Dear St. Paul Family and Friends,

"I prayed, and prudence was given me; I pleaded and the spirit of wisdom came to me. I preferred her to scepter and throne, and deemed riches nothing in comparison with her..."

Wisdom and Prudence are twin virtues. They go hand in hand; they are inseparable. Wisdom is the knowledge of what is right and wrong, moral and immoral. Prudence is wisdom applied. CCC No. 1806 states that "prudence is the virtue that disposes practical reason to discern our true good in every circumstance and to choose the right means of achieving it... With the help of this virtue, we apply moral principles to particular cases without error and overcome doubts about the good to achieve and the evil to avoid." It is not a wonder, therefore, that after humility, prudence is the second most foundational virtue.

As Christians, we believe that true wisdom comes from God alone. (See *Proverbs 2:6*) Our knowledge of what is right and wrong is informed by God's commands. We discern His will so we can see things as God sees them and to understand things as God understands them. Through God's wisdom, we see things as they truly are. Wealth is seen as possessions, not possessors, i.e., we possess them but they do not possess us. The commands of God are seen not as ends in themselves but as means to living a life of communion with God. These are the areas where the rich young man in the Gospel this weekend failed. He loved the commandments but not the Author of the Commandments. He loved life but not the Author of Life. He loved material wealth more than the Giver of all kinds of wealth – God Himself.

It is imperative, therefore, that we teach our children to seek for God's wisdom first. Very often, our children are taught how to be rich and successful, how to start and run a company, how to be on top. While these have values in themselves, our children should learn how to be good persons first by seeking God's wisdom. When they know God, they will know how to handle all other things well. "Seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides." (Mt. 6, 33)

Fortunately, we have 827 students (506 in person and 321 virtual) enrolled in our catechetical classes this year. Although we are down from around 1,200 students pre-pandemic, we are still blessed to have them; and we are grateful to the parents who put premium on the catechetical formation of their children. Strengthened by faith and united in Christ, we can build a society of men and women who are wise and prudent, preferring Christ over scepter and throne.

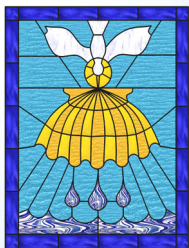

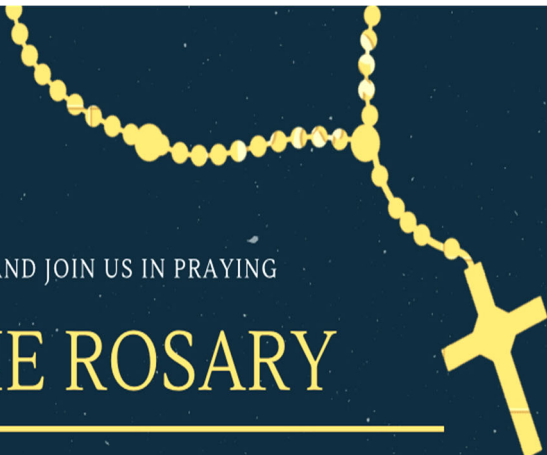

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THE PATH TO TRUE HAPPINESS

Have you ever felt like you are competent in one particular activity? Maybe a sport, a task at your work, or getting the laundry folded regularly!

You have finally mastered the particular task. And then, when you thought everything was (finally) going as you planned, something goes wrong. You get hurt, your work changes, a child gets sick, and everything is thrown off once again. Today, we will encounter this in a man who has been seeking to follow the commandments since he was a young boy. He thinks he has prepared himself well to enter into eternal life. But, when Jesus invites him to something deeper, something more, he is crushed, as he will have to “start over” in some ways. Are you willing to take the next step to growing closer to Jesus?

Consider discussing these questions with a friend this week, or write your thoughts in a journal. :



- We often say that we “love” things. There are different ways of speaking about love. Jesus asks us to love him today above all else. He asks us to put aside our personal habits and way of life, and even perhaps our bodily life, for him. Are you willing to follow him and love him in this radical way?

- Which commandment do you not follow closely enough? How can you follow the commandments more closely so that you can inherit eternal life?

DIGGING DEEPER: *The Four Loves: In the Greek language, there is more than one word for “love.” In fact, there are four words for love: Storge (affectionate love), Phileo (friendship love), Eros (romantic love), and Agape (Divine love). The Greeks understood that we have radically different levels of love. Jesus asks us to love him with an Agape love. It is impossible for man to love God with an agape love all on his own, without the assistance of grace. We also call agape love by the name of charity. It is selfless and requires a complete gift of self for the good of the other. Even Peter struggles to give Jesus this love at first. Do you remember when Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves him after his Resurrection? This threefold affirmation of love is in reparation for his threefold denial of Christ during his Passion; it proves that Peter actually does love Jesus and will serve the Church as the visible Head once Jesus has ascended into Heaven. How can you foster a deeper love for Christ?*

PRAYER: Jesus offers us the way to eternal life in today's Gospel. We must not only follow the Commandments and omit sin from our lives, but also, we must surrender our entire lives to Christ and thereby follow him. We must reject our inordinate attachments to Christ. This

process is much easier said than done, because we can easily become consumed by worldly goods and affairs. These things very easily distract us from Jesus. How often do you desire to pray, but end up spending time perusing news, social media, and email on your phone? We often say we want to follow Christ, but we cannot seem to fit in ten minutes of prayer time with him a day, while we easily make time for an hour to work out or spend time watching movies.

Jesus is inviting us to walk on the road of the straight and narrow. He doesn't promise it will be easy; in fact, it will be quite the opposite. He says that it is impossible for men to follow this path alone, but with God, all things will be possible. Do you give inordinate time to the things of this world? Where do you think you will find happiness? What is holding you back from following Christ completely and sacrificially?

RESOLUTION: Challenge yourself this week to empty your life of worldliness and make room for Jesus. Give something away, perhaps not something buried in your closet that you don't use, but something that you use frequently, but don't really need. Maybe it's a piece of clothing or your coffee money for the week. Also, turn off the screens in your house one night. Take time to pray as a family or on your own with the extra time you gain without the entertainment.

VIGÉSIMO OCTAVO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

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La mayoría de nosotros desea sinceramente crecer en sabiduría y en la fe. Las lecturas de hoy exploran los desafíos que enfrentamos cuando dejamos que Dios nos guíe. Primero escuchamos al autor del libro de la Sabiduría exaltar el valor de la sabiduría en nuestras vidas. Luego, en la carta a los hebreos se nos dice que algunas veces Dios pone al descubierto verdades difíciles sobre nosotros mismos. Estas lecturas nos llevan al relato de Marco sobre el hombre rico. En su encuentro con Jesús, el hombre se enfrentó a una verdad muy dura, que sus posesiones lo poseían y le bloqueaban su camino hacia Dios. Nosotros podemos tener “momentos de verdad” similares cuando tenemos un deseo abrumador de minimizar o huir de la verdad que Dios nos revela. En esos momentos, recordemos que Dios siempre busca bendecirnos y sanarnos. Es en esos momentos que pedimos a Dios abra nuestros corazones para recibir la verdad con fe y valor.

LA GENEROSIDAD BÍBLICA

El Evangelio de hoy describe un encuentro tenso y trágico entre Jesús y un hombre rico. Parece que el hombre deseaba sinceramente conocer el camino para heredar la vida eterna. Él había obedecido gran parte de la Ley de Moisés. Aparentemente, él también había seguido las reglas de la sociedad para ganar y mantener su riqueza, evitando robar y defraudar.

Jesús indica que el hombre se perdió una parte crucial de la tradición bíblica, la que llama a los que tienen mucho a compartir generosamente con los que tienen poco. El Antiguo Testamento se refiere regularmente a esta obligación (por ejemplo, lo que se menciona en Deuteronomio 15). Los historiadores señalan que, en la sociedad de los tiempos de

Jesús, los ricos gozaban de privilegios en un sistema económico que también impedía a los pobres y vulnerables satisfacer sus necesidades básicas. Al estar el hombre rico atrapado en sus posesiones le perjudicaba a él mismo y a toda la comunidad. En nuestro propio tiempo y lugar, aquellos que gozan de privilegios de diversa índole están invitados a adoptar prácticas sociales y económicas que incluyan esta generosidad bíblica.

CIRUGÍA DEL CORAZÓN

Gran parte de nuestra vida interior está oculta a los demás. Esto nos protege de que seamos lastimados por aquellas personas que buscarían una ventaja sobre nosotros. Pero nuestra vida interior oculta también puede impedir que las heridas sanen, y puede favorecer a mantener ilusiones profundamente dañinas sobre nosotros mismos y sobre el mundo exterior.

En el pasaje de la carta a los hebreos, el autor ofrece una imagen vívida de la palabra de Dios y su efecto sobre nosotros. Aquí, la palabra de Dios se describe como el poder activo de Dios que penetra nuestros corazones. A Dios se le describe como un cirujano que puede exponer nuestros lugares ocultos y maniobrar alrededor de nuestra dureza de corazón. La exposición de nuestro interior puede ser aterradora. Durante la cirugía, estamos profundamente vulnerables y dependemos totalmente del cuidado y la habilidad del cirujano para poder sanar. Cuando los eventos de la vida permiten a Dios revelar verdades ocultas sobre nosotros mismos, es crucial que sepamos que estamos en manos de un cirujano fiable y hábil.
