DEAR HOLY PEOPLE OF GOD:

Jesus healed the sick mother-in-law of Simon. The gospel narrates to us the healing miracle in this fashion:

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon... Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He **“approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up.”** Then the fever left her and she waited on them.”

Let's focus at the situation of Simon's mother-in-law. Let us imagine that the mother-in-law of Simon's illness prevented her to be hospitable, to be generous of her time, and to be of service to the disciples. There is the willingness of her spirit to be available but the body is weak to render such a noble service to her son-in-law's friends, especially to the Lord.

That burning desire to be hospitable in her own house was already felt by Jesus, the moment he entered. And Jesus, moved with compassion and love, didn't waste any time, and he **“approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up,”** and the fever was gone. As simple as that – **“approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up”** and the miracle happened.

Through Jesus' touch, the woman catches healing and wholeness of life. No magic; no hocus-pocus! It's all about healing love! And the woman completely healed. No period of recuperation, but fully alive and went back to follow the desire of her heart to be of service to her visitors – the disciples and Jesus.

Jesus' healing brings people to be the best version of themselves. His healing is unconditional; his healing calls people to belong – to a family and community. His healing calls people to believe, so that they can become evangelizers. His healing calls people to be grateful and will lead them to serve others.

That miraculous healing happened 2,000 years ago, but it's still new and as fresh as of today. COVID-19 might stop us to **“approach, grasp, and help”** others, but prayers allow us to tell Jesus our spiritual needs, physical needs and health needs. And like what happened to Simon's mother-in-law, with faith and hope, he will **“approach, grasp our hands, help us up”** and miracles will happen. Just believe and have hope! And also pray!

Remember, a prayer a day keeps COVID-19 away!

Then whisper to yourself with faith,
“the healing grace of Jesus is always in my heart!”



THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The **Sacrament of Reconciliation** will be on **Tuesdays and Thursdays**, beginning at **9:15 a.m.** and ending at **10:30 a.m.** (**OR** when the line of those waiting to receive *Reconciliation* ends, whichever comes **first**).

At this time, **ALL** celebrations of this sacrament will be **OUTDOORS**. Also, a minimum 6' (six foot), physical distancing between the priest and penitent must be maintained.

Everyone coming to receive the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**, **MUST**:

- Be wearing a **mask** that completely covers the nose and mouth areas.
- Maintain the 6' (six foot) physical distancing between all persons present (noted exception: those who are living in the same house).

The location for the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** will be just outside the entrance doors of the Church at Entry Gate #1, just off of Boys Republic Drive (see illustration).

If the above noted days and times are not convenient, an appointment may also be made to celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**. Please note that there will be **NO INDOOR** celebrations of the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** at this time.

You will need to reserve your seat through our Parish Website seating system. The reservation system enables us to have immediate contact tracing should the need arise. It also ensures that we do not exceed the maximum number of people for each mass and we will not have to “turn anyone away” from attending the Mass since their seat is already reserved. **NOTE:** If for some reason you will not be able to attend the Mass, please be considerate and **cancel** your reservation, so that someone else may attend the “**In Person**” Mass. Thank you.

* – **VEHICLE COMMUNION LINE**

- ◆ The *Vehicle Communion Line* is a *direct continuation* of the 9:00 a.m. Livestream Mass. In order to receive Communion (Eucharist), you **MUST**:
 - ◆ Have already received your First Communion
 - ◆ Have participated fully and completely in the 9:00 a.m. Livestream Mass (i.e., watched and responded throughout the Livestream Mass)
 - ◆ Be in a state of grace
 - Meet the *Eucharistic Fast* requirements (e.g., no food or beverages for **1 hour before** you receive the Eucharist. Noted exception: water and medication)
- ◆ All cars will enter through Gate #1 on Boys Republic Drive.
 - You will **NOT** be parking, but simply entering into the *Vehicle Communion Line*. Please follow the directions of all *Guidance Ministers* as they direct you to one of the Communion distribution points.
- ◆ Please be aware that you **will** be exiting your vehicle in order to receive Communion (unless you have great difficulty walking).
- ◆ Please be aware that there is **NO** “upper age limit.” If you meet **all** of the above requirements and you are in good health (i.e., have no symptoms of illness – such as fever, cough, etc.), you are welcome to receive communion.
- ◆ In keeping with Diocesan guidelines, at this time, Communion will be given **in the hand only**.

Finally, we ask that you bring **hand sanitizer** with you and make sure that everyone in the vehicle is wearing a **face mask** that completely covers your nose and mouth.







Comfort My PEOPLE

There are times when the Scripture readings seem to completely contradict each other.

Today we hear Job's deep lament of his sufferings from the Old Testament, while in the New Testament we read about Jesus healing Peter's mother-in-law and the whole town of Capernaum. The first addresses profound suffering, while the second is a story of abundant healing.

This apparent contradiction draws us into one of the great mysteries of life—the meaning of suffering. How can a good God allow evil? If God desires to heal us, why does he let us suffer? The answers to these questions Christ fully discloses on the Cross. Today we will ponder this mystery briefly, but these are questions we wrestle with throughout our lives as we wait for Heaven where “every tear will be wiped away.”

Though we may never fully understand suffering, we can be certain that God desires to heal us and bring value into our suffering. He sent us his only Son to suffer and die for our salvation, and through this mystery we can glimpse how suffering can make us more like him. But we first need to ask for him to heal us in our suffering. We see Jesus beginning that work today in the little town of Capernaum, and he longs to continue that same work in each of our lives.

DISCUSSION: Call to mind the intimacy the Apostles had with Jesus. Ponder your own day-to-day relationship with God. When you pray, how do you imagine God? Are you able to talk to him as a friend? What are some ways that you can grow in intimacy with the Lord and welcome him into your home? Jesus tells us something by making his home at Capernaum, which means town of comfort. Even in the midst of our time in exile in this world, Jesus comes to comfort us and give us the hope of Heaven. Our comfort is that Jesus died and



rose for us, so we are able to go to Heaven with him if we so desire. This should give us great hope!

Ponder the great needs in your own life. Try to think about them from a "heavenly perspective"—with a hope in Heaven that will give you the strength to endure the present. How does this perspective change the way you suffer? How can you allow Jesus to comfort you with this hope more consistently in your daily life? For additional understanding, please watch the short

PRAYER: Let's reflect on these words from the Gospel reading from today. Call to mind the scene of Jesus healing Peter's mother-in-law. Then imagine the whole town coming to his doorstep with all of their needs for healing. What needs do you need to bring to the Lord in your own life? Take a word that comes to mind and reflect for a moment on what it means to you personally. For example, you might have been attracted to the words, "He approached." Ask yourself what they mean in your own life. How do you feel when you imagine Jesus approaching you? Do you trust him? Do you want him to approach you in this place? How can you allow him to approach you in the places you desire healing?

RESOLUTION: St. Therese of Lisieux said, "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy." Ask God today to teach you to pray. Ask him to help you turn towards Heaven with a cry of love throughout your day. What practical thing can you do this week to look towards God and let him approach you in his great love?

La commovedora descripción del sufrimiento humano de la lectura del libro de Job hace eco de los gritos que tenemos escuchando del mundo desde la llegada del coronavirus. Lamentamos muchas perdidas: de vida y salud, de trabajo y seguridad, de libertad de estar con las personas que amamos. Se nos recuerda que muchos de los salmos son oraciones que lamentan que el mundo con frecuencia no es lo que debería de ser. En estos tiempos del coronavirus, nosotros, la Iglesia, primero estamos llamados devotamente a lamentarnos, a llorar con los que lloran y a dolernos por un mundo mejor. Nuestra oración puede recordarnos que, como Pablo describe en Romanos 8, toda la creación está gimiendo y el Espíritu Santo está gimiendo un sufrimiento compartido sin palabras. También vivimos en la promesa de Dios de transformar nuestras lágrimas en alegría. Dios está dispuesto a traer la sanación al mundo, y nosotros somos los instrumentos de Dios para hacerlo. Para esta tarea traemos de Dios los dones de la creatividad, la iniciativa y la perseverancia. Que nuestro lamento nos recuerde la urgencia del trabajo de Dios a través de nosotros.

LIBERTAD DE SERVIR

El primer capítulo del Evangelio de Marcos avanza rápido, así como Jesús inicia su ministerio avanzando. La primera escena del pasaje de hoy sucede tan rápido que es fácil perderse: Jesús cura a la suegra de Simón y tan pronto ella está sana empieza a servirles a Jesús y a sus discípulos. El Evangelio no menciona el nombre de ella sino solamente que era la suegra de Simón. Pero ella es la primera persona, una mujer, en el Evangelio de Marcos, que una vez curada por Jesús, responde explícitamente como discípula. Al estar curada está liberada para servir a Jesús y a los demás, provocando una curación en muchos otros.

A lo largo de los evangelios, las curaciones de Jesús restauran la salud, la dignidad y un lugar en la comunidad. También son una llamada al servicio. La breve historia de Marcos destaca que Dios siempre está levantado a las personas y a las comunidades, sanadas de enfermedades, del pecado o de la tristeza, para que se unan al trabajo de sanación de Dios para los demás.
