Dear St. Paul Family and Friends,

Our Gospel this weekend, the Parable of the Dishonest Steward, is so strange and puzzling that St. Augustine himself said, "I can't believe that this story came from the lips of our Lord." It appears that Jesus is praising a dishonest steward for deception, or that he is praising him for stealing money for his own advantage. But he is not. He is rather encouraging the inventory of goods, the prudent use of resources, and the clear anticipation of the future.

First, we are encouraged to make an inventory of our resources. In the parable, the steward was reported to have squandered his master's properties and was found to be longer fitted for the job. He started assessing what he had. "I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg," he said to himself. Understand that in Jesus' time. There was no employment compensation, insurance or welfare program. When someone loses his job, especially an elderly man, one practically loses financial support system. More so, in small poor towns like that of Palestine, the odds of getting another job were so high. The steward, in assessing what he had, knew he would be left with practically nothing.

We too are called to make a proper and honest inventory of the resources placed in our charge – time, talents, opportunities, health, intelligence, education, and other gifts, because this is pre-requisite to the second invitation of the parable: to use our resources prudently.

The steward called his master's debtors, asked them to make promissory notes, and approved all of them. He did so with the thought that "when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes." To be clear, what the steward used was his master's money and not his. But what Jesus praises is simply the use of resources to help the poor and gain friends. This is what we are called to do as well - make a proper inventory of the gifts we have and help the poor.

This weekend is Catechetical Sunday. I am very happy to share with you that we are doing well with our enrollment. We are in fact seeing a significant increase in students. But we are lacking in catechists and volunteers. Jesus is calling you today to assess what you have and share it by becoming a catechist. Please do not let our students down.

Finally, Jesus praises the steward for his foresight. The steward knew where he would end up should he not do something immediately. He did what he did in order to "change" his future. So, it must be the same with us. We know that our actions on earth affect our eternal destination. St. Paul says, "for we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil." (2 Cor. 5, 10) The parable invites us to be mindful of our eternal destination and make sure that our actions and lifestyles are aligned with it.

We are consoled, though, that despite of our sinful past, the Lord is merciful. May the images of the Divine Mercy, Our Lady of La Salette and St. Damien placed in the foyer of our Church remind you that the very nature of God is mercy, and that we are all called to "be merciful just as [also] your Father is merciful. (Lk. 6, 36)






## Catechetical Sunday

## PARABLES

[Jesus] spoke to them only in parables.  
 "I will open my mouth in parables,  
 I will announce what has lain hidden  
 from the foundation of the world."  
*(Matthew 13:34a-35bc)*

When Jesus walked among us he often told stories called parables. Some parables help us think about what God's kingdom will be like, and some help us to understand what it feels like to forgive and to be forgiven.

Last week we heard the parables of the lost sheep and the lost coin. If you don't remember them you might want to read them again (Luke 15:1-10). These stories had one thing in common: everyone was happy when they found what was lost. Think about these questions and talk about them with an adult. Try to discover what Jesus wants to teach us about forgiveness.

Parables don't always tell us exactly what they mean, but they do invite us to think about the story. If you don't know the answers to all of these questions, remember that the important thing is to keep thinking about them. As you grow, you will be able to understand more and more about what Jesus is teaching us.

- How would you feel if you were the lost sheep?
- How would you feel if you were one of the 99 sheep that were left behind?
- Who do you think the shepherd is?
- Why does the shepherd go to look for the sheep?
- Would he do the same for every one of his sheep?
- Why did the shepherd call his friends to celebrate with him?

- If the woman had ten coins and only lost one, why was it important for her to find it?



- Was there anything special about each of the coins?

- When she found the coin, why did she invite her friends to celebrate with her?

Connect the dots to see what we call someone who is dependable and honest. Ask God to help you always to be this kind of person!



## VIGÉSIMO QUINTO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Cuando escuchamos las Escrituras en la liturgia, existe una especie de idea tácita de que oiremos algo sorprendente y edificante, que avivará nuestros corazones y nos hará mejores católicos, mejores cristianos, mejores personas, al llevar la Palabra Viva de Dios a nuestras vidas. Así que, ¿cuál es la sorpresa cuando nos llega un día como el de hoy, en el que tantas cosas parecen ir en contra de nuestras expectativas? Amós nos advierte sobre el engaño y el despojo de los derechos de alguien. En la primera carta de Pablo a Timoteo, explica que debemos rezar por todos, sin importar lo que pensemos de ellos, incluso si están en un lugar de poder y autoridad. Y el elogio de Jesús a los "hijos de este mundo" en el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy es realmente desconcertante.

### JUSTICIA PARA TODOS

Cuando comprendemos mejor a Amós, es realmente un espejo del mensaje evangélico de que debemos ser buenos administradores y ofrecer bondad y justicia a todos. Recuerda que Jesús está hablando a través de una serie de parábolas. (La semana pasada se proclamó la parábola del hijo pródigo). Cuando habla del mayordomo, no nos dice que nos dediquemos a blanquear dinero o a hacernos ricos rápidamente, ni que nos dediquemos al marketing multinivel. Más bien, podemos deducir que debemos utilizar nuestros bienes y nuestras habilidades con sabiduría y para el mejoramiento de todos. En la parábola, el mayordomo es alabado por su rapidez de pensamiento y por

encontrar una manera de resolver la situación. La parábola termina con Jesús diciéndonos "No pueden servir a Dios y a las riquezas" y deben de hacer una elección.

### TODO ES UNA ELECCIÓN

La parábola del Evangelio nos cuenta lo que el mayordomo hizo una vez para salir de un apuro. Pero estamos llamados a hacer la elección correcta, la mejor elección una y otra vez. A veces es difícil. Puede que no haya que elegir entre el bien y el mal, pero a veces incluso hay que elegir entre dos bienes. A menudo tenemos que tomar decisiones como: "¿Paso este tiempo extra en el trabajo para conseguir ese ascenso? ¿Me llevo el trabajo a casa? ¿O puedo dejarlo allí y estar con mi familia cuando termine?". Los padres a menudo tienen que mirar su cuenta de ahorros antes de determinar qué actividades pueden permitirse para que sus hijos participen. La música y los deportes y las artes son maravillosos, pero todos requieren un equipo especial y tiempo. Pero hacer un sacrificio por parte de todos puede reportar grandes recompensas. Sin embargo, a veces hay que elegir para llevar la comida a la mesa o para vestir a la familia. Aprendemos a tomar las decisiones que son mejores para nosotros y con las que podemos vivir. Aprendemos a discernir qué es lo mejor para los que amamos.


