We, the people of St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Faith Community, baptized into Jesus Christ, formed by Word and Sacrament, and empowered by the guidance of the Holy Spirit, seek to be a visible sign of God's love. We seek to build the Kingdom of God by: Using our unique gifts to minister to one another, welcoming all and caring for those in need, teaching our faith to others and uniting in worship as a family with the Body of Christ.

ABOUT CHRIST THE KING (taken from USCCB)

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas* ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

During the early twentieth century, in Mexico, Russia, and some parts of Europe, militantly secularistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic Church and its faithful but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI's encyclical gave Catholics hope and—while governments around them crumbled - the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ "is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind" (Quas primas, 7).

Christ's kingship is rooted in the Church's teaching on the Incarnation. Jesus is fully God and fully man. He is both the divine Lord and the man who suffered and died on the Cross. One person of the Trinity unites himself to human nature and reigns over all creation as the Incarnate Son of God. "From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures" (Quas primas, 13).

The Church calls us to acknowledge Christ's kingship with our whole lives: He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things and cleave to him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls, or to use the words of the Apostle Paul, 'as instruments of justice unto God.' (Quas primas, 33)



OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

"'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."" - Mt 25:34

Today, religious freedom for many people means that we can believe whatever we want in private, but when we enter the public square or the marketplace, we may not speak of anything that relates to our faith. However, the Church acknowledges the reign of Christ, not only privately, but publicly. This solemnity encourages us the celebrate and live out our faith in public. "Thus, by sermons preached at meetings and in churches, by public adoration of the Blessed Sacrament exposed and by solemn processions, men unite in paying homage to Christ, whom God has given them for their King" (Quas primas, 26).

For Christians, when our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our lives. We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the Church and of the entire universe.



Advent: What are We Waiting For?

ADVENT WREATH

The candles of Advent. Three violet, one rose, but not in that order!

The first two weeks we light a violet candle signifying waiting and penance.

The pink is lit the third week—commemorating joy in Christ's imminent arrival.

Finally the last candle -violet—is lit with one week to go! It is comforting to know that throughout the world, in one catholic church after another these candles light our way to Christmas—to the birthday of Jesus.

One way to bring Advent home in our family is to have our own Advent wreath.

This year make an Advent Wreath together as family!

You will need (3) violet candles and (1) rose candle, candle holders,

a bough of evergreen (fake will do). Light the candle or candles each week and pray:

Blessed are you, Lord, God, of all creation: in the darkness and in the light. Blessed are you in this food and in our sharing. Blessed are you as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our savior, Jesus Christ. Come Lord, Jesus!

ADVENT CALENDAR



An advent calendar is another way to count down the days leading to Christmas. Find or create from assorted magazine pictures, old Christmas cards, etc. a Christmas scene and place on a poster board. Behind doors, trees, windows, a nest, or a rock in your scene draw or paste special symbols that carry an Advent message For more fun "assign" a certain number of spots to each family

member and keep them secret until opened. Making sure there are enough spots for the days between the first Sunday of Advent and Christmas day, tape construction paper "shutters" over each position. Each message should lead your family to the spiritual meaning of Christmas. Number each hiding place, working your way to the Birth of Jesus. Recite a simple prayer each time a message is revealed:


Thank you, Jesus, for loving us. As we get ready to celebrate your birth on Christmas day, help us to share our love even more with each other.
