### WORLD MISSION SUNDAY 2022

Today, we celebrate World Mission Sunday. The Holy Father urges us to reflect on the theme, "You shall be my witnesses."

To be an effective witness of Christ, we must be rooted in prayer. Prayer, as you know, is simply a conversation with God. In the first reading from Sirach, we are reminded that "the one who serves God willingly is heard." Therefore, the starting point is that we must strive to know and understand what God wishes for us in our lives. We must ask God for His assistance.

In the Gospel, what differentiates the Pharisee from the tax collector? Both go up to the Temple to pray. The Pharisee lives a virtuous life. The tax collector is a traitor his people and a collaborator of the oppressive Romans. Perhaps he is guilty of some of the sins outlined by the Pharisee. Nevertheless, the Pharisee speaks to himself, failing to recognize his own need for the power and action of God in his life. The tax collector, on the other hand, despite the despicable deeds, is justified simply because he calls on the name of the Lord.

The greatest prayer we Christians pray is the prayer of thanksgiving: The Holy Eucharist. Most of us are familiar with this prayer as the Holy Mass. It is interesting that the name by which we call this greatest blessing comes from the final words after we have given Thanksgiving – "Thus you are sent!" (Ite, missa est!) After we stand beside the mysterious re-presentation of Christ's sacrifice upon the Cross and receive the Sacrament, we are sent into the world to **Be His Witnesses**. We are his witnesses when we allow ourselves to be poured out in the service of the Gospel, bringing the good news to others. This was the ministry Paul refers to in his letter to Timothy.

Blessed Pauline Jaricot was born in 1799 to a profoundly religious French aristocratic family. She was wealthy, carefree, and good-natured. As a young woman, she would become foundress of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, a confraternity dedicated to praying for and supporting the Missions: it began in a very simple way of a friend asking her friends for prayers each day and a penny each week.

Funds from that society helped build many churches here in the United States. In fact, our nation was considered a mission territory until 1908. Today, the Pontifical Mission Societies, through thousands of missionaries in 1,100 dioceses worldwide, are extending Christ's healing and His entire ministry to people in dire need of it. They are building churches, educating children, and healing physical and psychological wound caused by war, cruelty, oppression, terror, and despair. They are bearing witness to the compassion of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We have the opportunity to help the Universal Church make Christ present throughout the world, particularly where He has been doubted, ignored, and shunned.

## NO ON Proposition 1

### 1. Most California Voters Oppose Late-Term Abortions

A significant majority of California voters oppose late-term abortions and understand that there should be reasonable limits such as we have now. Prop 1 destroys these limits and will permit unrestricted abortion for any reason at any time - even up to the moment of birth. Most voters reject this.

### 2. Most California Voters Oppose Taxpayer-Funded Abortions

With California taxpayers already facing soaring inflation, sky-high gas prices, and unaffordable housing, most voters oppose taxpayer funding for abortions, especially to pay the expenses for abortion-seekers from other states. The Legislature has already increased abortion funding \$200 million this year. If Proposition 1 passes, analysts predict that the number of abortion-seekers from other states coming to California could increase by tens of thousands - meaning millions more dollars will be needed.

### 3. Most California Voters Believe in Reproductive Equity

Most California voters believe there should be parity and equal access to services for women seeking abortion and those who choose to be mothers. Prop 1 gives top funding priority to abortion seekers at the expense of families who struggle to pay for housing, groceries, gas, safe neighborhoods, healthcare and childcare.

## **EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT FOR HOLY SOULS – FIRST FRIDAY - NOVEMBER 4<sup>TH</sup>**

November is set aside by the Church to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. There is an abundance of graces that can be attained for the Holy Souls through the Catholic Church. “A partial indulgence is granted for the Christian faithful when they visit the Blessed Sacrament for the purpose of adoration. When this is done for at least half hour, the indulgence is a **plenary one**.”

Indulgences may only be applied to ourselves or to a Holy Soul in Purgatory. In order to receive the Plenary Indulgence, one must be completely detached from sin, must have gone to confession, received Holy Communion and prayed for the intentions of the Holy Father, (eg., Our Father and Hail Mary).

St. Paul the Apostle has Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament every day in the Chapel, **Monday through Friday after the morning Mass until 6:00 p.m. On First Friday, November 4<sup>th</sup> there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the Church. This will take place after the 8:00 a.m. Mass until 4:30 pm. Adoration will then continue in the Adoration Chapel from 5:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m.** Come and pray to flood extra graces to your soul and to the Souls of the Faithfully Departed.






