

COMMUNAL RESPONSIBILITY

The people of God forgot the covenant and flouted God's laws. They did not listen to the prophets among them, who spoke for God in warning them. Prophets are sent from God to remind us why we are here, but they are often, even in our own time, mocked, disregarded, and mistreated rather than thanked and listened to.

The book of Chronicles tells the results of these sins: the destruction of the temple and all of Jerusalem, murder, mayhem, and finally exile to a foreign land. Why are these stories in the Bible? Just to inform us of what happened to our ancient forebears? What good would that be unless there were a message and a warning for us as well? Are we people who follow the teachings of God, who obey the words of Christ in the second covenant in his blood? Or do we continue to wreak works of darkness and violence? We are reminded by these readings that we will be judged as a people, not just as individuals.

FUNERAL PREPARATIONS

Funeral arrangements begin with a meeting with the funeral director at the funeral home of your choosing. The funeral home will contact our parish office to confirm the availability of the church and the Pastor. Once a date and time are set, a meeting is scheduled in the parish office to plan the funeral Mass. The Sisters in our parish will guide the family through this process. When available, one of our choir directors and a member of the bereavement team may also attend the planning meeting.

We will ask that you choose one reading from the Old Testament, a Psalm, and one reading from the New Testament, from selections provided to you by the Sisters. The Pastor will choose the Gospel reading.

Music is an important element of the service. You will be asked to select songs from a list of liturgically approved hymns for a funeral Mass. Please Note: The Cantor and Organist provide music services for funerals for a nominal charge.

All other details of the funeral Mass will be completed and the Sisters will continue to assist you in any way possible.

The Bereavement Committee prepares a meal for the family for up to 75 persons at no charge; this is also scheduled through the parish office at the planning meeting. This meal can be served in our parish hall or delivered to a designated home.

PLEASE NOTE: The church may be used for visitation on the day of the funeral. Visitation is allowed in the vestibule (entrance) of the church ONLY. Times for public visitation are limited to one hour before the funeral mass begins. The family can have a private viewing 30 minutes before the public viewing begins.
