First Reading: *Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24*

All three of this weekend's scriptural readings are concerned with the presence of evil and injustice in the world. The first reading from the Hebrew Scriptures insists that God is not the cause of evil and death.

Second Reading: *2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15*

In our second reading, the Apostle Paul instructs the Church in Corinth that believers have an obligation to share their goods with those who suffer the injustice of deprivation.

Gospel: *Mark 5:21-43*

In the Jewish tradition, the full arrival of the reign of God would mark the end of evil, war, and injustice in the world. In this passage from Mark's Gospel, Jesus inaugurates the reign of God by beginning the elimination of disease and death.

JESUS HEALS

One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing Jesus, he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, “My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live.”

**There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years:
“If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured.” Mark 5: 21-43**

Here is reflection I hope you will enjoy. Payton Heiberger is a pre-med student at the University of Houston. Two years ago she lost the thumb and index finger of her left hand. The devastating injury all but shattered her dreams of becoming a plastic surgeon.

Doctors and prosthetic companies told Payton that partial hand prosthetics don't really exist — the few that do exist don't work for her specific injury. The best option she could find were cosmetic “fake” fingers that could not move. She was told that she would have been better off losing her entire hand.

Payton's situation came to the attention of Dr. Marko Popovic, a professor of robotic engineering at Massachusetts' Worcester Polytechnic Institute. Dr. Popovic and a team of three students in robotics, biomedical and mechanical engineering took on the challenge of developing just such a prosthetic for Payton that would provide function and usability. After four designs and prototypes, the team has been able to make a prosthetic to fit Payton's hand, enabling her to manipulate the artificial fingers through sensors on the small amount of bone remaining on her hand. The team has applied for a provisional patent for their design.

Over the past two years, the Worcester Polytechnic team has spoken regularly with Payton via teleconference about design concepts. She has been to Massachusetts twice to try various prototypes.

Dr. Popovic's team of student designers says the project has been a journey that will be fine-tuned and tweaked until the final product is perfect for Payton. “We're both invested in Payton and invested in making sure this works. Our goal is to have a prosthetic for her by the end of school year, but we will continue perfecting it until she is happy with it.” For Payton, the emotional trauma of the accident has turned into gratitude and perseverance.

“The team has been amazing,” Payton says. “It's really unbelievable to me that I've been able to meet people my age working on such an important project. I'm really grateful for our partnership and friendship.”

This is a story of hope — hope that is rooted in the determination to do something good despite the sacrifice of time and resources required, to use one's talents and abilities to change another person's life. Jairus and the sick woman in today's Gospel are models of such trust and faith: out of love for his daughter, Jairus puts aside



his position in the community to approach Jesus to ask that he “lay yours hands upon her”; convinced that Jesus not only can help her but will help her, the woman fights her way through the crowds just to touch the cloak of Jesus. The work of the Worcester Polytechnic students with Payton mirrors that same attitude and perspective of hope in the future that is rooted in the good of the present. God is present in the skills of the design team, in their compassion for the medical students they are working with, and in their dedication to making a design that will change the lives of future amputees. Jesus calls each one of us to do the same: to mirror God's hope for those in need, to reflect God's loving presence by imitating Christ's healing compassion and care for them. (Connections)

THE SAVING POWER OF GOD CLOSE AT HAND

The saving power of God is always close at hand to us, even when we are unaware of it. Sometimes it takes a critical moment in our lives to make us realize both that God is indeed with us and that he has the power to save us.

Adults: When has the Lord helped me break through fear and experience a new confidence in him?

Children: How does Jesus let me know that he is near me to help me and to guide me?

A Family Perspective: As you gather as a family, invite each family member to talk about something that might be worrying them. Talk about how important it is to share worries and concerns with other people. When we do this, we learn to see our worries from a different perspective. Why were the disciples worried about the storm? Why wasn't Jesus worried about the storm? When we bring our worries to Jesus in prayer, Jesus can help us see things from God's perspective.

Responding to God's Word: Use one of these suggestions or one of your own to respond to God's word this week.

In the home: Invite family members to identify moments when they found themselves moving beyond the constraints of fear. How did faith foster this process?

In the workplace or in school: Identify the little fears and anxieties that keep people from being themselves. Imagine how the assurance of faith could make for a freer and more joyful environment at work or in school.

In the community: Spend some time with members of your local community to consider how political choices are often fear-driven. Consider how faith would create a freer environment.

ADJUNCT TEACHING POSITIONS AVAILABLE AT ASSUMPTION COLLEGE

Art History: This one-semester course presents a chronological survey of the history of art from prehistory to the present. While focusing on the painting, sculpture and architecture of Western Europe, it also endeavors to include global cultures as well as the decorative arts, printmaking, and photography. We will look at art in terms of the historical, cultural and societal contexts in which it was made.
