This year the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, a Holy Day of Obligation, is on Saturday, December 8. Masses will be celebrated at Assumption at 5:30 p.m. December 7, and at 8:00 a.m., and 12:05 p.m., on December 8.

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

"But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand." (Luke 21: 25-28, 34-36)

Advent begins today and so does our Church's liturgical year. We will be proclaiming the Gospel according to St. Luke on Sundays until the year ends with the Solemnity of Christ the King in 2019. During the first two weeks of Advent we focus on the Second Coming of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We call this the Parousia. During the last two weeks of Advent we prepare intensely to celebrate His Birth, the Incarnation of God, at Christmas. With that, the Christmas season begins and does not conclude until we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord in January.

It had been a horrible day at the office, one crisis after another. He spent the day saving deals that were coming apart, reassuring angry customers whose orders had been messed up, going to the mat with vendors — putting out one fire after another.

Just as he was about to leave for the day, he remembered: it was his family's night to volunteer at the soup kitchen. He called his wife, apologized for forgetting, and said he would meet her and the kids at the church hall in a half hour.

Once there, he slowly managed to put the stress of the day behind him and got into the rhythm of the busy kitchen. His job that night was making the soup, with his daughter helping cut the vegetables.

At 6 p.m., the doors opened. He took his station at the steaming caldron of chicken noodle soup. The first guest was an elderly woman in a torn coat and ripped sneakers. He ladled the soup into a bowl, and gently handed it to her.

"Thank you so much," she said. "Thank you and bless you."

Her smile was the brightest thing he had seen all day.

And, he realized that he was, indeed, blessed.

A busy dad comes to realize his blessedness in the unexpected "sign" of a homeless woman's gratitude. In the course of our days, we all encounter such "signs": indicators of the realities of God's

For the powers of the heavens will be shaken.

And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.

presence that we do not readily see or appreciate or have stopped seeing or would rather ignore altogether. These "signs" urge us to look deeper, to see beyond ourselves and our needs and expectations, to confront issues before they become disasters. In the "signs" of the good we give and receive, we "stand erect" to behold God's Spirit of humility and wisdom, transforming our lives in the justice and peace of Advent. (Connections)

BE VIGILANT; BE READY

A Family Perspective: In our Gospel, Jesus warns his disciples against the fatigue that can emerge if one becomes consumed by the anxieties of daily life. Many families are too familiar with the kind of fatigue Jesus refers to here. We may be concerned about a family member's health, our job security, our children's education, or any number of other concerns. All these are important matters. Jesus does not promise an end to daily worries and fears, but he does teach his disciples that they will have the strength to withstand anxiety if they stay focused on him, remaining vigilant for his return and praying for strength to endure all tribulations. Through prayer, God helps us stay focused on that which is most important in our lives.

As you gather as a family, recall the tradition of making New Year's resolutions in preparation for the new calendar year. Observe that today is the first Sunday of Advent, which is the beginning of the new Church year. During the season of Advent, our Gospel readings ask us to consider what is most important to us as we prepare for Jesus' coming, at his birth and at the end of time.

Jesus describes signs that may disturb many people, but he says that these should not disturb his disciples. Why? Because these signs indicate that redemption is near. What does Jesus say that his disciples should do? Be vigilant and pray for strength. At this start of the new Church year, consider as a family what "Advent resolutions" your family might make to help you stay focused so that you will be prepared to receive the salvation we celebrate at Jesus' birth and anticipate at Jesus' second coming.



PLEASE HELP REPEAL THE PARKING LOT TAX


Urge your Representative and Senators to repeal the "Parking Lot Tax!" A provision in the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 would impose a new tax on parking and transit benefits provided by nonprofit organizations, including churches. This change, also known as Section 512(a)(7) of the law, taxes nonprofit organizations including houses of worship - for the cost of parking and transit benefits provided to employees. The provision forces nonprofits and houses of worship to shoulder burdensome accounting and regulatory compliance costs, and it will hopelessly entangle the IRS with houses of worship. Moreover, according to the Joint Committee on Taxation's score of a full repeal of Section 512(a)(7), the provision would extract \$1.7 billion from the non-profit sector over 10 years. While nonprofit organizations and houses of worship will pay these taxes, it is the people these organizations serve who will ultimately suffer from this massive diversion of funds from civil society to the government. Contact your U.S. senators and representatives today and ask them to repeal Section 512(a)(7) and stop this new tax on churches and nonprofits!
