From Administrator's Desk:

Today is the first Sunday in Advent and the beginning of the new liturgical year, year B. The Gospel of St Mark is pre-dominant in this liturgical year. The season of Advent runs from yesterday evening till the evening of December 24, the vigil of Christmas. It is a period of four weeks before Christmas. It is a season of preparation for the celebration of the Lord's birth as well as a period of anticipation of the second coming of Christ at the end of history. It is a season of expectation, hope, renewal, new beginning, and promise that are key elements of the season.

In today's gospel, the Church teaches us to wake up and be on the watch. For us to prepare meaningfully and be wakeful, we must not allow ourselves to be sedated to sleep spiritually by sin, instead we should try harder to dedicate time for quiet prayer.
