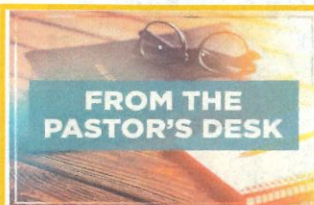

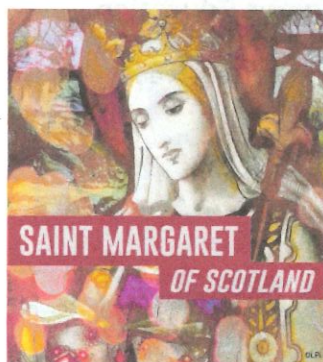
LITURGICAL AND PRAYER LIFE

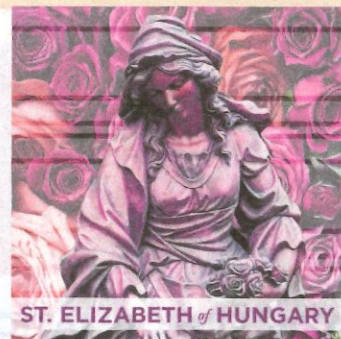

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Lately I've been enjoying the deep meaning of Eastern icons. I love how they express a tapestry of meaning in a way that can surpass the written or spoken word. Today's parable of the ten virgins from Jesus is a good example. Try googling "wise and foolish virgins icon" and you'll see an image of how our Christ meets our heart's deepest needs if we attend to him with the proper attitude.

I'm serious. Take a moment to google and look at it. See how it depicts the risen Jesus behind a closed door with the five wise virgins with lighted lamps. He gazes with them toward the five foolish and lamp-less virgins, symbolizing the outward looking of divine love for the lost. Moreover, the wedding feast is no ordinary one. It takes place in a walled city and garden, indicating it's a new Jerusalem and a return to Eden. The table isn't typical, either. It's a Eucharistic feast. Now we see that the door in Jesus' parable is the way into the

church, where Christ is the new light burning amidst the dark midnight of this world.

The richness continues. We notice, too, that the foolish virgins look exactly the same as the wise ones in their clothes, hair, and expressions. The only difference is they departed to buy oil and now they are sadly excluded. We often act like consumers in the marketplace to fulfill our need for love and mercy. We'll always end up disappointed if we shop around. Jesus sums up the moral of the story this way: "Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour." Watch, remain, don't spiritually shop. It is always better to quietly remain close to the Eucharistic community of the Church, even if we feel like our oil has run out. This week let's consider placing the icon of the wise and foolish virgins on our phone lock screen or computer desktop to help us remember to stay close to him, especially when life feels dark.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY



We are always in need of teachers, leaders and volunteers to assist with the faith formation and education of our youth. We have several age groups for you to choose from: Elementary (K-5th), Middle (6th-8th), High (9th-11th) and Children's Liturgy. Youth Ministry is divided into two groups: middle and high school.

ALTAR SERVERS



Catholics 9 yr old and up who assist the priest during Mass and other liturgical services. Altar serving is an opportunity to grow in faith and become more active in the Mass.

ALTAR SOCIETY



This is the oldest organization of our parish. These ladies clean and manage the altar, as well as church decorations, linens, vestments and generally anything that helps make the worship space more inviting and prayerful.

BEREAVEMENT



We have alternating teams who prepare meals for parish funerals that take place in our church. As a member, you would be asked to provide one large dish when your team is called upon. For working moms, we simplify your task by asking you to bring easily purchased items. Volunteers are sometimes needed for set up and clean up.

CATHOLIC DAUGHTERS



CDA is one of the oldest and largest organizations of Catholic women in the Americas. These ladies embrace the principle of faith working through love in the promotion of justice, equality and the advancement of human rights and dignity for all.

CHOIR



The adult choir practices on Tuesdays and performs on Sundays at 11am Mass. The youth choir is open to all children able to read. They practice on Tuesdays and perform during the school year only.



DUSTERS

These volunteers meet on every second and fourth Tuesday of the month to dust our beautiful church.



HANDMAIDS OF THE LORD

Through the use of videos, members learn and share the Catholic faith, sometimes incorporating retreats and trips. They also host our annual Morning of Reflection.



HOMEBOUND VISITATION

Teams that visit Catholic residents of our local nursing homes, hospital, and homebound parishioners.



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

A Catholic Fraternal Organization of men 18 years and older founded on principles of charity, unity and fraternity. They assist in many needs in and out of our parish.



LECTORS / COMMENTATORS

This team handles requests related to the website, communications, Flocknote, social media, zoom and video streaming in the church.



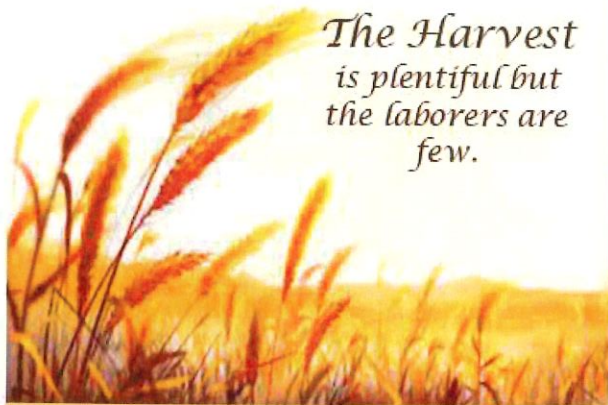
USHERS
