JESUS HEALS THE LEPER

A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, "I do will it.

Be made clean." (Mark 1: 40-45)

A painful moment recounted in **The Christian Century** [August 19, 2018]:

He had been a minister for 25 years. He was a generous colleague to other clergy in the area, serving on committees and attending ordinations and installations. He had friends in other churches — or so he thought.

Then a dispute erupted in his church resulting in public charges, counter charges, angry public meetings, and critical articles in the local newspaper. A long, ugly, drawn-out legal process tore the parish apart. Seeing him at meetings, his fellow clergy were friendly — but distant. After all, they had their own churches — and skins — to worry about.

In time, the issues were resolved and the parish was healing. At their next gathering, his fellow ministers greeted him warmly, clapping him on the back, shaking his hand. One minister offered a prayer of thanksgiving that all had ended well.

Later at the meeting, the minister stood and asked to speak. He didn't talk about the issue his parish had faced or the long legal process. He told his brother and sister ministers "about the silence at the center of the noise" — about the phone that never rang in a gesture of friendship, his feeling of being deserted by friends and colleagues in ministry."

"Where were you?" he asked. "I didn't expect you to take a stand alongside me. It wasn't your battle. I did expect your friendship, your offers of prayer, a shared cup of coffee. We could have talked about something else. Or we could just sit together for a bit, not saying anything. Where were you?"

A minister who was there remembers, "There was a silence and downcast faces. In our silence, we were ashamed. And, I hope, recalled our better selves, as ministers and as people."

Our attitudes and perceptions can reduce others to "lepers": those we avoid for fear of being caught up in their problems or crises, those who don't "fit" our image of class and decorum, those whose politics or religion or race or gender seem to threaten our own. We exile these "lepers" to the margins of society outside our gates; we dismiss them with simplistic labels and unfair stereotypes; we reject them as too "unclean" to be part of our lives and our world. The Christ who heals lepers comes to heal

us, as well, of our debilitating sense of self that blinds us to the sacredness and dignity of those we demean as "lepers," to heal us of our own "leprosy" so that we are able to realize again that God extends his compassion and grace even to the likes of us. Before God, no one is a leper, no one is beyond the reach of God's healing mercy and compassion; all of us are sons and daughters of God; all of us are made in the sacred image of the God of justice. peace and reconciliation. FASTING AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

What does it mean to "fast"? To fast is to do without food. Its purpose is to experience the effects of not eating. It also serves to be a penance or a sacrifice - for the purpose of strengthening us. When we don't eat, for even a little while, we get hungry. When we get hungry, we have a heightened sense of awareness. If, when we eat too much, we have a sluggish feeling, when we fast, we have a feeling of alertness. Fasting is a wonderful exercise whenever we want to sincerely ask for an important grace from God. It is not that our fasting "earns" God's attention, but by fasting, we clarify our thinking and our feeling. It is purifying and prepares us to pray more deeply.

What does it mean to "abstain"? To abstain is to not eat meat. Its purpose is to be an act of penance - an act of sacrifice, that helps us grow in freedom to make much bigger sacrifices. Of course, it would not make sense to make the sacrifice of not eating meat, and then eat a wonderful meal I might enjoy even more. Many people eat a vegetarian diet, for a variety of reasons, and eating meat is not even an issue. It might be possible to abstain from a non-meal that I really like, on all the Fridays of Lent. It should be noted that many people in this world cannot afford to eat meat or do not have access to it. Part of our abstaining from meat can place us in solidarity with so many of our sisters and brothers around the world.

During Lent, Catholics in the United States abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. They fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

To abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent means to not eat meat on those days. It does not intend the omission of eggs or dairy products.

The required fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday involves eating only one full meal on those days. One or two smaller meals may be taken on those days, but may not total one full meal. The required fast does not allow eating anything between meals.

"All Catholics who have completed their fourteenth year are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their sixtieth year."

THANK YOU DEACON MIKE AND JEANNE MAY GOD BLESS YOU



Mike and Jeanne Hanly joined the parish with their two young children, Holly and Paul, in 1980. It was time for Holly to start school and so it was Assumption School that led them

to the parish and they haven't looked back.

When asked, why did you decide to become a deacon, Mike said that there was a lot going on in his life in the mid-80's. His mother and Jeanne's father both died suddenly, Jeanne was diagnosed with breast cancer and Mike had to leave his job at the ad agency. He began to question, what's going on, God? Maybe there's something else that should be part of my life. That prompted him to talk to Fr. Dericks, who was pastor at the time, and to begin one year of discernment before enrolling in the diocesan program. Fr. Martin diaconate training Rauscher arrived at Assumption when Mike was half way through his training and he, like Fr. Dericks, was very supportive of his decision.

Mike was ordained on May 25, 1991 by Bishop Frank Rodimer. Fr. John happened to be at Mike's ordination because he was Bishop Rodimer's Secretary at the time. Now, as pastor, Mike is grateful for Fr. John's continued support of his ministry here at Assumption.

In the early days of his diaconate, Mike was mentored by Deacons Tony DeLorenzo and Bill Harty. Deacon Mike has been the baptizer of more than 900 Baptisms, witnessed more than 50 weddings and led numerous wake, funeral and graveside services. Jeanne and Deacon Mike were coordinators of the Pre-Cana Ministry here at Assumption for 18 years. Mike also served as the coordinator of the Respect Life Ministry for ten years. Deacon Mike and Jeanne led small group faith sharing Renew and later, Why Catholic, programs. For a period of eight years, Jeanne and Mike were catechists for our Faith Formation program. Then, for 10 years or more, Mike was the visiting Deacon for our Faith Formation classes, particularly on Sunday He led classroom sessions. mornings.

coordinated prayer services in the Little Theater of the school, and guided grade level tours of our church. In more recent years, Mike and Jeanne both served as catechists for our Fridays Faith & Family program. Deacon Mike has always tried to make these encounters fun and considered it a privilege to be a part of sacramental celebrations.

Deacon Mike has enjoyed being a channel for people to God, an interface. He hopes that by his enthusiasm he might direct people to come in touch with their faith. Recognizing God in other people has made Mike more keenly aware of his role as an evangelizer in all walks of his life. One who is held to a higher standard and called to live up to the image of a deacon because people are watching. No doubt, his two grandsons, James and Christopher, are watching and how fortunate for them to have Mike in their lives.


Mike says that, his wife, Jeanne has been his rock throughout his ministry. She has offered her unconditional support and a total reality check with regards to homilies. Mike has trusted her judgement and common sense point of view from the perspective of someone in the pew. And, she has been an example of Christian living day to day, much like his mother was, and has influenced how he has lived out his life and his ministry.

Deacon Mike has decided to step down from active ministry to give other deacons more opportunity to preach and baptize, and to be enriched by many of the same experiences he has had for the past 30 years. He will continue to be available to advice and mentor them, as needed.




