### <u> irst Reading: Isaiah 61;1-2,10-11</u>



### THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT: GAUDETE SUNDAY - REJOICE!

John was sent from God . . . to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him.

John 1: 6-8, 19-28

Today is Gaudete Sunday! Gaudete means rejoice! The color for the Advent Candle we light today on the Third Sunday of Advent is Rose. The priest and deacon may opt to wear Rose-colored vestments as a reminder of this. We are encouraged to rejoice today because our celebration of Christmas draws near. The mystery of the Incarnation of God, the fullest expression of the Father's love and mercy should fill us with joy. Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy.

Franz Jacob is a barber in a small town outside of Quebec. One of his regulars is six-year-old Wyatt Lafreniere. Wyatt is autistic - he has trouble sitting still and he's hypersensitive to being touched.

So Franz will follow Wyatt around his shop as needed. He'll crawl on the floor with Wyatt and clip the boy's hair a snip and a shear at a time. Wyatt will sometimes just lie down on the floor, so Franz will lie down on the floor, too, taking as much time as Wyatt needs.

Many barbers and hairdressers don't know how to deal with clients with disabilities like autism, but Franz Jacob has several regular customers with autism, Wyatt being the youngest. He's learned how to adapt to their needs. He schedules them for the end of the day so he can take the time he needs, as long as an hour to 90 minutes. "I lock the front door. It has to stay quiet," explains Franz. "I'm just being really patient because they are [the ones] driving those moments."


Franz Jacob also works with people who are terminally ill, who want to enjoy a last trim. "When you shave someone who is probably going to die within 48 hours ... it's indescribable . . . I'm really proud to be doing all this,' he says.

To Wyatt's mom, Franz Jacob is a hero.

"He welcomes him like his best friend. To see that he accepts these differences is just fantastic," she says.

A few weeks ago, Mrs. Lafreniere published a photo she took of the burly, grizzly-bearded, tattooed barber lying on the floor of his shop giving her son a haircut. The photo was posted online and in newspapers throughout Canada, and made the barber a hero - but Franz says, "I don't see myself like that, but I'm just doing my best all the time for my community." In what our Christian tradition has come to call the "Incarnation," the God of love becomes one of us so that we might become one with God. But Incarnation is not only an event but a practice: that we "embody"



the love of God for the sake of others. A barber in Canada becomes the "incarnation" of God's love when he puts aside his adult world to bend down and crawl on the floor to enter the world of his young autistic client. May this Christmas be the beginning of our own "practice" of incarnation: to leave our own self-centered world to travel humbly in the world of those in need and, through our patience, understanding and generosity, to make the compassion and peace of God a reality in their lives.

### **OPLATKI**

### A POLISH/SLOVAK CHRISTMAS TRADITION

A part of the Polish/Slovak family Christmas Tradition is the breaking of the Christmas Wafer (Oplatek in Polish pronounced oh-pwah-tek) during the Christmas Eve Vigil Feast of Wigilia. Wigilia is the holiest of all the nights of the year in the Polish home.

The Sacred white wafer, much like those used for Holy Communion (unleavened wafers baked from pure wheat flour and water), are shared with each person present. The wafers are embossed with elegant Christmas related religious images. Family members and friends break off a piece of *Oplatki* and give it to one another to eat. During the exchange best wishes and blessings are expressed as well as forgiveness. The breaking and exchanging part of *Oplatki* is intended to remind participants of the importance of Christmas, God, and family. This is the most emotional time of the holiday for the Polish family – the sharing expression of love and forgiveness in celebration and tradition.

Today, on this Third Sunday of Advent we will provide *Oplatki* to each family in our parish and encourage you to share this ritual with your friends and family.

### **BRING YOUR INFANT JESUS**

The Creche, or Nativity, was first made by St. Francis of Assisi in 1223, so as to provide people with a representing of this great event in our world's history. Likewise, St. Francis also invented the Stations of the Cross as a Lenten devotion for the same purpose. Over the years many traditions have developed in Italy regarding the Creche. One such tradition emerged that the children would present their infant Jesus to the parish priest for a blessing. Then they would go home, entrusted with the infant for their family Creche, and keep it safe until it would be put into the Creche on Christmas. This became a nationwide event in Italy when Pope Paul VI, in 1968, began this custom and every Pope has since maintained it. Each year tens of thousands of school children fill St. Peter's Square to get their infant Jesus blessed by the Pope. That being said, we invite you to bring your infant Jesus to Mass next weekend for a blessing!


