LOVE is making every home a sanctuary of love; and although there is "facial mask wearing," LOVE is a flying kiss flying around.

Take note, LOVE is the "foundation of national respect, the standard of our national discernment, the bedrock of both our personal relationships and civilized society." And to return to a "loving" society, inhabited by "loving" people, let's continue multiplying our talent of love by practicing and living faithfully the eternal words of Jesus:

AS I HAVE LOVED YOU!"**

CHANGE IN WEEKEND MASS SCHEDULE

At this time of year, as we encounter the changes of time and season, we are readjusting our “IN PERSON” Weekend Mass Schedule. The revised schedule is noted below:

5:00pm – “IN PERSON” Courtyard Mass
6:30pm – Livestream Mass (*Spanish*)

SUNDAY


7:00am – “IN PERSON” Courtyard Mass
9:00am – Livestream Mass and VCL*
3:00pm – “IN PERSON” Courtyard Mass
5:00pm – “IN PERSON” Courtyard **Youth Mass**

As with our current “In Person” Masses, you will still need to reserve your seat through our Eventbrite seating system. The reservation system enables us to have immediate contact tracing should the need arise. It also ensures that we do not exceed the maximum number of people for each mass and we will not have to “turn anyone away” from attending the Mass since their seat is already reserved. **NOTE:** If for some reason you will not be able to attend the Mass, please be considerate and **cancel** your reservation, so that someone else may attend the “In Person” Mass. Thank you.

* – VEHICLE COMMUNION IN LINE

- ◆ The *Vehicle Communion Line* is a ***direct continuation*** of the 9:00 a.m. Livestream Mass. In order to receive Communion (Eucharist), you **MUST**:
 - ◆ Have already received your First Communion
 - ◆ Have participated **fully and completely** in the 9:00 a.m. Livestream Mass (i.e., watched and responded throughout the Livestream Mass)
 - ◆ Be in a state of grace
 - Meet the *Eucharistic Fast* requirements (e.g., no food or beverages for **1 hour before** you receive the Eucharist. Noted exception: water and medication)
 - ◆ All cars will enter through Gate #1 on **Boys Republic Drive**.
 - You will **NOT** be parking, but simply entering into the *Vehicle Communion Line*. Please follow the directions of all *Guidance Ministers* as they direct you to one of the Communion distribution points.
 - ◆ Please be aware that you **will** be exiting your vehicle in order to receive Communion (unless you have great difficulty walking).
 - ◆ Please be aware that there is **NO** “upper age limit.” If you meet **all** of the above requirements and you are in good health (i.e., have no symptoms of illness – such as fever, cough, etc.), you are welcome to receive communion.
 - ◆ In keeping with Diocesan guidelines, at this time, Communion will be given **in the hand only**.

Finally, we ask that you bring **hand sanitizer** with you and make sure that everyone in the vehicle is wearing a **face mask** that completely covers your nose and mouth.

To make it easier to obtain a “reservation” for Mass, and to avoid getting a reservation for the wrong parish, please make sure you go directly to our website: www.sptacc.org and follow the instructions.

PLEASE UPDATE YOUR MASS RESERVATIONS:

If for some reason your plans change at the last minute and you will not be able to attend a Mass for which you already have reservations, please be sure to go through our parish website and “**CANCEL**” your reservation(s). That way, someone else can obtain a reservation through our Parish website. We do have a large number of people who “**wait**” at the door to see if anyone is cancelling their reservation(s), so that they can attend the Mass.



ANGEL TOY DRIVE

2020 is going by fast and the Angel Toy Drive is almost here! Due to the effects of the pandemic, our community anticipate this year's requests for toys will reach higher than ever. 
Using Our TALENTS

As we approach the final weeks of Church year, we read the last parable Jesus taught. It's not only the final parable, but it is also one of the longest and most detailed.

In it, Jesus tells the story of a wealthy man who gave each of his servants a substantial sum of money to take care of in his absence. When he returns, he is pleased at the two servants who have doubled his investment, but he is angry at the one who simply hid the money out of fear of losing it.

We can interpret this story on a purely financial level, talking about the need to shrewdly use our money, but the parable goes deeper than that. It also addresses the wise stewardship of the gifts and talents God has given us.

Clearly Jesus is telling us that we must put our abilities at the service of the Master, God our Father. But before we can do that, we have to discern what our gifts are. We all have been given special abilities by God. It's up to us to figure out what those abilities are and how we can best put them into practice.



so that at the end of our lives we will hear the words of the Master telling us, "Well done, good and faithful servant."

DIGGING DEEPER FOR DISCUSSION: FORMED members can watch the short “*Opening the Word*” VIDEO free at sptacc.formed.org Reflect on these following questions with a friend or family:

- The parable of the talents can be read on two levels; one is financial responsibility and a possible lesson in investing. What is the other?
 - What does this parable tell us God expects us to do with our talents?

- *What are some of the talents the presenter talks about that you may possess?*

PRAYER: Think of yourself as one of the servants in the parable. Consider that a talent would be worth about \$300,000 in today's money. How many "talents" has the master given you? Look at them and then, honestly, decide what you would do if you were given responsibility for \$300,000, \$900,000 or \$3,000,000. Would you be excited about investing it, or would you be afraid to lose it? What would you do with that much money? Now focus on your own gifts and abilities. How are you using them? Are you afraid to "invest" them for fearing of losing them?

RESOLUTION: Take a few minutes to write down some of the talents and gifts you possess. Make a decision to take at least one small step in implementing a neglected or undeveloped talent that you can put in the service of others this week.

En la historia de los talentos, quien era la cabeza de la familia deja a los sirvientes “talentos” o dinero, del cual se espera que administren y multipliquen durante la ausencia del patrón. Hoy pensamos que los talentos son una destreza o habilidad innata. Es interesante que esos talentos fueran distribuidos “de acuerdo con sus habilidades” y eso podría significar que hay una cierta intimidad de parte del patrón hacia ellos y que podría conocer sus capacidades. A ellos no se les dieron instrucciones claras como “pon este dinero en el banco,” “inviértelo en donde te paguen intereses” o “con este dinero paga para tomar clases de piano.” Más bien, se nos dice que los bienes se repartieron de manera desigual. Uno recibió cinco, otro recibió dos y el último recibió uno.

DA FRUTO ABUNDANTE:

Cuando la cabeza de familia regresó, los resultados no fueron tan variados como nosotros o nuestras respuestas podrían ser. Algunas personas son multitalentosas y capaces de lograr muchas cosas, como el

sirviente que de cinco obtuvo diez. Otros pueden estar más inclinados a hacer una o dos cosas muy bien y pueden sobresalir en ellas. Aún así, hay algunas que pueden luchar en la vida y lograr muy poco. Pero esos que hicieron uso de sus dones fueron elogiados y se les dijo: “bien hecho, siervo bueno y fiel.” Cuando suceda la segunda venida, el regreso de su patrón, ambos habrán demostrado un esfuerzo. El único en quien el patrón mostró su desilusión fue por el que no hizo ningún esfuerzo, el que estaba como inmovilizado por el miedo o la indiferencia. En el camino hacia el reino, no siempre hay instrucciones claras. Simplemente se nos pide que lo intentemos, que hagamos nuestro mejor esfuerzo. No hay nada en el pasaje que diga que estos sirvientes no hayan cometido errores en el camino, pero su amo los vio, los amó y elogió por sus acciones, sus intentos, como Dios lo hará por nosotros. Y ahora ya conoces el resto de la historia.




