
Advent Reconciliation Service

The Creation Care Team Presents: Real Or Fake? No Contest. By Rebecca Angel Maxwell

Recently, a report came out saying artificial or live christmas trees were environmentally equal, but looking closely at the study, it shows an incredible amount of interpretation of data and for our region of the world, real trees are the only option for a "green" Christmas.

Manufacturing/Growth: Artificial trees are PVC plastic. There are numerous studies showing dangerous toxins to the environment and human health during manufacturing including lead, DEHA, dioxins, and arsenic. There is no way to prevent this exposure. Petroleum manufacturing, the basis of all plastics, contributes to CO2, and therefore climate change. Real trees grow on farms where they clean the air of CO2 and are part of natural ecosystems. There is a variable amount of chemicals depending on the grower, but not even close to what is used to create every fake one.

Travel: Both fake and real trees have a similar amount of transportation for people going out to buy the tree since cars and trucks are required for bringing fake trees to the store or driving out to get a real one. Shipping across the world is greater for artificial trees since most are manufactured outside the United States. Additionally, each component of a fake tree is shipped to the factory, every ounce of petroleum too. The emissions for fake far outweigh a real one.

Use: While in your home, live trees can be a fire hazard, which can be prevented by regular watering. Fake trees with wiring inside branches have also been linked to sparks and fires. Both kinds of trees can have mold and dust which can affect indoor air quality. Artificial trees are PVC plastic which leach dangerous toxins into the air linked to cancer, reproductive issues, immune system suppression, and problems with child development.

Disposal: Artificial trees do not decompose and cannot be recycled. At some point, a fake tree will end up in a landfill and stay for hundreds of years leaching toxins into our land. Real trees decompose if thrown into a landfill. But the better option is being chopped for firewood or chipping for gardens, parks and other helpful regional uses.

Social Justice: The labor practices of the petroleum industry and overseas factories are in constant violation of labor laws. Every dollar you spend on an artificial tree goes into the pockets of the 1% who are destroying our world for their greed. In our region, buying a real tree supports our local economy and family farms, which contribute to healthier air quality and ecosystems.

A Third Option: Potted trees the most "green" option to explore. Keep our world and your home safe and buy real trees!



A parishioner shared a recent article from the *Wall Street Journal* about research in the area of dementia which stated the following: "Some of the researchers followed 1, 772 people age 65 or older, 207 of whom developed dementia. After adjusting the results for age, ethnic group, education and occupation, the authors found that people who engaged in more than six activities a month – including hobbies, reading, visiting friends, walking, volunteering and attending religious services – had a 38% lower rate of developing dementia than people who did fewer activities."
