

#### **LIVING BRANCHES**

The Gospel and second reading for this Fifth Sunday of Easter emphasize the need for us to remain in Christ, and he in us. This shared life finds expression in the image of the one vine and many branches. We become living branches of the vine, members of the Body of Christ through baptism, Eucharist, and confirmation, sacraments of sharing God's own life. The First Letter of John describes the fruit of this vine as active love of neighbor: "And his commandment is this: we should believe . . . and love one another" (1 John 3:23).

Our first reading from Acts shows us an example of someone who shares in Christ's life in the person of Saint Paul. Paul's fearless witness, even at the risk of his life, is proof to everyone that the risen Lord's Spirit truly fills him with life and is bearing fruit in him.

#### **FAST AND SLOW**

Our readings today offer a sharp contrast that hints at the wide variety of ways in which God works. In Acts, there is a rush of activity and profound change happens in a hurry. Paul, who was a leader in persecutions of the first Christians, has recently encountered Jesus on the road to Damascus. In today's passage, Paul has suddenly become a powerful witness for Jesus, risking his life and astonishing both the Christians and their enemies. This is God working fast, and everyone is trying to keep up!

In contrast, in today's Gospel from John, Jesus describes the vine and the branches bearing fruit. Vines and branches by nature act slowly and quietly. The passage itself is repetitive and meditative, inviting us to slow down and listen to what is happening under the surface. This speaks of the slow, patient work of God.

#### **DISCERNMENT AND LOVE**

The scriptures indicate that God often works on a long-term time frame. We might need our whole lives to learn some of God's lessons. The Church sometimes takes centuries to learn vital lessons about God. But within God's slow work, there are bursts of activity when the moment is ripe in God's eyes. We might perceive these bursts of God's grace, if we are able to see.

This fascinating mix of fast and slow can invite us again to deepen our practice of discernment. Discernment is the art of paying attention to God. It is the capacity to detect God's activity, which leads us toward bearing fruit and away from that which is fruitless. In our messy world, and aware of our personal frailties, discernment is often difficult. It helps to remember that God's activity is revealed in love. Whether fast or slow, God always works in love. We are called to perceive God's dramatic and sudden activities as well as God's deep and patient work of love in daily life and in our world.

#### HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED...

#### What is the difference between the Religious Education office and Youth Ministry?

It's a great question and both Religious Ed and Youth Ministry work very closely on our common goal; Leading our children closer to Christ! We work together on almost all our actives, but we do have separate budgets and responsibilities.

The Religious Ed office's mission is to support parents in their efforts to teach children about our faith including Sacramental preparation.

In K-5 our program is called **"Christ Our Life"**. This is a dynamic interactive program to engage our elementary children. Link to learn more <u>www.christourlife.com</u>

Our 6-8th grade program is called **Edge**. This program is designed to lead youth closer to Christ through semester long studies of different aspects of our faith and how we can apply these to our everyday life. We use scripture, catechism, videos, guest speakers, activities and small group discussion to bring the teachings to life. We always begin our lessons with a light meal because Christ always fed when He taught.

High School is called **Life Teen** and it is the similar to Edge. Link to learn more about Edge and Life Teen www.lifeteen.com

For Confirmation we use the Dynamic Catholic program called "Decision Point" and our First Communion is as by Dynamic Catholic called "Blessed"

We also supply opportunities for retreats and community service, Vacation Bible School, Specialized individual catechism for youth unable or not ready to participate in our classes, training for Core Team members and teachers, retreats and many other special events.

All of the above activities are funded through the Religious Ed office in the following ways:

- 1. Registration fees for the classes
- 2. Donations
- 3. Monthly Stipend from the parish funds

Youth Ministry works closely with the middle and high school Religious Ed programs. Youth ministry also provides opportunities for the youth to experience their faith in different ways beyond the classroom. These are the events that Youth Ministry provides:

Working at the Homeless Shelter, mission trips, Stubenville Retreats, DYC, Abbey Youth Fest, World Youth Day, March for Life, Bible Studies, retreats, concerts and many fun activities.

All of the above activities are funded through the Youth Ministry office in the following ways:

- 1. Donations (monthly envelop in church packets)
- 2. Fundraising

\*The Youth Bible and Catechism of the Catholic Church are used in all programs.






We want to thank everyone who came out and joined us or supported us in any way for our 4th annual Italian Dinner! We will be using the funds raised to attend our Mission Trip in June!




