DEAR HOLY PEOPLE OF GOD:

In today's gospel, let's discover the spiritual richness of the encounter between Jesus and the disciples of John; it re-counts:

Jesus... saw them following him and said, "**What are you looking for?**" They said to him, "**Rabbi, where are you staying?**" He said to them, "**Come and you will see.**"

Let's focus on the disciples' question to Jesus: "**Rabbi, where are you staying?**" or maybe translated in this way, "**Where is your home?**" Let's choose the question, "**Where is your home?**" because it might lead us to appreciate how important "**home**" is during Jesus' time.

Jesus' answer is "**Come and see!**" It's an invitation of Jesus to John's disciples, not only to see what they are looking for, but to experience what kind of **home** Jesus provides and what kind of **life** he offers!

Jesus didn't own any **home** when he left Nazareth. His **home** is the home of people he encounters. Let's reflect on these few but profound events in the Gospels where every **house** that Jesus enters, miracles happen:

Zacchaeus' home (Lk 19:1-10)! He was a tax collector and a wealthy man. Jesus notified him: "Zacchaeus...today I must stay at your house." He welcomed Jesus with joy. Later, he said, "... half of my possessions...I shall give to the poor...if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." Jesus affirmed him, "Today, salvation has come to this house... the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." What did the disciples see? They saw conversion in Zacchaeus' heart. **Jesus is a life-changer.**

Peter's home (Mt 8:14-15)! Jesus entered Peter's house, and saw his mother-in-law lying in bed with a fever. Jesus touched her hand; and she was healed; then she served the disciples. What did the disciples see? They witnessed the healing of Peter's mother-in-law. **Jesus is a healer.**

Jairus' home (Mk 5:21-24)! Jairus, a synagogue official, fell at Jesus' feet and begged him, saying, "My daughter is dying. Come, lay your hands on her and she may get well." Jesus went with him, entered the room and commanded the girl, "I say to you arise!" What did the disciples see? They saw Jairus' daughter came back to life. **Jesus is a life giver!**

The next **home** that Jesus will visit is your **home**.

Be prepared to welcome him.

Be ready for your request.

Be surprised by a miracle!

RESPECT LIFE AND FAMILY MINISTRY

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The **Sacrament of Reconciliation** will be on **Tuesdays and Thursdays**, beginning at **9:15 a.m.** and ending at **10:30 a.m. (OR** when the line of those waiting to receive **Reconciliation** ends, whichever comes first).

At this time, **ALL** celebrations of this sacrament will be **OUTDOORS**. Also, a minimum 6' (six foot), physical distancing between the priest and penitent must be maintained.

Everyone coming to receive the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**, **MUST**:

- Be wearing a **mask** that completely covers the nose and mouth areas.
- Maintain the 6' (six foot) physical distancing between all persons present (noted exception: those who are living in the same house).

The location for the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** will be just outside the entrance doors of the Church at Entry Gate #1, just off of Boys Republic Drive (see illustration).

If the above noted days and times are not convenient, an appointment may also be made to celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**. Please note that there will be **NO INDOOR** celebrations of the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** at this time.

You will need to reserve your seat through our Parish Website seating system. The reservation system enables us to have immediate contact tracing should the need arise. It also ensures that we do not exceed the maximum number of people for each mass and we will not have to “turn anyone away” from attending the Mass since their seat is already reserved. **NOTE:** If for some reason you will not be able to attend the Mass, please be considerate and **cancel** your reservation, so that someone else may attend the “**In Person**” Mass. Thank you.

* – **VEHICLE COMMUNION LINE**

- ◆ The *Vehicle Communion Line* is a **direct continuation** of the 9:00 a.m. Livestream Mass. In order to receive Communion (Eucharist), you **MUST**:
 - ◆ Have already received your First Communion
 - ◆ Have participated fully and completely in the 9:00 a.m. Livestream Mass (i.e., watched and responded throughout the Livestream Mass)
 - ◆ Be in a state of grace
 - Meet the *Eucharistic Fast* requirements (e.g., no food or beverages for **1 hour before** you receive the Eucharist. Noted exception: water and medication)
- ◆ All cars will enter through Gate #1 on Boys Republic Drive.
 - You will **NOT** be parking, but simply entering into the *Vehicle Communion Line*. Please follow the directions of all *Guidance Ministers* as they direct you to one of the Communion distribution points.
- ◆ Please be aware that you **will** be exiting your vehicle in order to receive Communion (unless you have great difficulty walking).
- ◆ Please be aware that there is **NO** “upper age limit.” If you meet **all** of the above requirements and you are in good health (i.e., have no symptoms of illness – such as fever, cough, etc.), you are welcome to receive communion.
- ◆ In keeping with Diocesan guidelines, at this time, Communion will be given **in the hand only**.

Finally, we ask that you bring **hand sanitizer** with you and make sure that everyone in the vehicle is wearing a **face mask** that completely covers your nose and mouth.





HOLY SPIRIT within Us

The stories of the call of Samuel and of the first disciples in John's Gospel help us begin to understand the nature of God's call. It is not a work order from a distant God to carry out a specific task, but an invitation to participate in what God is already doing. The journey begins with God's intentions and activity. After the initial moment of call, God is shown to be actively leading these ordinary people to partner in God's work. For ourselves, we might not experience a single or dramatic moment of call. God's call can take many forms. But like Samuel, and like Jesus' disciples, we are invited into a relationship of trust and friendship with God. We too are invited to employ the gifts God has given us, always in dialogue with our God, in our daily lives.

OUR DEEPEST DESIRES: In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus' first spoken words in the Gospel of John: "What are you looking for?" This penetrating question reverberates throughout John's Gospel. The disciples who form Jesus' first



community, and many others who meet Jesus during his life, are drawn to him, seeking something they can't quite name. As Jesus called and formed his community of disciples, he probed their hearts and allowed them to probe his heart. They shared their deepest needs, hopes, and commitments.

Jesus' words might be directed to us, here and now. Sometimes we struggle to name what we really want. In our faith journey, in prayer and in lived experience, we learn to share our dreams and also to open our hearts to know God's dreams. In time, with lots of practice, with many successes and failures, we learn to trust God to shape and to fulfill our deepest desires.

YOUR SERVANT IS LISTENING: We hear of

young Samuel today, dedicated to a life of service to God, under the guidance of Eli, a Temple priest. Twice, Samuel hears the call of God and says "Here I am" to Eli. At last Eli recognizes that it is God who is calling Samuel. When Samuel hears God a third time, Samuel does not say "Here I am," but "Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." We can see a subtle shift as Samuel moves away from announcing his intention to serve and more clearly opens himself to God's voice. Samuel allows God to take the initiative, and attends first to God's intentions rather than his own.

Samuel's story helps us to remember that accepting God's call is not only about a new chapter in our personal story. Our acceptance is, more profoundly, a new moment in God's story. Even in our smallest "yes," God celebrates our partnership in God's great work. Through our openness and acceptance, God has new opportunities to bring all of us into loving unity with God

En el Evangelio de Juan que se leyó hoy, escuchamos las primeras palabras de Jesús. “¿Qué están buscando?” Esta pregunta penetrante resuena a lo largo del Evangelio de Juan. Los discípulos que formaron la primera comunidad de Jesús, y muchos otros que conocieron a Jesús durante su vida, se sienten atraídos por él, buscando algo que no pueden nombrar. Cuando Jesús llamó y formó a su primera comunidad, él examinó sus corazones y les permitió que examinaran el de él. Compartieron sus necesidades, esperanzas y compromisos más profundos. Las palabras de Jesús podrían estar dirigidas hacia nosotros, aquí y ahora. A veces nos esforzamos por nombrar lo que realmente queremos. En nuestro viaje de fe, en la oración y en la experiencia vivida, aprendemos a compartir nuestros sueños y también a abrir nuestros corazones para conocer los sueños de Dios. Con el tiempo, con mucha práctica, con varios éxitos y fracasos, aprendemos a confiar en Dios para dar forma y cumplir nuestros deseos más profundos.

TU SIERVO ESCUCHA

Hoy escuchamos a un joven Samuel, dedicado a una vida de servicio a Dios, bajo la guía de Elías, un sacerdote del

Templo. Dos veces Samuel escucha el llamado de Dios y responde a Elías “Aquí estoy”. Por fin Elías reconoce que es Dios quien está llamando a Samuel. Cuando Samuel escucha el llamado por tercera vez, Samuel no responde “Aquí estoy”, sino “Habla Señor, que tu siervo escucha”. Podemos ver un sutil cambio cuando Samuel se aleja de anunciar su intención y se abre más claramente a la voz de Dios. Samuel permite que Dios tome la iniciativa, y atiende primero a las intenciones de Dios en lugar de las suyas propias.

La historia de Samuel nos ayuda a recordar que aceptar la llamada de Dios no es sólo acerca de un nuevo capítulo en nuestra historia personal. Nuestra aceptación es más profunda, un momento nuevo en la historia de Dios. Incluso en nuestro más pequeño “sí”, Dios celebra nuestra participación en su gran obra. A través de nuestra apertura y aceptación, Dios tiene nuevas oportunidades para llevarnos a todos a una amorosa unidad con Dios.
