



Sixth Sunday of Easter Share in the Power

This Sunday is two weeks before Pentecost, but already the readings prepare us for that feast. The first reading from Acts shows us the conversion of the Samaritans, thanks to Philip's preaching and curing the sick. He did this through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit makes Jesus present today, not just in the sacraments, but through us, his disciples.

Jesus knew that after his Resurrection appearances, he would not be visible as a man. Instead, he would live in all of his followers through the power of the Holy Spirit. That's why he tells the disciples that the Spirit will be with them and in them. So confirmation, the laying on of hands (Acts 8:17), reminds us that when God lives in us, we share in the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the second reading, Peter gives us practical advice. First, he tells us to be ready to explain our hope in the Lord. That hope comes from our faith in the Resurrection. When you hear that people saw and talked to Jesus after he rose from the dead, then hear that anyone who follows Jesus will share in that resurrection, you begin to have real hope. Next, Peter tells us to avoid sin, not because we won't be forgiven again, but to show that we can live a life free from sin, selfishness, and hatred. Freedom from sin allows us to give a good example of how to live. Abandoning selfishness allows us to

love others without counting the cost. When we are free from hatred, we are able to forgive others as we have been forgiven. As we live in Jesus and he in us, our happiness will attract people to God.

To our parents:

- Relax! God put the wiggle in children. Don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house.
- All are welcome.
- We encourage you to sing the hymns, pray and voice the responses. Quietly explain the parts of the Mass. Children learn liturgical behavior by imitating you.
- Please refrain from playing with your children during Mass, even in the Training Room, so that they do not get the wrong message...... that being at church is play time.
- If you leave Mass with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back. The Training Rooms have glass windows which provide sound proof environment and allows you to continue participating in the Mass.



ST. RITA OF CASCIA

Rita was the daughter of Antonio and Amata Lotti, who had her late in life. In Rita's early years, she visited the Augustinian nuns at Cascia, Italy, and showed interest in a religious life. However, when she was twelve, her parents betrothed her to Paolo Mancini, an ill-tempered, abusive individual who worked as town watchman. Disappointed but obedient, Rita married him when she was 18, and gave birth to twin sons. She put up with Paolo's abuses for eighteen years before he was ambushed and stabbed to death. Rita mourned her husband's death and interceded for his soul with great earnest. Her two young sons talked of avenging their father's death. Rita did all she could to guide her children into forgiveness, but was unable to dissuade them from their evil intentions. Prayer was her only hope. She prayed that God would change the evil swelling up in the hearts of her sons, or allow them to die before they had the chance to commit a mortal sin and in so doing be separated from God forever. God granted her prayers. Both of her two sons died within a year in a state of grace; they were prevented from following the evil path of their father.

Upon the deaths of her sons, Rita again felt the call to religious life. However, some of the sisters at the Augustinian monastery were relatives of her husband's murderers, and she was denied entry for fear of causing dissension. Asking for the intervention of Saint John the Baptist, Saint Augustine of Hippo, and Saint Nicholas of Tolentino, she managed to bring the warring factions together, not completely, but sufficiently that there was peace, and she was admitted to the monastery of Saint Mary Magdalen at age 36.

Rita lived 40 years in the convent, spending her time in prayer and charity, and working for peace in the region. She was devoted to the Passion, and in response to a prayer to suffer as Christ, she received a chronic head wound that appeared to have been caused by a crown of thorns, and which bled for 15 years.

Confined to her bed the last four years of her life, eating little more than the Eucharist, she spent her time teaching and directing the younger sisters. Near the end she had a cousin from her home town ask if she'd like anything; Rita's only request was a rose from her family's estate. The cousin went to the home, but it being January, knew there was no hope of finding a flower. There, sprouted on an otherwise bare bush, was a single rose blossom.

She died on May 22, 1457 at Cascia, and many miracles were reported instantly. She was buried at the Basilica of Cascia and was later discovered to be incorrupt. Her body can be found today in the Saint Rita Shrine at Cascia.

St. Rita certainly had a difficult life but her heartbreaking circumstances drove her to prayer and helped her to become a holy woman. She never lost her faith in God, or her desire to be with Him.

PATRON: of impossible causes, sterility, abuse victims, loneliness, marriage difficulties, parenthood, widows, the sick, and bodily ills and wounds.

LESSON: There is always hope—never lose faith!

ACTION: When facing a difficult and impossible life circumstance, resort to prayer after the example of St. Rita.
